

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

The course of the horse owner never runs smooth. Just when we thought everything was under control, my most elderly paddock mate (he is 26) came down with suspected founder. It was only a matter of hours, but my owners noticed some lameness and he was confined immediately with feed restricted to plain hay. Because of such a wet winter, the pasture growth is far more than normal and despite our efforts (especially me!) to keep it down it hasn't been enough. Our owners have also been slashing wherever possible to also keep the growth down. Anyway, the good news is that my old mate is now on the mend as it was only a slight case of laminitis. He was gradually let out into larger areas during the day, and is still restricted to a smaller paddock, but he can now move around with myself and others. Our owner has given him a couple of light lunges and a couple of light rides, no more than 5-15 minutes and he is definitely on the mend. He



also has Cushings disease, which can make a horse more prone to laminitis. He is on medication for the rest of his life to control the condition and this is also supposed to lessen the chances of contracting laminitis. Cushings can be tested for by a simple blood test. Some of the signs are an inability to lose the winter coat - it sometimes becomes very long and the horse has trouble keeping his condition. My paddock mate has not grown an extra-long coat, but he has tended to keep it for longer and not lose it fully into summer. He also has struggled to keep condition. My owners had attributed that to his age, but when we were getting our teeth done, the vet suggested a blood test for Cushings. Fortunately it is somewhat under control, although my mate just hates the medication - however no choice! Once the grasses dry off a bit more it will be much safer for all of us and we will have a much larger area to graze. My owners are monitoring my weight on a daily basis, as I just seem to thrive on thin air. I am kept in regular work, at least 4 times a week, sometimes more. Fortunately only one of my paddock mates has the 'skinny' gene, so he gets to eat out a lot more, while the rest of us have limited grazing and more work! At least I am not on my own.

I hope everyone has a safe and enjoyable Xmas and New Year. Happy munching from Hamish!

CFS NEWS

hile the start to summer so far has been relatively mild we all know the hot weather is just around the corner. The respite from a very busy winter has been welcomed by your brigade as a chance to thoroughly check equipment and catch up with maintenance and change fuels and oils on our portable pumps and generators. The brigade recently received a pelican 6000 lumen portable light to be mainly used at motor vehicle accidents. This was financed by community donations to the cfs beacons situated in many of our Blackwood and district businesses.

Cherry Gardens brigade has now reached 80 callouts since July 1st and our Sturt Base Cherry communications team has well over 100 callouts to their name!

Our five new firefighters and three new communications members have settled in well and are training hard ready for their basic fire fighter training course early in the New Year. If you think you could help we still need more members. Call in on a Monday night for a chat!

We trust everyone has managed to clean up and prepare their properties and homes for the bushfire season. One problem that does always appear is property access and if the CFS cannot get to your home because of narrow gates or trees overhanging driveways we are unable to defend you in a bushfire situation. Many of our residents live well off the road and access for our trucks can be a problem. Take time to measure your gate width and check clearances from the ground to low overhanging trees. The minimum measurements for our truck access

is gateways 4 metres wide and vertical clearances of 3.5 metres.

Trees have a

habit of growing and driveways that were compliant all of a sudden become inaccessible. The last time I had concrete delivered the truck left festooned with quite a lot of our trees. Out with the chainsaw!

This will be our last article for 2016 so may we at your Cherry Gardens CFS brigade wish you all a safe and happy festive season and take this opportunity to thank all our residents for your support---fantastic!

That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Making a New Year's resolution has a special poignancy for me this time around. For me 2017 is the year of making Mayo matter.

My staff and I hit the ground running after the Federal Election last year, throwing ourselves into our new roles with great enthusiasm. But it was a tough half year in politics and the last weeks of parliamentary sittings felt like wading through treacle – hard work, and messy!

Like everyone in Mayo it was a relief to see Christmas approaching and to take a short summer break with my family to reconnect and recharge.

