GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS

March is the time to purchase Spring bulbs - get in early to get the best range.

Trim your Agapanthus of all the spent flower heads.

Sow sweet peas into well prepared soil (traditionally St. Patricks day - 17 March)

Fertilize lawns just before it is about to rain or water it in.

Plant winter veggies - seeds of cauliflower, broccoli, kale and salad greens into punnets, and carrots and swedes direct into soil and keep damp.

Continue to harvest veggies to encourage continued cropping.

This month watering is VERY important. Don't wait until plants are stressed before you water. Replenish mulch if it is thinning in places. Water under the mulch if possible. Still water if we have rain (unless we are lucky enough to have a downpour) Try to complete your watering early in the morning. The middle of summer is not a good time to be transplanting unless you are confident of several cooler days.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greeting Fellow Equines and Horse Owners! Hope everyone had a lovely carrotty munchy Christmas and New Year.

I always count on getting a few extra carrots over the festive season - I'm pretty sure they won't put any weight on me! My owners have managed to keep my weight down to just under 500kg. My regime is to be yarded overnight all year round now to keep things under control, plus I am ridden at least 3 days per week. Not extra hard, but enough to keep everything 'ticking over'. By having regular attention my owners are able to keep an eye on any changes in my physique. I must say that I enjoy the attention anyway, it's great to hear my owner telling me what a handsome person I am - does wonders for the ego! We equines are social creatures by nature and we do crave that interaction with not only our paddock mates, but our human carers. It helps to keep us relaxed and gives us something extra to look forward to during the day. What we love especially is that scratch at the withers (we do it to each other in the paddock), but if there is a hu-



man handy, that will do too. 'Good Boy' followed by a wither scratch is especially rewarding. It actually lowers our heart rate, so when being ridden, if we get something right, it's great to be rewarded in this way. When we relax, then we even perform better too. So it's a win-win for horse and rider and so easy to do.

Hope you all have your fire action plans in place for this summer. I know this was mentioned in the last article, just consider this as a reminder! Check gear for dryness and splitting and discard anything looking suss. Try to store gear in a reasonably cool area – please not a tin shed or the car

boot. Synthetic gear, including saddles with fibreglass trees do not store well in hot places. The tree can be permanently warped if kept in such conditions. Saddles should be laid horizontally on a saddle rail/rack, or if on the floor, stand saddle on the pommel with cantle uppermost. Do not lay flat on the floor. Bridles should hang on a round shape such as an old baked bean tin or proper hanger (from Horseland or Bonnetts) so that the headpiece doesn't get a sharp bend in it. Have an inventory of all horse gear in case of fire. In fact, keep a couple of copies say on the computer and a hard copy at work or in the car. Doing an inventory is also a good way of sorting through exactly what you do have and need and what you don't want or don't need (a bit scary really). At least you will be prepared for most eventualities.

CFS NEWS



since the last issue of the Cherry Chatter was published. The Fire Danger Period has well and truly kicked off with the fires in the lower north, early on, a number of fires on the Fleurieu Peninsula and then the really major fire at Sampson Flat. The Cherry gardens CFS Brigade did a total of six 12 hours shifts, to that incident with a full crew each time, starting on the Friday night, through Saturday and Sunday, day and night shifts, with a break on the Monday and Tuesday (when interstate crews provided some much needed relief) before going out again on the Wednesday, ahead of the change that brought the very welcome and relieving rain.

It has been a major task to ensure that we had enough available crew back here to be able to deal with any potential local incidents while still being able to respond crews to the Sampson Flat fire. Our local Air Support crews were also kept busy, as they too were providing back up and support.

I would like to thank all of the Cherry Gardens CFS members for all of their great effort and work, as well as acknowledge the very warm and generous support that so many community people have shown us throughout the fire and since. We really appreciate it.

One thing I would like to highlight is that we have, once again, been lucky that we were not directly impacted by the devastating Sampson Flat fire, so take this as a well intended omen that you need to be prepared and stay prepared for bushfires in the Adelaide Hills and do not become complacent. Preparation for bushfires is not something that you can do on the day and is not something that is done on just one day in the year ahead for the Fire

danger Period.

We have had a range call-outs since Sampson Flat, some minor and some quite tragically significant, but all of them are keeping us on our toes.

I would also like to take the opportunity to welcome those of you from our community who have answered the call and have come along to inquire about joining the Cherry Gardens CFS Brigade as we are always keen to have new local members.

If you're interested in lending your support and thinking of becoming a member of your local CFS Brigade then just come along on a Monday night and take a look, no obligation, from 7pm onwards. All welcome.

MINTON FARM

Sampson Flat bushfire wildlife cared for by an army of volunteers near Adelaide 891 ABC Adelaide By Brett Williamson

undreds of volunteers and not-for-profit organisations have banded together to care for the large number of native animals injured in the recent bushfires near Adelaide.

For one volunteer, 21-year-old Di Pearson, it was a case of finishing her role fighting the fire with the Lobethal Country Fire Service (CFS) crew then going straight into the ranks of the South Australian Veterinary Emergency Management (SAVEM) teams to help affected animals.

"There was basically nothing left at the areas where we were going out to at the start, no feed left, no boughs left for any of the koalas." The site is a lunar landscape of grey ash and the charred trunks of burnt trees.

By the time they were allowed access, many of the injured animals were in such poor condition that the only option was to humanely euthanize the severe cases on location.

Fellow SAVEM volunteer and operator of the Minton Farm Animal Rescue Centre, Bev Langley, said koalas were the hardest hit. "The koalas were just sitting there suffering, and there was no way of relieving that without putting them out of their misery. "It was just too cruel to keep them going," Ms Langley said.

Hope was found within every untouched corridor they discovered within the fire grounds, with a collection of animals sheltering in unburnt patches. "Whether the CFS dropped some stuff out of a plane or whether they squirted the grass so they had somewhere to go; they were not burned at all," Ms Langley said.

Local vets and medical centres have been quick to donate excess goods to the rescue centre. "I think it has brought the best out in a lot of people," Ms Langley said.

VOLUNTEERS PROVIDING PRIMARY CARE



Ms Pearson and Ms Langley, the days since the Sampson Flat bush-fires began have been filled with searching the grounds for injured wildlife and caring for two orphaned kangaroos and two baby possums.

As part of another voluntary role, this time

with the Minton Farm Animal Rescue Centre, Ms Pearson is currently caring for five possums and one kangaroo, with a second kangaroo now in her care from the Sampson Flat fires. Two possums and a joey would remain in the care of the rescue centre until their conditions improved.

Ms Langley said the older possum was beginning to thrive, but the younger of the two was suffering from the affects and stress of the fire. "The burns are healing beautifully, but in herself, the stress of it has taken a toll." She was confident both would recover and would be relocated to an area close to where they were found when they are healthy.

The joey was recovering well, with burns to her rear legs healing, but was unlikely to be released due to its young age and the likelihood it would not be able to integrate into a new mob. "It is very a big responsibility to do the right thing by that animal," Ms Langley said.


