SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK NEWS

The time period for our Almanda Project Crowd Funding, has now closed and we have ended up with over \$10000 being donated. This amount plus some extra funding will see the project securely financed for several years.

Blackberry removal in creek-lines already underway will be continued and some new creek-lines begun. Before this occurs, a comprehensive botanical survey in all will form the baseline for monitoring species recovery over time. Experience tells us some unexpected often rare and long dormant native species will re-emerge.

Both Aldgate and Scott Creek Primary Schools have carried out the "cocky food" planting at two sites and this will be repeated over the coming years. With the season drying out so quickly we will have to water them

again and over summer if it keeps up. If you like spring flowering native plants now is the time to visit the Park, spider, purple cockatoo and sun orchids are all out or nearly so, however the early hot spell has seen the donkey orchids all but disappear. Many other species are in full bloom so don't wait around as it is a real treat just to be out there.

If you are interested in joining in our Working Bees to help with ongoing pest plant eradication efforts, new members are always welcome. You need to be reasonably fit and not mind wandering through thick bush at times tracking down bone-seed and broom etc.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Well, we can never predict what the weather is going to do from one year to the next! Following an extremely dry August and September, there has been very little growth in the hay paddocks. The hay season will also arrive (or will have arrived by the time you read this) early. This is probably going to push the price up too (how unusual!). If you are having to buy in hay, it pays to look around, as prices can vary enormously. If it is very cheap, it is probably a bit suss.

If you are buying direct from the grower, see if you can buy a bale or two to take home. Word of mouth is often reliable, as there is a track record you can check. Buying from a supplier can be more expensive, but usually the extra you pay is for reliability. If you find any unsatisfactory hay, they will usually replace the bad bale with a good one (at least they should). Generally things to look for in good quality hay are colour - it should be bright and shiny. Smell -it should be sweet and not off. Taste - it should also taste sweet. Fresh good quality hay has a nice nutty flavour. If you don't think it tastes good, then probably neither will your equine. It should definitely not be powdery or dusty.



Horses can quite easily suffer from respiratory problems and also the hay may have been cut too damp. In which case could possibly be toxic to your horse and kill him (colic).

Check for weeds in the hay, especially rye grass as it can get stuck in the horses' mouth causing abscesses. And of course you don't want to be bringing in any more weeds to your property than you can help. Also the bales should be quite heavy. If you can, buy the current season's hay. As it ages, the bales will become lighter and drier and more importantly lose their food value. By the time the hay is three years old, it really has little or no nutritional value for the horse. You will note that I haven't specified any particular hay, as all the above comments will generally apply, whether it is meadow, oaten, lucerne or any other hay.

Finally, ensure that your fire plan is in place. Clean up around fence lines and stables, keep horses' manes and tails well trimmed and keep in touch with your neighbours regarding evacuation and/or keeping your animals in case of fire. Happy fresh, clean and sweet munching!

Stories Project delivers first print copy.



NEW BUILDING PROGRESS

A new reverse cycle air conditioner has been installed and it has greatly improved the comfort for users of the meeting room in both summer and winter. Our thanks to all who contributed, especially the City of Onkaparinga and the Cherry Gardens Garden Club .The Garden Club meet at the church once a month. There are a few tasks still to be completed on the new building like painting, floor coverings, lining the eaves and pouring the last sections of the concrete retaining wall.We are counting our many blessings to have got this far without going into debt. So many people and organisations donated their time and money to get the job done.

CONSERVATION OF NATIVES

We approached Onkaparinga Council with a request to conserve a stand of Kangaroo grass on Orchard road. This species was an initial attraction to settlers to this area and Council have now protected some areas beside Orchard and Brumby roads. The first one hundred kangaroo grass plants given to us by Council are now in the ground and plans are afoot to add local orchids and other native species. The area that is being planted to natives is along the Southern boundary. The church grounds are frequented by kangaroos, koalas and possums and there is a resident population of native bats in the ceiling of the old building. Snakes have been sighted occasionally and there are several resident lizards. Pardelotes and parrots nest each year in the stable and main building. The historic building is located in a wonderful setting surrounded by nature.

REPLACEMENT PASTOR

So far we have not found a replacement Pastor for Roger Waldron, but we are getting help from the Uniting Church who employ Rev Greg Walker to assist small rural congregations whose numbers are not sufficient to employ a full-time Pastor. Some congregations share a minister and others employ a part-time Pastor. Such people often take time to locate.

LOCAL SPORT & RECREATION GROUND NEWS

It's been a busy month at the recreation ground with winter and summer sports changing over and the football club's post season working bee delivering the frame of a new 12m x 6m garage that will be utilised as a gym and storage facility. As I write the roof has just been completed and a concrete floor should be completed within the next couple of weeks before the garage door is added. The gym will then be stocked with various equipment that has been accrued in the past few years or purchased recently. The prize possession of the gym will be the new Ikg to 40kg dumbbell rack donated by the Cherry Chatter. Everyone at the football club is grateful for the Cherry Chatter's assistance.

We've also begun construction of the garden beds in car park to replace the bollards and flags after a successful trial throughout footy season. The garden beds will likely remain uncompleted until football's first 2015 working bee in Feb/Mar as many hands make light work.

We are also happy to say the new Waste Water system is fully installed and has been operating perfectly for a couple of months now. The project was significantly larger and more expensive than first thought due to demanding state and local government regulations and for that reason we are still seeking debenture investors to assist us. The recreation ground has successfully issued and repaid debentures between 2001 and 2006 for the clubroom extension.

The football and cricket clubs are jointly investigating the possibility of upgrading our tiring metal pipe fence surrounding the oval with a new PVC coated chain-wire fence that will look fantastic. Hopefully we will have some good news on that front in the new year if grant submissions are favourable.

Debenture Release \$100,000 WANTED

Your Recreation Ground needs your support to raise the additional \$100,000 urgently to replace the current sewerage system (over 20 years old) which has reached end of its life. Without a new sewage system the whole of the Recreation Ground is at risk. There is no choice other than to fix the sewage system.

You might ask why so expensive and the answer is that the government has recently made changes to the rules in relation to sewerage systems that operate and with these changes the costs have escalated. The committee of the Recreation Ground is looking at what ways this cost can be reduced, but regardless of what the final number is we need to ensure that we can get the funds to pay for the project.

The replacement sewerage system is expected to have a similar if not longer life than the existing one and has extra capacity allowed for within its design.

We therefore offer the members of the Recreation Ground a chance to help out and receive a good return on their money over 5 years.

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS for November

Because of the dry Spring we have encountered it is important that your garden is mulched well to conserve as much moisture as possible. Pay particular attention to your roses, they will need a good drink once a week from now on,

like-wise for your fruit trees.

Check that your watering system is operating well - no blocked drippers or leaks where a fork has gone through a line!

Pot plants need fertilising at this time of year when they should be growing strongly.

Now is a good time for planting Beetroot, Carrots, and Spring onions. Also Sunflowers, Zinnias, Celosias, and Californian poppies.