Now I've come back into the office, full of energy and ready to charge into 2017. However, the trick with New Year's resolutions is to set achievable goals.

That's why my staff and I have set aside some time this month to sit down and do some serious planning about what we want to accomplish in 2017. To guide us we have the results of the community survey we sent out late last year, asking you – the people of Mayo – to tell us what was important.

Some of the results we were expecting,

such as better public transport options for Victor Harbor residents and an after-hours doctor at the Mt Barker Hospital. But was also good to hear how much everyone loves living in Mayo with its bushland and farmland and seascapes so close to Adelaide. We have some of the best produce and I hear your survey messages about promoting and encouraging Australian made.

The NXT has also worked hard to secure Aussie jobs. The long awaited agreement on a 15 per cent backpacker tax comes with the NXT's two-year seasonal workers incentives trial. This trial starts in July and means up to 6000 Australian job seekers can earn up to \$5000 on horticultural work without affecting their income support payments. I see this as a bridge into agricultural work and an opportunity for many to try a new style of employment and hopefully stay on the farm.

Another potential job creation project is making the Hills a recognised Pest Free Area (PFA) for international trade. Such recognition would open up lucrative trade markets for our growers, rejuvenate domestic horticulture and create hundreds

of jobs. However, PFAs are only achieved through a mix of science, sound land management, industry support and long-term international trade negotiations. PFAs are a long-term project but everyone in the Hills can help.

Every time there is a fruit fly outbreak in the Mt Lofty Ranges, the proposal takes a step back.

Please, help our farmers by practising fruit fly control strategies in your own gardens and by NOT transporting fruit across borders.

Would you like Onkaparinga Council to do a Green Waste removal every two weeks?

Last summer I asked if it would be possible to have our Green Waste picked up every two weeks, just as many other council areas do (even if it is just for summer in our area). They replied that not enough people have requested this, and that we should be composting; and I have now received two extra bins (at \$60 p.a.) which I fill as soon as the Green Waste from the previous four weeks is emptied.

There is too much Green Waste at our property to compost, especially now that the fire-burn-off season has finished; and we have quite a few trees to clean up after the windy September/October during which time we were away.

I've done a bit of research and found that Mitcham and Adelaide Hills Councils pick up Green Waste every two weeks. Every suburban council that I've checked does also. Surely if the suburban ones pick it up, it is worthwhile picking ours up, considering that they want us to clear up for

the fire season!

If you feel strongly about this, please write to the Onkaparinga Council and request that they do a two-weekly pick-up. (Maybe they could even hire the truck from the Adelaide Hills Council!)

FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK



People in the district were no doubt aware, or at least noticed, that there was a prescribed burn that took place in Scott Creek CP late No-

vember 2016. What may not be so obvious is the amount of work that goes into planning such a burn.

Discussions between the Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources (DEWNR) and the Friends group started a couple of years ago. This is a crucial part of the planning, as there is a great deal of detailed knowledge that has been built up by the group over the years regarding specific locations of threatened plants, wildlife and weed infestations.

In addition to the reason that DEWNR has for the prescribed burn to take place, this information impacts on the timing and desirable intensity of the burn, areas that should be left out of the burn and the level of weed management required following the burn.

Within the burn area there were a number of threatened plant species, mostly growing within the lower parts of the creek-lines. Amongst these is a small population of the nationally critically endangered Veronica derwentiana ssp. homalodonta (Mt Lofty Speedwell). The good news is that this species generally responds well to fire, but it was still important to get the information about the population and factor it into the planning process.

Part of the area is also suitable habitat for the nationally endangered Chestnut-rumped Heathwren, and the burn needed to be hot enough to stimulate native vegetation germination and regrowth in this area, which had been deteriorating with age and had a lack of new growth taking place. On the other hand, there was a known population of the nationally endangered Southern Brown Bandicoot living in the creek-line. Suitable refuge for bird-life in adjacent areas also needs to be available.

