LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Cherry Chatter community,

I would like to sincerely thank Brian Sims and the CFS & SES crew who responded to our request for help with a large animal rescue at 108 Cherry Gardens Rd, on Thursday 10 September.

I found our much loved 13 year Guernsey steer, Jumper, down, caught in a fence, and on assessment decided he had a chance if we could turn him and get him up. Sadly, he must have been down too long, and at his quite senior age it was all too much, and he died in the attempt to save him.

The wonderful Jeff Burton buried him as soon as possible.

Thanks too to our neighbour at no. 87 who came to see if she could help.

We'd nursed Jumper and his half-brother, Jacket, through the winter, not expecting them to get through, but they responded well to medication. The boys had been with us since about two weeks of age, and were great mates. Jacket didn't leave Jumper until Jeff came to bury him, then trotted across the paddock with a couple of loud bellows. He's been lurking around the site for the following ten days.

It is not scientific to anthropomorphise, but it is impossible to know how an animal reacts to the loss of a long-time companion in such a situation. Jack is now spending time with Milly, our last remaining donkey. I'm nearly half way through my PhD, about animal owners and Emergency responders in bushfire circumstances, and once that's done there will be some more cows, donkeys and geese at 108 Cherry Gardens Road.

Again, sincere and grateful thanks to the two crews who attended so promptly and did everything in their power to help. In the course of our volunteer work with SAVEM, and in my research, Emilis and I have the privilege of meeting many Emergency Services staff and volunteers. It's a great culture with great people, and makes such a difference to so many lives.

seed collection and tree identification. The works are expected to be completed by Anzac Day 2016.

Who requested that the work be done?

The council was contacted by members of the public and Cr Daryl Parslow who advised the area was in need of maintenance. The council inspected the site, agreed it required maintenance and was a site of significant value to the community. As a result the works described above is being undertaken.

The council are also investigating the possibility of further works in future, including additional fencing, new pathways and interpretive signage. However this would be dependent on budget approval and would not occur until the 2016/17 year if approved.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Have you been following the progress of El Nino? Again a drier than normal year, with hay heading early and cropping volume down. Hopefully the quality will be good! If you have to buy in hay, check that the bales are a good weight, smell sweet and are free of weeds. If you chew a mouthful, it should also taste sweet. Horses tend to be more fussy eaters than say, cows (except me of course and other pony types like me). If you can also buy this seasons hay that is better too, as it will gradually lose its nutritional value over time. Any longer than 3 years and it is not going to be at its best. Once stored, ensure that where possible your hay is vermin free. Talon rat bait inside a piece of poly tube ½ taped over at the ends will allow rats in and keep your pets out. Sometimes rabbits can get in and make nests amongst the bales, so this needs constant checking, or you will finish up with soiled hay which becomes waste. By now you will have checked for weeds and if too late for treatment, make a note of where they are (a map is handy to keep) and follow up next year, for they will assuredly be there!

I know I said it last month, but ensure that your bushfire survival plan is in place. Co-ordinate with neighbours. Sharing email addresses and phone nos. can also be useful, if only to inform when owners are not going to be on the property.

Be ready to clean up around sheds and fencing to reduce fire hazards and vermin



such as snakes etc. If brushcutting, best not to do this on a hot, dry or windy day because of fire risk. Sheep can be great for eating close down to edges.

My special news this month is that I have a new paddock mate! He is a bit of a rescue case as he has been passed through several owners through no fault of his own. The result is that he is a very confused fellow. My owners have taken him on, hoping to rehabilitate him into a serviceable riding mount. After 3 weeks, he is showing quite a bit of progress, and while he is a pleasure to work with, it will take around 12 months to really get results. More on this as we go!

PS his name is William.

MINTON FARM

We have been run off our feet with rescues as the different species all breed up and try to find food for their young.

A tiny little ball of fluff was found in a School yard on the ground. It was a little tawny frogmouth that had injured his wing when he fell from his nest. The wing was strapped and he was fed amazing mounts of food in an effort to build him up. The strapping will be removed in two weeks and we will try to reunite him with his family again. An echidna with a bleeding nose and broken spines and bruising was admitted after being run over at night. It recouped and has been placed into a round tank to recover completely. More baby possums have been at the mercy of the real world. A little one was stolen out of its nest two days in a row with its mother chasing after it to get it back from a raven! A female ringtail possum was found after one of four of the cats owned by a woman, left it under a table covered in saliva and hair pulls from teeth punctures. The woman left it there all night hoping it would run off overnight. It needed antibiotics within 5 hours to stop getting toxoplasmosis from the cat's teeth and claws. It may be too late but she's on antibiotics now. She's very dehydrated but had a good feed and

Once again the fire season is rapidly approaching. We would like to take this opportunity to remind you all of the importance of maintaining and preparing your properties for the season ahead. It is essential for the safety of yourselves, your families and the community that you undertake some simple measures around your homes.

1. Clean up and clear vegetation around your home. Within 20m of your home you are allowed to reduce, modify or remove any native vegetation excluding significant trees (Significant trees have a trunk circumference of 2m or greater measured 1m above the ground*).

