OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Hope you had a festive Yuletide and New Year. It is a quite a season for Queensland-like weather so far (ie. warm and humid). The grasses in the paddock are not drying off as quickly as my owners would like, which means they are having to keep to the medium intensity horsekeeping system. Basically this means locking me and my paddock mates up every night to restrict our daily food intake (especially mine!). By the end of last winter I was down to 477kg and looking very trim. I am now touching close to 500kg and my owners are desperately trying to keep me below that mark. As well as being yarded overnight I go into out 'Jenny Craig' yard for an hour or 2 during the day. Usually one of my mates is in there with me as he likes his food too. We can see all the others (3), so we don't really get stressed about being locked up. My owners have one of those weight tapes and



measure me on a daily basis. It is pretty accurate to within 10kg or so and is a useful tool to have.

Those of you who ride the local Tom Roberts Trail may notice from time to time fallen trees or places where the track has become overgrown. This is not safe for the horse, rider or the passing motorist. If you see anything needing attention, the best way to get a response from council is to take a photo (everyone is so good at that these days) of the problem area and send it in to council. They are generally pretty good at responding when informed this way. Of course this in-

cludes walkers, people with dogs etc so is not limited to just the equine fraternity. On the subject of safety, don't forget to wear boots, safety helmet and highly visible clothing when out on the road. Also remember to thank those motorists who slow down when passing. Good manners cost us nothing and hopefully will encourage the same response from that motorist next time around. If you have had your helmet for a while, best to check the date on the inside. Manufacturers recommend replacing a helmet every 5 years (bin it!), or even 3. If you have a nasty accident resulting in a head injury and your helmet is past its 5 year date, you may not have much luck with the insurance company! When buying, check that the helmet is Australian Safety Standards Approved. There is usually a sticker on the inside and the outside to verify this.

CFS NEWS

Sitting here today pondering the content of this learned article, I'm in the process of deciding whether to get a jumper or tough it out, as the day must get warmer. Currently 12.3 degrees vs an Adelaide forecast of a balmy 25 degrees, brrrr. Today, Feb 6th, provided 35mm of beautiful soaking rain overnight, now projects 40 degree temperature in two days followed by three days at 37 degrees! Who said summer was over! Look on the bright side, friends in Austria have been dealing with minus 16—22 over the last few weeks---that's cold!

As our paddocks green up, which normally happens in May, locals, quite naturally, start to relax in relation to the Bushfire Threat. Summer, what there's been of it, has been all over the place while our friends on the Eastern seaboard are copping heatwaves one after the other. We cannot relax and the CFS urges all residents to NOT become complacent in relation to bushfires until seasonal conditions change permanently! This week's upcoming weather is a timely warning---summer "aint over yet" and it takes only a few days of hot weather followed by strong northerlies to place the area under extreme threat!

The Cherry Gardens siren has sounded several times in the last few weeks

alarming residents who naturally wonder where the fire is. We apologise for the false alarms and are doing everything we can to track down the fault which appears to be a faulty pager message from Adelaide Fire. The siren is tested every Friday morning at 0800 hrs and is then only sounded to indicate a bushfire within the Cherry Gardens District. If you hear the siren check the CFS Information Hot Line and activate your Bushfire Plan, should there be a fire.

Your Cherry Gardens Brigade has now exceeded 106 callouts since July 1st last year and our Communications Operations Support Team are well over 130 callouts year to date, despite sharing the load with the Belair Team on a week on/week off basis. These calls are well ahead of previous years and records look like they will be broken by June 30th.

Six new firefighters have joined in the last month or so and Comms have a couple of new members. We remain undermanned and if you are considering joining please pop in on any Monday night at 7pm for a station tour and a no obligation chat. You will be most welcome.

The mighty STUG BWIIC, the Sturt Groups compressed air foam tanker based at Cherry Gardens, has been busy assisting firstly the Metropolitan Fire Service at the Edinburgh Maxi Plas plastics fire and only a week later the



\$15 million plus Bowmans Hay Shed fire. The Bowmans fire was extinguished in four days when it could have burnt for a week or more. The STUG can take a lot of the credit in putting that fire out so quickly and working in extreme heat for three days---well done to the three crews involved!

One recent local fire involved a pile of green waste which ignited due to spontaneous combustion. Fortunately weather conditions were mild and the pile was quickly extinguished. Please be careful stockpiling green waste which can overheat and ignite.

Requesting a service from Council

In recent discussions about lack of maintenance of horse trails in the area it became apparent that many residents are not aware that it's possible to make an online request to Council for work needing to be done.

The request form can be found at:

http://www.onkaparingacity.com/forms/request_form.asp

This is suitable for requesting action on just about any area of Council responsibility, from reporting dumped rubbish or graffiti to asking for trimming of roadside vegetation or removal of fallen trees. It's important to be as geographically accurate as possible, so use adjacent letterbox numbering or if a photo is taken with a smartphone, GPS coordinates can be copied from the 'properties' section of the data associated with the image.

It is also important to keep a copy of the request, with dates and any reference numbers issued by Council. If a job is not done within a reasonable time these are necessary for staff to track a request or can be forwarded to the elected members asking them to follow up.

FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK



We are all aware we have been receiving some very unpredictable and extreme weather events over the last year. In particular, there have

been a number that have included strong winds and heavy downpours.

As you would expect, most people judge these events based on their impact on our lives. There have been power cuts, from the one caused by tornados in September, which led to a blackout of the entire state, to several local ones that may have been caused by branches or trees bringing down powerlines and infrastructure. Roads can be blocked and property damaged by the strong winds, including roofs, sheds and fencing.