These and other issues are all part of a detailed environmental assessment process which is undertaken by DEWNR and which is signed off by an ecologist. In the end, the proposed burn area was split in two, with 67 hectares scheduled to take place early in spring 2016, and the rest to go into the planning for a couple of years' time. With an early spring burn, the creek-lines would be less likely to

burn, protecting the threatened plants and Bandicoots, but it should still be dry enough on the higher ground to get good native plant germination and regrowth.

In the normal course, an early spring burn would probably mean September, but the extended spring rainfall meant that the vegetation was too wet to burn then, and it ended up being the last week of November.

Weed management is one of the most important aspects of the planning process from the Friends' point of view. This is because, over the years, much effort has been contributed to treating weeds in this part of the park, in particular Blackberry, Boneseed, Broom and Erica. Most of these weeds are considered fire responsive, meaning they will either regrow after the fire or their weed seed-bank will germinate in great numbers.

If follow-up of these weeds is not undertaken in the years immediately following the burn, they can impede the regrowth of the native vegetation, which we are trying to protect. There has been a strong commitment to this weed management by DEWNR, including some additional control undertaken before the prescribed burn took place.

It is always very interesting to see how nature bounces back after a fire, and this will be no different. There will, however, still be plenty of work for the Friends to contribute to this recovery, and in other parts of the park.

At their invitation we joined Kangarilla club members for their November meeting and all sat spell bound as we watched her. At the beginning of the evening Julia gave us a lesson on how to propagate and grow these well known harbingers of spring of which Julia has at least 300 varieties on her property - including Pond Iris. At the end of the evening she took apart the arrangements and let us help ourselves to the lovely blooms. We could also purchase the many Irises she had prepared for propagation at the low price of \$5 for exotic and rare plants.

The sumptuous supper rivalled our monthly feast and a great time was had by all.

Cherry Gardens Garden Club spent the evening of 10 October, with speaker Sandra Stuart from the SA Herb Society, it was also our rose challenge and due to the recent wild weather and lack of sun we understandably didn't expect many entries, however, true to form, Melva Bruce and Shirley Callaghan came up trumps with two all-time favourites - Melva's beautiful deep maroon/red, Mr. Lincoln rose and Shirley's gorgeous Double Delight tied for first place. Well done - no wonder Sandra

couldn't choose between them!

Sandra came prepared, with many cuttings, to help us see and learn more about identifying the different herbs. It is surprising how many types of mint, lavender and other herbs there are. Sandra also filled us in on many of their uses - some well-known and some long forgotten, both edible and insect repellent. We reminisced about a time when the herbs in your garden were what you used as pesticides: lavender to repel clothing moths, and bay leaves to repel pantry moths. Sandra also brought Salvias to show us some unusual varieties suited to areas around Adelaide.

Another hilarious plant auction followed and then we all chatted and enjoyed a homemade feast prepared by rostered members, while many members happily bought some herbs or took home some of Sandra's proffered left over cuttings at the end of the evening.

MINTON FARM

With over 10,500 rescues performed on-site, we still see creatures that have never been admitted before, such as a huge Eastern Banjo frog! It is these wonders of things to come that keep us all in awe of our incredible wildlife.

The philosophy of the Rescue Centre is to rescue, rehabilitate and release injured and orphaned wildlife. To this end all of our work and methods concentrate on seeing the animal successfully leave the Centre in a better state than they arrived in. People often say how sad it must be to let them go and I often say what a joy it is to see them fly away back to their families. On the whole this is true, but of course there are exceptions where your head must rule your aching heart. There have been a handful of creatures that caused me to consider the best outcomes of the release. One was a long neck tortoise that lay under the water, gazing into my eyes endlessly, instead of swimming away

from me. Last year it was a tiny 600 gram koala found at deaths door in a flowing gutter. He thrived with some TLC; growing well, drinking his bottle calmly and contentedly chewing his fresh gum leaves. Buffy has been the most pleasurable rescue of the year and I wish him well as he grows into a fine adult.
