EDITORIAL

ANZAC Day Service 2017

or each of us ANZAC Day has its own meaning and significance. For me it is a day of mixed emotions. Both my grandfathers went to war. My dad's father spent a couple of years in the trenches of France in the WWI and was fortunate to get injured in a train accident and was unable to continue his service. My mum's dad was too young for WWI (although he did try to join) and was too old for overseas service in WW2 but served in and around Darwin. I always take time out to think of them and be thankful for what they did and that they survived otherwise I would not be here!

For nearly 30 years now our family has attended the ANZAC morning service here in Cherry. There were many mornings in the early years where we were one of the very few to turn up and on one occasion there was not even a bugler to sound the last post. In the last 15 years, after the upgrade to the memorial park, the numbers attending each ANZAC Day service have steadily grown and those of us involved with the Cherry Chatter feel wonder at the number of people now, who turn out for the Cherry morning service and what the many local men that enlisted and traveled to far off places would have thought.

Many of these men never returned and as a tribute to their memory, thanks to the generosity of the Jacobs family who donated a portion of their land, the Soldiers Memorial Park was planted in 1923. For each soldier who paid the Supreme Sacrifice they planted a Golden Cypress tree to a background of many other deciduous and evergreen trees.

In 1935 a Cross of Remembrance was erected amongst the Cypress trees. The names of all those who enlisted and died, from the district, in World

War I are listed on and Honour

Board in the Cherry Gardens Uniting Church. The World War II Cherry Gardens soldier's names are listed on another Honour Board in the Memorial Hall.

I have been fortunate to be able to attend ANZAC Day services in a few different countries over the years and

it is fitting to remember that services are held all over the world by Australians. Whenever I do attend these services I always have in my mind standing amongst the Golden Cypress trees in Cherry Gardens listening to the Last Post as it echoes through the district. It is always an

emotional experience that I strongly recommend to all other locals that they spend a little of their valuable time this ANZAC Day and join the many others to remember these Australian Hero's here in Cherry.

The names of all the locals who served during WWI are on the new Honour Board we presented to the district and had dedicated in 2015 as part of the 100 year anniversary. This is now hanging on the front wall of the Memorial Hall.

LEST WE FORGET

The ANZAC Day service for 2017 will commence at 8.30am at the Soldier's Memorial Park and will be followed by the BBQ breakfast at the Hall. Everyone is welcome and we hope to see you there.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

he paddocks are slow to dry out this year after such a good long winter. Yours truly and mates are still pretty much on our winter regime of being locked away overnight. And yet still I can manage to keep those kilos on! For those equines who struggle to keep their weight (due to age, temperament or breed) this is probably a good thing as we are coming into the time of year when pasture is not so lush. These topsy turvy weather conditions bring with them other problems such as hoof abscesses, founder and seedy toe. These ailments are not usual for this time of year, so have been catching owners by surprise. Abscesses and seedy toe will thrive where there is warmth and moisture and need careful management. An abscess can even come about through having a stone bruise, so it pays to be so vigilant where our equines' feet are concerned. Checking feet in the mornings is a good time to check for any heat or swelling. If the horse doesn't move around much, he may accumulate grass and soil in his hooves overnight which can cause his feet to heat up, so be prepared to clean them out, especially if that horse is not going to be ridden either that day or in



the next few days. Also when checking for heat/swelling make sure you look at the opposite leg as a comparison. Getting to know what is normal for your horse is useful too. He may normally have one front foot which is warmer than its counterpart. If it is not usual, then best to start looking further! It is said that 90% of horse problems originate from the knee down and that does seem to be pretty much the rule. No 'oof no 'orse as the old blokes used to say! Abscesses and seedy toe are a real problem as they can be slow to get rid of, and of course you lose all that riding time too. With an abscess you normally will have some lameness accompanied by heat. If you feel around the hoof, where the heat is, that is

where the abscess will be (mostly). If you are lucky, your farrier can dig it out from the sole (this can take some doing), if not, it may travel up inside the hoof wall and come out at the coronet. This can take months and is very painful for your trusty equine. Bran poultices and Epsom baths (in a bucket) can also help to give temporary relief. With seedy toe the hoof will sound hollow and it will be smelly and black. Again your farrier will be able to dig right up inside the wall of the hoof where the bacteria will having a wonderful time in that warm dark place. The hole needs to be well cleaned out, disinfected and plugged to keep any more dirt from getting in. This is ongoing and can also take months to heal up. Horses with shallow, flat and generally poor quality hooves are quite prone to this condition. Ongoing maintenance is the key though, if anything to help prevent the condition from getting any worse. Plenty of food for thought as

CFS NEWS

ver the past few months Cherry Gardens Brigade has been fortunate to welcome more than half a dozen new firefighters and communications officers. As a brigade we're always on the lookout for people willing to volunteer their time and effort, whether by holding a hose on the fire ground or manning a radio at the station. My own time as a CFS volunteer firefighter began nearly two years ago when, after a few months of procrastination, I finally turned up at the Cherry Gardens station on a Monday training night. Having had limited experience with the CFS I didn't know what to expect, but the environment was relaxed and welcoming and I was quickly put at ease. That first night was a whirlwind as I was given a tour of the station and shown the diverse range of equipment carried on each of the trucks. Up to that point I had no idea there were so many different types of hose fittings in the world. The next week I observed an exercise simulating a tractor rollover with a Brigade member doing a first class impersonation of an injured farmer, complete with moaning and groaning. As I watched, the trucks arrived and the team quickly got to work assessing the "casualty", applying first aid and finally strapping the patient to a spinal board for quick retrieval. A few

weeks later I attended the Basic Firefighting Course at Woodside Station alongside a dozen or so new volunteers from various brigades around the area. Over the weekend we learned the basics of fire behaviour and firefighting plus a host of other skills designed to introduce us to the type of scenarios we were likely to face as CFS volunteers. Having completed the course I became a fully active member of the Brigade and could now attend callouts. Training continued on Monday nights covering a wide range of topics such as hose drills, how to talk on the radio, road crash rescue, handling hazardous materials and coordinating helicopter landings, just to name a few.