Heavy rainfall can also create havoc. Sometimes individual homes are flooded while other times whole streets or suburbs can be affected. There may be land slips and erosion caused by flooded creeklines. There has also been some hail damage caused.

We must pay tribute to the tremendous help we receive from our emergency services, especially the volunteers in our local SES and CFS. Even when their own lives are being disrupted by these extreme weather events, they go out of their way to help others. We need to keep this in mind and ensure we don't make frivolous requests or demands on their time.

In addition to the extreme weather events, we have had a very wet year, and it seems that we may be heading for some sort of record rainfall this summer as well.

So, what does all this mean in our natural environments?

Not surprisingly, the extended rainfall season has resulted in good growth of weeds within our parks. We are finding that, with a few warmer days scattered amongst the days with rainfall, a lot of weed seed in the soil is germinating and growing to a size that most will survive through to next winter. This will result in a greater number of weeds that will require treatment come next spring and summer. When there is a hot and dry summer, often many of the seedlings that germinate in spring will die before the following winter.

Of course the other side to this is that native vegetation has also responded very well to the extra rain, and it is expected that this year should be particularly good for a lot of the lilies and orchids.

Last Cherry Chatter I provided some

information about a prescribed burn that took place in Scott Creek CP late November 2016. Visiting the burn area this February it was obvious that the wet weather has resulted in masses of both weed and native plant growth, and it will certainly be a challenge to keep on top of the weed management for the staff from the Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources. The last thing the members of the Friends group want is to have to divert our time away from our regular weed control activities across the whole park to attend to a problem created by the burn.

On a positive note, some of the threatened species mentioned in the January edition of Cherry Chatter have shown very strong regrowth, including the nationally critically endangered Veronica derwentiana ssp. homalodonta (Mt Lofty Speedwell). The state rare Bassian Thrush, a secretive bird that forages in leaf litter on the ground for small invertebrates and worms, has also already been sighted within the area of the prescribed burn.

Most of the damage caused by the extreme weather events, including the strong winds and downpours, are less obvious, unless a tree or branch falls across one of the management tracks in the park, or one of the tracks gets eroded by the heavy rain.

The main worry for our wildlife is when an old tree with large hollows falls, as it can take hundreds of years for a tree to get to an age where it can provide a hollow large enough for a bird such as the Yellow-tailed Black Cockatoo. However, the tree will continue to provide habitat for other native animals once it is on the ground, and for this reason it is very important to leave fallen timber in the park as habitat, and not remove it for firewood. Generally the gap in the canopy will also provide the opportunity for another eucalypt seedling to establish and become the next generation of hollow-providing tree.

NEXT MEETINGS

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS FOR MARCH 2017

It is time to divide strappy plants such as Dianella, Kangaroo Paw, and Lomandra. Lift clumps with a fork, cut into smaller clumps with lots of healthy sections, remove dead leaves, cut off the top half and re-plant.

Propogate evergreen perennials and shrubs e.g. Abelia, Budlea, Camelia, Geranium, Choisya, and Viburnum. Take hardwood cuttings 15cm long, cut below a node, remove tip, remove leaves from bottom 5cm and insert into propagating mix.

It is time for Hyacinth and Tulip bulbs to go into the 'fridge for 6 weeks in readiness for planting.

Now is the time to prune Spring flowering roses such as Lorraine Lee

Who lives in there?

Have you ever walked through your local park and wondered what lives there? Or perhaps you've noticed nesting boxes high in the trees and thought little of it?

The Growing Data Foundation has come up with a brilliant idea to use modified nest boxes to find out more about the small birds and animals living near urban areas.

The group has received a Community Action Grant of \$4650 from the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges Natural Resources Management Board, which will purchase nest boxes and sensors, as well as establishing a website.

Images plus motion and temperature data from inside the boxes will be captured to provide real-time information on which boxes are being used and the birds and animals using them. Nesting boxes can be expensive and it's often hard to know whether they're being placed in the best locations and which species are using them. This project aims to take a lot of the guesswork out of that and increase the effectiveness of nesting box projects.

A small demonstration at a site in the Adelaide parklands will begin in Feb-



ruary. The special nesting boxes will transmit data to a repository for storage, analysis and publishing online. Passers-by will also be able to access the information from the nesting boxes via their mobile phone – tiny Bluetooth beacons located on the nesting boxes will broadcast a web page address where the latest information on the nesting boxes can be found.

MINTON FARM

The Centre has continued to receive an interesting array of rescues. A Nankeen Kestrel chick was flown down from Challenger Goldmine as it was found on a 45 degree day, on the ground. The chick was raised for two weeks to the stage where it was flying and able to tear its own food up to eat. It was flown back to the mine 800kms from Coober Pedy once again. It flew off strongly where its family was also present. Unfortunately it was found again hiding under a car and not coping. The rescuer brought it back to the Adelaide Airport where we once again collected him. We will keep him in care until he is more capable.

CLIFF SAFETY – AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR ALL BEACHGOERS

When the weather heats up, many of us head to the coast and spend time around some of the beautiful beaches in our region – and who can blame us? However, we would like to remind all visitors of the coastal hazards when on, under or nearby cliffs, especially after damage caused by storm events late last year.

Beachgoers don't always understand the fragile nature of cliffs and set-up on the beach within the fall zone. We would like to urge everyone to stay safe this summer by following some simple tips:

- if you sit in the shade of the cliff, you may be in danger due to the risk of collapse and rockfalls – sit at least 20m away from the base of the cliff
- follow all signed directions and observe warnings that are placed along the coastline
- stay on formal tracks and paths
- keep well clear of the edge of cliffs and don't try to venture down to the beach on slippery or steep slopes
- don't try to climb up the cliff faces.
