EDITORIAL

Bushfire Refuge – where is ours?

I've noticed these signs up around Coromandel Valley and Blackwood, and wondered if anyone knows where the Last Resort Refuge area is for Cherry Gardens and surrounding suburbs?

I've checked various websites (including the CFS), and can't see any listed for Cherry Gardens, which is surprising considering we live in a high risk bushfire area.

All other designated Refuge Areas listed appear to be an oval, or community hall, (which we have as well as a golf course) however, the closest one I can see listed is Weymouth Oval at Coromandel Valley which doesn't seem very practical for us.

Given we're about to head into bushfire season, it seems timely for us all to know what we should do in the event of a bushfire, and where our Last Resort Refuge area is - or if we even have one? If not then perhaps a good opportunity for us to clarify so we're at least all on the same page and have a consistent plan and approach should we ever be unfortunate enough to need one.

SACFS - Bushfire Safer Places*

If you live, work or travel in an area where bushfires can occur you need to be aware of where you can relocate to if you are threatened by a bushfire.

We have identified places that can offer relative safety from a bushfire. They are divided into two categories

Bushfire Safer Places

A Bushfire Safer Place is a place of relative safety. It may be used as a place for people to stay in or as a place of first resort for those who have decided they will leave high risk locations early on a high fire risk day.

Properties on the edge of these locations generally face a higher level of risk compared with those nearer the centre of the area. The relative safety of these properties can be improved



by property owners undertaking appropriate bushfire safety measures to ensure they don't place themselves and the greater community at risk.

A Bushfire Safer Place is relatively safe from bushfire because:

- It is in an area of low levels of bushfire fuel
- It is far enough from continuous bushland or forest to reduce the risk of sparks and embers
- The bushfire will be interrupted
- established gardens and lawns
- road networks and other low fuel areas
- There is likely to be access to

emergency, health and other community services.

If your Bushfire Survival Plan includes relocating to a Bushfire Safer Place you should:

- Identify where your nearest Bushfire Safer Place is
- Identify where there are suitable alternátives
- Work out how you will get there
- Work out alternative routes to
- Work out how long it will take you to get there
- Decide under what circumstances you will relocate
- Decide what your trigger points for action will be
- Plan for your relocation; when, where and what you will take

We recommend that if you intend to relocate to a Bushfire Safer Place you should do so early in the day. Last minute decisions to relocate in the face of fire are extremely dangerous.

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS NOVEMBER 2017

November is a month when most plants are growing rapidly so they need ample water and fertiliser. Mulch is important to preserve as much water as possible (you know how it is becoming more expensive) Mulch should be at least 75mm thick which will eventually break down to provide nutrient for your soil.

Watch out for leaf eating pests as they are enjoying this Spring flush as well. Harvest your leafy greens on a regular basis to keep them producing lush leaves for your salads. 'Dipel' is useful on your vegies, to deter caterpillars.

Give plants that are flowering nonstop a light 'hair-cut' every few weeks to promote good lateral growth.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

By now the weather has started to warm up — coats are shedding, spring is in the air, the ground is drying out and the grass seems to grow as you watch it! Synthetic rugs can be quite heating during these sunnier days, so a lightweight cotton rug may be preferable during the day, or even let your trusty steed go nude! He will appreciate a good roll to get rid of excess fur and have a really good scratch. If riding, it is a good idea to check the underside of your saddle cloth afterwards, as it will probably be full of moulting fur. Let the cloth dry and brush off that build-up of fur. It can be quite itchy and not very comfortable for your horse.

If you are lucky enough to have a machine for washing your horse gear, it is better to not have too much fur on it either. Some horses can react to different types of saddle cloth material i.e. wool, so cotton may be better. Also, be careful not to use too much washing detergent/powder with your horse gear, as this doesn't always get fully removed by the end of the wash. This time of the year is probably the worst due to extra shedding fur and your horse may also sweat up more at the beginning of the season and having an accumulation of winter dirt and muck, so keeping saddle cloths clean



is a priority for keeping him comfortable. Don't forget to check the insides of the winter rugs too, as they may have a build-up of fur inside. This can be easily brushed off/pulled out.