The first large scale incident I attended was the Pinery bushfire in 2015. I'll never forget driving through scorched fields and seeing the twisted remains of farm equipment still smouldering twenty four hours after the fire had passed. That day was spent "mopping up", which means wetting down areas of ground and vegetation that are still hot and could potentially spark another fire. This involves using a temperature sensor to measure the heat of the ground in front of you. It's quite an experience to realise the ground under your boots is heated to around 1000 C!

Since then I've attended numerous incidents at all times of the day and in all weather condi-



tions. It's satisfying to be able to put the training into practice and achieve a good result, whether the job is big or small. I've attended formal training in First Aid and this year I've signed up for courses on the correct use of chainsaws and how to use Breathing Apparatus to enter a smoke filled building. I've also been learning how to drive our trucks and will be taking my Heavy Rigid license exam in the next few weeks.

For me, the last year and a half has been about getting out of my comfort zone by learning new things and facing new experiences. My journey as a CFS volunteers is still very much beginning, but I can't wait to see where it takes me in the years to come.

The summer netball competition finals were held on a very warm Thursday night (2/3). Congratulations to these teams who were the inaugural winners:



When is a plant a weed? Part I.

There are a number of definitions of what a weed is; "an unwanted plant", "a plant out of

place", "a plant in the wrong place", or something a little more quantifiable like "a plant that grows where it is not wanted and often grows or spreads fast or takes the place of desired plants."

Generally, if we are talking about the home garden, a weed is any plant that we did not plant ourselves, in the veggie patch it is again something that we didn't plant there, in a cropping situation on a farm it is anything that is not the crop.

In native vegetation like Scott Creek Conservation Park, however, a weed or pest plant could perhaps be described as "a plant that has originally been introduced by humans to an area deliberately or accidentally, then has self propagated without aid where it is not wanted, possibly spreading by natural means to new areas" (from the June 2012 South Australian Department For Environment technical report Review of recent plant naturalisations in South Australia and initial screening for weed risk).

This means any plant that has been spread into an area where, to the best of our knowledge, it is beyond its naturally occurring range, and where it has naturalised and is reproducing on its own.

According to the above technical report, there are about 27,000 deliberately introduced plants in Australia, of which around 2,800 have successfully naturalised. These plants may have been introduced from overseas, such as Olives and Blackberries from Europe, or from other parts of Australia, like Sweet Pittosporum from NSW that has been introduced to South Australia and become weedy in the Adelaide Hills. Plants that are native to one part of South Australia have even become weedy in other parts of the state where they have been deliberately planted, like the Flinders Ranges Wattle.

There continues to be an average of 10 new plants that naturalise in Australia every year. In SA there are over 1,500 naturalised plants recorded in the state plant Census, compared to nearly 4,500 indigenous species. It should be noted that, while many garden plants have escaped the confines of gardens to naturalise in bushland, these lists do not include the many horticultural plants that do not exhibit these weedy tendencies and stay

put in the garden.

It is important to manage pest plants, as they can have significant negative impacts on primary industries, native vegetation and human health. It has been estimated that weeds cost Australian farmers around \$1.5 billion a year in control activities and a further \$2.5 billion a year in lost agricultural production. The cost of weeds to the environment is difficult to calculate, but it is expected that the cost would be similar to, if not greater than, that estimated for agricultural industries. Next month we will talk about weed risk assessment and plants that are declared under the Natural Resources Management (NRM) Act 2004.

Sunday 7th May is our Almanda Project Showcase Day. There will be an open day held between 10am and 3pm at the Almanda Mine site on Dorset Vale Road, Cherry Gardens, to help celebrate the third year of our project. Come along and take a self-guided or guided walk along a section of Almanda Creek and around Almanda Swamp, to see first-hand some of the work being undertaken by the Friends group to help restore this and other creek systems within the park. There will also be a display with information about the park and the Friends group activities, and Project reports, local bird brochures and park maps for sale. MINTON FARM

ur tiny 600gram koala Buffy has grown into a fine young man weighing 3,530 kgs. He has progressed to being housed with other koalas as he continues his life journey. We have loved being able to assist him to have a second chance at life after being found locally in a gutter flowing with icy cold water last year.

This year we plan to build a circular flight. The purpose of this complex is to provide a suitable exercise facility for birds of prey that come into care, principally through injury. Birds of prey require supreme fitness in order to maintain flying speed to maintain strike rates. Without this the bird will gradually weaken and die when released. The raptor area that was constructed over 20 years ago has deteriorated so much so that the wild brown goshawks were entering through the rusted wire netting roof and killing the birds inside the enclosure.
