

Speed Limits (...the story continues)

Our sitting member for Fisher has received a response from Council. I won't go into the nitty gritty here so far as to say that any change of speed limits appears an unlikely prospect. Many of you probably know my thoughts about lowering speed limits, suffice to say I don't support the lowering of speed limits unless there is an obvious and recognisable need. So generally, I become exasperated over governments' moves to generally lower limits and welcome the RAA's recent move to lobby for the raising of speed limits that were lowered broad brush in some near city regional areas. I digress though. So what I do support and feel there is a groundswell of support coming from within our local community is for the lowering of the Ackland Hill Road speed limit immediately adjacent the Cherry Gardens Ironbank Recreation Ground. This would be a simple extension of the 60km/h zone presently on Cherry Gardens Road to take in the Ackland Hill Road intersection and the few hundred metres either side. Dr Such has kindly written again to Council seeking clarifications to some flawed information that they seem to have in hand about how busy this area has become and how often the rec ground is frequented, both for practices during the week and weekend matches. He is awaiting a further response. But I think it is also time for the community to stand up. Really the support for the survey was very poor. If you really do want change let's concentrate on this one area and see if we can make change happen. We know that support is low for general lowering of the limits, but in this area there really is a need. If you want change let us know. If you want to be even more proactive write to Council (Mr Mark Dowd CEO or Mayor Lorraine Rosenberg). Remember that minority opinion should not rule, but if there is a clear and concerted effort action can happen. Perhaps the sporting clubs that use the rec ground could show interest too as they have a certain duty of care to their players and supporters. So will anyone stand up? Will I be able to write to you all next year congratulating you on the effort made?

OVER THE STABLE DOOR with Hamish

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!



Whew! Hay is all baled and shedded without any major dramas! Such a

stressful time of year for my owners. Anyway, all done now and hopefully it will last the full twelve months. Usually there is enough such that no outside hay needs to be brought into the property. This in turn cuts down on any new introduced plants and weeds.

As all property owners are aware, weeds are an ongoing issue, so keeping paddocks well covered in grasses helps to provide competition against those pesky weeds. (More about this later). During the summer use your stock to keep grass growth down, or if this is not enough, then either mow it or get it slashed. The risk of fire is ever present in the hills during summer, so whatever you can do to reduce inflammable material on your property is beneficial. It is a fine balance between keeping up the ground cover and keeping the grass low enough to reduce hazards. As we equines tend to be creatures of habit, such as congregating in nice shady spots under trees or standing together or standing where we can see the next nearest horse, bare patches of ground will appear where we do this. Where there are bare areas, weeds will grow! They are so opportunistic – a bare patch provides no competition and so weeds will flourish. It is best not to let things get to this stage. Rather fence these areas off to change the standing/grazing habit and spread manure here or plant some seeds. Kikyuyu will do well in this situation if you are able to keep it watered during the warmer months. After that it generally will look after itself. Once it becomes established, it also provides good competition against weeds, as it is a vigorous grower itself, providing a strong, tough mat where horses move around. In the more northern states such as northern NSW and Queensland, this tough grass can be a problem, as it can prevent the absorption of calcium. Here, where it usually is in a paddock with a mixture of grasses such as perennial rye, cocksfoot, phylaris and clover to name a few, the problem doesn't appear to arise. Keeping it short and preventing long growth also helps.

ATHEISTS GET TOGETHER

In a recent TV interview an atheist described how many of them are now assembling on Sundays the way Christians do. They sing together, have readings, meditation and sermons in a similar fashion to a church service. Their spokesperson said they had taken all the good bits from religion and left out all the bad bits. He didn't elaborate on the bad bits.

There is something joyful about singing together and hearing inspiring stories and addresses. That's what they do at Rotary, Lions and other secular organisations. Atheists argue that religion and belief in God depend on faith, as though that's a problem. Belief that there is no God depends on faith also. You cannot conduct controlled experiments to prove your point either way.

A well-known US evangelist, Dr Harry Ironside, was challenged to a public debate by a noted US atheist. Dr Ironside said he would accept the challenge on one condition: that the atheist bring with him 100 people whose lives had been changed by atheism. In return, Ironside said he would bring 100 men and women whose lives had been changed for the better when they became Christians. The atheist withdrew his challenge.

Atheists can point to a pedophile priest or hypocritical Christian and generalise to all other Christians that what they believe must therefore be false. The failure of any Christian in any situation doesn't prove anything about the teaching of Christ, except that he set a very high standard that his followers strive towards and frequently fail to reach. Dr Ironside did not promise to bring along 100 perfect people: just people whose lives had changed for the better. There are T-shirts and bumper stickers that state "Christians are not perfect: just forgiven." That was the promise Jesus made to his followers.

Atheists would be on a much safer ground as critics of Christianity if they had actually studied it. Then they would also be better placed to decide whether God exists. They would also understand who Jesus was and how he tackled religious hypocrites in his day. His ministry was often to the marginalised and outcast members of society who saw that he could change their lives. He has been doing so now for 2000 years.

Meadows Vet News



Summer Worries

With hot weather there are a multitude of problems for our pets and farm animals most of which need early intervention to prevent the development of more serious conditions. These problems include:

Heat Stress. Dogs and cats pant to lower their body temperature – they do not sweat like humans. If your pet is overheated you may notice: excessive panting, salivating, vomiting, diarrhoea, increased heart rate, seizures or strange behaviour, overly red or purple gums, coma or even death within a few hours

Snake bites. Symptoms include hind leg paralysis, dilated pupils, sudden weakness followed by collapse, shaking or twitching of the muscles, vomiting. Please note that not

all animals show the same symptoms and some may not show symptoms initially. If in doubt phone us for advise Swellings caused by insect bites and stings.

Excessive scratching which can be caused by a number of things including allergic reactions. Grass seeds in eyes, ears, paws noses and skin

Reminders

Keep on top of flea treatments so that fleas do not get the chance to become a major problem. All of our flea products are very competitively priced (some are even cheaper than those available on line!) to ensure you receive the correct advice and information for what is best for you and your pet!

Ensure all animals have access to plenty of fresh drinking water—always check that the float valves in automatic troughs are in working order

Make sure you have a Bushfire Plan that includes your pets and animals

There has been an outbreak of Parvo Virus in the northern suburbs and to the north of Adelaide again so please check your dog's vaccinations are up to date.

Adelaide is also suffering from swarms of mosquitoes thanks to the winter rains. As mosquitoes are the carriers of Heartworm now is a good time to ensure your pets are protected against this disease. Remember that pets over the age of 6mths need to be tested before any Heartworm Prevention is started.

Horse owners be aware if you suspect your horse has conjunctivitis, we cannot sell antibiotics over the counter. There are a number of conditions that falsely appear to be conjunctivitis. Using the wrong medication in an eye can lead to very serious conditions such as Melting Corneas and possibly the loss of an eye. Eyes are very important and need to be seen to be treated correctly for the best outcome.

Tinsel, ribbons and glass ornaments are often eaten by pets, causing intestinal damage or obstruction – please keep Christmas wrappings and decorations out of reach Many Christmas treats for humans are poisonous to our pets. These include chocolate and macadamia nuts!

Finally we would like to wish all of our clients and their pets and animals a very Merry Christmas and a Healthy and Happy New Year. As usual we will be providing an emergency service over the Christmas/ New Year holidays. If you have an emergency just phone the Centre's number and you will be diverted to the veterinarian on duty. 