Re: your riding gear, be prepared for the hotter months. Give your gear a once over, checking for dryness, and check the stitching for wear. Leather bridles and saddles will benefit from a good clean and leather conditioner. Synthetic gear is much easier — a gentle clean with warm water and wipe dry usually will suffice. If your riding boots are leather, then check them too. Riding helmets generally have a life of around 5 years. Check the date inside. If it is older than 5 years, the usual recommendation is to replace after 5 years. If you have had a fall where the helmet has hit the ground, it is also advised to 'bin' the helmet and replace. The helmets are designed

to absorb impact, so it is not worth the risk (you only have one head!).

As you can see, so much about activities on and around horses is about safety. It is generally accepted that horse riding is the most dangerous of sports, so the more you can do to ensure that you are safe on and off (see lungeing last month) your horse, the better prepared you are.

One area where the rider has little control over outside influences is when riding beside the road. Road users these days are not that horse 'savvy' and can unknowingly drive either too close or too fast past a rider. It is better to not take any chances, and keep well to the left, and either halt or walk quietly when traffic is passing. Other things of course, can include loose dogs, lawn mowers, spraying gravel, screeching brakes, herds of motorbikes, etc. If you are planning on riding on the road, make sure your horse is well accustomed to many noises and distractions, and preferably ride in company with another quiet animal.

CFS NEWS

At the time of writing this month's article, Spring is certainly underway with the local area looking fantastic – green fields, blossom in the fruit trees and patches of wildflowers. We have an extra advantage due to the elevated position of the crew seats in the appliances which gives a great view of the country-side.

Early September the Brigade was called to a local structure fire, just a few minutes from the station. The page was received mid afternoon and Cherry Gardens CFS were on scene shortly thereafter. In this type of situation, a whole chain of emergency protocols is initiated, from communication centres, SAPOL and other CFS Brigades. Unfortunately the fire had firm hold on the structure when we arrived, and crews went to work to ensure safety of people, to control and extinguish the fire and protect surrounding houses and buildings. Cherry Gardens 34P and the Sturt Group bulk water carrier (based at Cherry Gardens station) attended, as did additional CFS crews from Ironbank and Coromandel Valley. We train for these types of scenarios often and this includes the management of unexpected challenges quickly and safety as they arise. The fire was able to be contained, but the structure was unfortunately destroyed, with loss of possessions. Thankfully there were no injuries.

Our thoughts go out to the families involved as this is obviously a traumatic event, which happened right here in our community. For the brigade it shows us the need to continue our training, and keep equipment up to a high standard, so we are best able to assist no matter where and when we are called upon. Remember, a call to 000 when serious emergencies arise is all it takes to get us mobile.

You may have noticed the appliances outside the station recently on Monday nights with their impressive display of lights and sirens. With Spring here we are preparing for the upcoming bushfire season, and a mandatory 'burnover' drill must be carried out by each operational member prior to Summer. In the unlikely event of a fire turning on a crew during a bushfire, this procedure is followed as the appliances become the last safe place of ref-

uge. Pictured are 34 and 34P under simulated burnover conditions.

Please continue with preparations for the bush-

fire season, now is the time to make sure all is in order for the upcoming Summer. You will also see us out and about as we also ensure we are in good shape to help and protect the community.

Rachael Litchfield Interserve partners are a global community of ordinary Christians, taking action in faith. They live and work among the most marginalised peoples of the Arab world and Asia, both in their home countries and also in Australia. They are involved in bringing tangible love, social change and spiritual transformation to lives and communities.

The work of Interserve began in 1852 when two women were sent from the United Kingdom to establish a teacher training school in Kolkata, India. The school's purpose was to train Indian Christian women to go into the secluded Zenanas (women's quarters)

and teach reading and writing.
Scott was the Interserve Country Team Leader for Cambodia and Rachael was part of the Country leadership team. The multicultural team now has more than 40 adult partners and many other staff.