2. Clean out and remove any debris in your gutters. This includes cutting back trees with limbs hanging over your roof.

3. Clear undergrowth away from your

property. Having clear space between your home and native vegetation reduces the radiant heat your home may be exposed to during a bushfire.

4. Clean up everything that will burn around your home. For example, during winter it is convenient to keep wood stocks close to your home, but in summer it will just add to the danger.

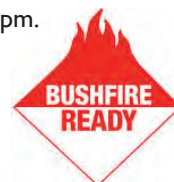
5. Keep driveways and access point to your property clear. During a bushfire trees and structures may fall across driveways blocking your escape route, and delaying emergency services from getting to you.

It is the responsibility of each household to prepare their homes for the coming season. We would encourage you to come down on a Monday night and have a chat with us at Cherry Gardens CFS, about

any concerns or questions you may have about being 'Bushfire Ready' Alternatively go to the CFS website www.cfs.sa.gov.au, for further information.

*If you want to remove or modify a Significant Tree you will need approval as outlined in the Development Regulations 2008. To identify if you have a Significant Tree contact your Local Council for further information on how to apply.

If you wish to burn off please remember that you must get a permit from the Onkaparinga council before hand and the fire cannot be lit before 10am and must be extinguished before 3pm.

About our members

Joan Button has been a member of our church since 2000, she is leaving in November to live in Maitland. So it is appropriate to mention her contribution for posterity and to acknowledge that. Joan and her husband Bob, made a significant contribution to our church; if there was a job to be done they were in there doing it. Unfortunately Bob died in 2009, but that did not slow Joan and she continued to contribute. Joan was secretary for the church and looked after our historic collection and our garden. She took her turn as a worship Leader, cleaned the church and arranged flowers. Bob helped Ron Williamson in modifying the concrete path to the church to meet with Council regulations and had a significant input with Ron to build the Lych Gate, even though he was suffering with the cancer that would finally end his life. Joan has an interest in birds. In 1990 she joined as one of the 7000 atlasers who contributed to the "New Atlas of Australian Birds" which was published in 2003. They recorded birds over an area of two hectares and the following birds are some of the less recognized in the two hectares surrounding the church as the centre. White faced Heron, black shouldered Kite, Yellow tailed black cockatoo, Red rumped Parrot, Horsfield's bronze cuckoo, southern boobook, Black faced cuckoo – shrike, Clamorous reed warbler, Inland thornbill and Striated pardalote. Those together with the common birds brought it to 38 bird species found near the church. It was a treat when Joan would tell us during the service the birdcall we were hearing and sometimes mimicked the call for us. So we thank her for her contribution and pray she has a happy future in Maitland. We will miss you.

a humongous wee! A ringtail with its leg chewed through and bones exposed, full of maggots was found lying next to its deceased twin chewed into pieces; and a juvenile brush tail possum dead on arrival after being crushed in the cat's jaws after being taken to its owner.

Beautiful weather isn't it? The cats think so!!! So many more creatures to play with and torture all night long now that the nights are warmer. Then they can carry the exhausted, traumatized poor creature home to show their human Mum!!!!??? Come on!!!! For God's sake.....keep your cats in an enclosure or inside.....just imagine the pain and horror they are causing to defenseless creatures!

We released a kookaburra back to the oval area after it had received concussion after been hit by a car. Sometimes all they need is warm, dark and quiet to recover from shock and a drink of water in an hour or so. When we are stressed or nervous we feel thirsty. Remember it's the same for the birds and animals!

Thanks so much to everyone for the donated items for us to sell at the garage sale. Looking forward to investing in lots of formulas for the joey kangaroos and possums with the proceeds as we are going through so much with all of the rescues coming in, as well as roo pellets and stablemate for them.

Cherry Gardens Cemetery

Recently a local asked for some details regarding the Cherry Gardens Cemetery. The cemetery is located on Cherry Gardens Road around 1km from the corner of Acklands Hill road. The cemetery is small in size and is the resting place of many of the area's early pioneer families. There are over 250 people interred in the grounds.

Prior to 1881, all burials in the Cherry Gardens area were at the Cherry Gardens Church grounds on Hicks Hill Road where many of the very first residents were interred. In January 1882, the trustees of the Church 'declared that the churchyard, on account of limited grounds at their disposal, and as a public cemetery had opened, had passed a resolution closing their cemetery'.

By September 1881, the District Council of Clarendon had surveyed and dedicated 9 hectares of land to a cemetery. The first burial, of Sarah Mackereth of Scott Creek, took place on 30 March 1882. The first curator was Mr Charles Threadgold, appointed on 21 March 1881.

The cemetery was managed and maintained by locals for most of its history. However a number of years ago the Onkaparinga Council took over control and management of the cemetery. We checked out the council website but as there was limited information available we asked for details. The council has now added a link on their website to a large document that includes all the costs for everything the council charges for. On page 49 of this document the costs for everything regarding the cemetery can be found. It is reproduced below (but is only current for today as the council reviews costs regularly.)