Rachael worked part-time as a physiotherapist at a holistic medical clinic, which provided loving care and quality treatment to patients who were poor and unable to access other health care options. She also tutored Cambodian physiotherapists with the hope of passing on some skills and knowledge. Their sons, Tennyson and Elliot, are now at university in Adelaide.

FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK

We need your help!

I think most people in the local area would not be familiar with the history of Scott Creek Conservation Park or its Friends group, despite its close proximity. The area now comprised within the Park has had a varied history since its European settlement in 1838. Copper was discovered in 1859 and in 1867 silver was found, creating the 'Scott Creek Silver Rush'. The mining boom only lasted two years, but small-scale mining continued at the Almanda Mine until 1887. Stone ruins of the old mine buildings and workings still exist either side of Dorset Vale Road.

In 1880, a large part of the reserve was split into working men's blocks of 20 acres or less. At various times there has been a jam factory, powder factory and a pottery in the area. Heavy logging and clearing took place between 1940 and 1950 but, even with all this past history and several devastating fires, the Park retains a natural beauty.

In addition to the mine ruins, glimpses of its varied history can still be seen elsewhere in the Park, including other stone and brick building ruins, such as the twisted chimney, and extensive stone walling. The South Australian Government purchased the land in the early 1970s for water supply purposes, but didn't proceed with this. In November 1985 it was proclaimed as a Conservation Park, managed by National Parks and Wildlife S.A.

In 1990, a group of interested locals got together and formed the Friends of Scott Creek Conservation Park. While probably not having a clear idea of what they were going to do, they all shared an appreciation for the wonderful natural attributes of the Park. Over time, the Friends learnt how to prioritise what needed most attention and when, and became adept at managing the threats to the native flora and fauna that called the Park home.

The Park has grown to be about 840 hectares in size since then while, at the same time, a number of the early members of the Friends group have found it necessary to retire from the on-ground activities. There is always the occasional new recruit to the team, but it is time to place a call out for new members.

We like to think of our working bees in the Park as being bush gardening. What we are doing is reducing the threats to our local plant species, to encourage them to thrive and multiply. Healthy native vegetation provides the homes for our wildlife and, without it, many species will continue to decline

in the region.

Each Friends' activity can be quite unique, from wandering through hectares of beautiful

hectares of beautiful bushland, enjoying the wildflowers, birds and other wildlife while looking for the occasional Boneseed, to the regularly held activities at Almanda Creek, across the road from the Almanda Mine car park.

The group meets at 9:00am (8:30am during summer) at the car park before travelling in convoy to the location in the Park for the activity, and generally finish up at lunch time with a mid-morning break for a cuppa and char

I encourage you to consider becoming a member of the Friends group (only \$10pa for single or family membership) and, if you are able to, coming along to give one of our bush gardening activities a try.

As with all volunteering, we all do what we can as individuals, whether it be joining in on all of the Friends' activities, once a month or perhaps just a couple of times a year, it all adds up and it all counts.

We also conduct bird banding and have walks in the Park, plus we can always use some help with meetings and behind the scenes work. In itself, none of this is particularly arduous but, as they say, many hands make light work! Our Annual General Meeting will take place on Thursday 16th November, starting at 7:30pm at the Cherry Gardens CFS, 295 Cherry Gardens Road. Following the brief formalities, our very own PhD student Petra Hanke will give a talk titled "Tails of Brown and Blue: The secret life of an Aussie Battler" about Superb Fairy-wrens in general and her research in Cleland and Scott Creek in particular.

I look forward to seeing you out in the Park or perhaps at the AGM. Peter Watton

MINTON FARM

This spring is shaping up to be the busiest and the most interesting one for the past 26 years!

- We have had nine Barn Owls, eight of which were juveniles from 3 days to 6 weeks old.
- A sweet little koala weighing in at only 360 grams which survived, after being brought in from a dog's mouth.
- Several joeys, the result of road kill, plus a pinkie joey weighing in at 900 grams, that was tossed by his mother. He is feeding well and growing a fine covering of fur daily.
- Injured kookaburras, kestrel, galahs, rosella, lorikeets, blue tongue and sleepy lizards.
- A tortoise brought from a Vet with stitches the length of its neck and tail, and needing rehab.
- I had a thought about our lizard tank, which was dug through by an echidna going right through the rusted metal floor, then turning up in the kangaroos lucerne, before he was returned home. I think one of those raised garden beds of oblong corrugated iron would be ideal to rehab lizards and tortoises. If anyone has one for sale, let us know please?
- Tawny Frogmouths came in all sizes from fluff ball to adult and were all released back into their territories.



- By far, the largest number of rescues were possums. In four weeks we received 40 ringtails and 5 brush tail possums. I don't recall ever having as many over such a short period. They were orphaned, electrocuted, and injured.
- There have also been wood and pacific black ducklings and plovers all living happily together under a heat lamp with a teddy mother until they are flying and ready to go off with the wild ones in the District.

We have also had many University students coming to learn about animal handling and rehabilitation.

A myriad of projects have been completed to improve the function and facilities of the Centre during this season as we continue to raise funds to build a better raptor rehabilitation facility.

Proposed to install a suitable gate and brick paved path along with lighting and drainage to protect the graves. We will plant an indigenous and native garden and arrange road side lighting.



Upgrade our local Memorial Hall facilities

The Cherry Gardens Community is an active semi-rural community that makes good use of its local Memorial Hall. The hall is ageing and in need of some help. We would love to upgrade the back section of the hall to increase the storage area, improve the kitchen facilities and the back facade, with increased lighting to prevent vandalism.



Circular flight: gives Raptors improved cycle of life. Many raptors come to Minton farm rescue centre from the local Neighbourhood. Like frogmouths, nan-

keen Kestrels, goshawks and Wedgetail eagles. There's 100's of successful releases, but when a longer rehab is required, muscle tone can diminish and impact their chances of survival. The circular flight design allows a large flying space and ability to build up muscle tone and practice hunting and predator evasion skills to fulfill their destiny. The overall size will be 18 m diameter and 6 m high.



Community Playground & Fitness Centre

The Recreation Ground is the only sport & recreation facility in our area and we are community owned with little assistance from local government. Currently we have one set of swings and a tunnel castle for children. We have designated land for a playground for kids of all ages alongside a fitness area for adults. The playground & fitness equipment will be open to everyone at all times.

Making the big switch



Crews from SA Power Networks have begun changing 16,000 light bulbs across our city in a program that will greatly reduce the amount of electricity the council uses each year.

The change has been negotiated to save on both energy costs and emissions, while providing lighting to a higher standard than what we have now.

The first lights to be targeted will be our oldest and most inefficient 80 watt Mercury Vapour lights. The new LED lights will use a fraction of the power at only 14 watts.

An added benefit is a reduction in 'skyglow' as LEDs only illuminate the road and footpath in front of them, rather than spilling light to the sky. This wasted light reduces our ability to see the stars.

The \$6million installation cost will be met by SA Power Networks, which will recoup the money from council through its annual lighting charges.

Once the LED lights are installed, we expect to see annual electricity savings of around \$630,000, and a 2700 tonne reduction in greenhouse gas emissions each year.

The initial changeover of 13,000 lights will be completed within six months.

A new space for young artists, designers, makers and brands to showcase their products, sell their work and learn about growing their business has opened at Colonnades Shopping Centre.

Intrepreneurial development workshops will be run at the site, which includes co-working and retail spaces provided by Vicinity Centres – the owners of Colonnades Shopping Centre.

Located in the old Jamie Oliver kitchen, facing Ramsay Place, Onkaparinga Youth Enterprise Hub (OYEH) is open to creatives and/or entrepreneurs under 30.

Community Development

To ensure that young people have access to opportunities such as granted and targeted training, OYEH is working with the council's ON Business Partner

Program.

Wilson says that with high rates of youth unemployment in the southern suburbs, OYEH will help provide a positive future for young people by building their entrepreneurial skills and empowering them to contribute to the economy.

"If there's high unemployment and not enough jobs, entrepreneurship provides an opportunity for people to be jobmakers, not just job-seekers," he says.
