

EDITORIAL


ANZAC Day Wednesday, 25 April

n the years immediately following World War I, governments and society in general had not accepted the responsibility for those incapacitated and bereft as a result of war. In Britain and across the Commonwealth, unemployment accentuated the problem. Earl Haig, the British Commander-in-Chief, undertook the task of organising the British Legion as a means of coping with the problems of hundreds and thousands of men who had served under him in battle.

In 1921, a group of widows of French ex-servicemen called on him, at the British Legion Headquarters. They brought with them from France some poppies they had made, and suggested that they might be sold as a means of raising money to aid the distressed among those who were incapacitated as a result of the war. The first red poppies to come to Australia, in 1921, were made in France.



In Australia, single poppies are not usually worn on ANZAC Day - the poppy belongs to Remembrance Day, 11 November. However, wreaths of poppies are traditionally placed at memorials and honour boards on ANZAC Day.



The symbolism of the red poppy has been translated to represent the red blood of those who gave their lives, the black at the poppies centre as the representation of the grief of their families and friends, left behind and the green of the leaf to represent the new life and growth for the hope of the future.

On Monday 12th the CGGC were privileged to hear from Kevin Handreck ex CSIRO researcher, author of 3 books among them "Growing Media for Plants and Turf, 50 scientific papers, and a couple of hundred articles in popular, trade magazine articles for the nursery industry. We heard

all about the needs of our plants with regard to soils, specifically the danger of over watering as a knee jerk reaction in either shallow sandy, sticky clay, or water repellent, and/or non draining soils. "Wet feet" can cause rotting of the essential fine root tip hairs with the result that the plants ability to absorb nutrients and moisture is cut off. We heard of the way to increase drainage by adding gypsum to clay soils, bentonite or diluted clay watered over unwettable soils and the essential need for soil wetter in some of these soils. The waxy substance exuded by micro-organisms after the processing of organic matter can also lead to unwettable characteristics of

We also heard of patches or layers of non wetting soils within a pot or a garden bed.

There were many questions from the floor indicating that this is an area of

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Looks like we are heading into a dry autumn, so there will still be snakes about, so do keep your horse areas free of debris, clutter and long grass. Those who are not so good 'doers' may start to lose a bit of condition. It pays to keep an eye on this as it may be difficult to get that weight back on once the colder weather hits. For the good 'doers' (such as yours truly), this is quite a good time as we can afford to drop that bit of extra without any worries! If ground cover has been reduced so that there are bare patches, and you are hand feeding hay in the paddock, there can be a risk of colic through ingesting sandy soil with bits of hay. A couple of things can help here put the hay into an 'off the ground' feeding rack, or get a large length of industrial rubber sheeting and feed your equine off that. The rubber sheet can also be placed under the feeder. Of course feed will still get spread around, but at least this will minimise your risk. Also feeding your horse on an area of pavers works well too. If it is possible, do this near to his water source, so that hay is not spread around too far as he wanders from food to water.

Rugging at this time of year can be tricky too, as the days are still warm, but the nights are definitely getting colder. However, remember the horse



is already wearing his own fur coat, and unless he is old or unwell, there is no need to rug just yet. It is when you get the chill factors of wind and rain that the horse can suffer, so although the nights may be getting cold, Autumn is not generally windy, so not a great need to rug. Light rugging does help to keep your neddy clean, but don't put it on without checking and grooming once a week at the minimum. My new paddock mate had a synthetic rug left on him last winter and was not worked. He still has lumps of old scabs along his back from dried sweat and dirt which are hard to remove without causing him discomfort. The synthetic rugs are great to use, but they can become very warm in moderate weather. Best to keep rugs off whenever practicable.

Back to the float loading/parking! Doing your homework before asking to perform new tasks will pay off and be less stressful for both of you. It is best

done somewhere in his normal work area where he feel safe and secure. Just like us humans, they cannot learn in a stressful situation, so you need as few distractions as possible. Teaching your horse to park is a valuable asset and is an essential part of his education. It can be done with a halter or bridle, an ordinary lead rope or a long western one. Once he is in your quiet area, just have him standing and move away from him a little (this depends on the horse). If he follows you, put him back to the same place. It is easier to do this with a long whip (with a light tap, tap just below the knee) so that you don't have to move your own feet. As soon as he is back where he started, you must cease the tap. You can gradually increase the distance, or just walk around the horse from both directions. The key is any time he moves, put him back where he was he will soon get the idea. As you and he get better with this you will be able to move far away from him without him moving. THEN add in your word cue like 'stand' and he will obey that. Make sure you practise and have patience and end on a good note. Remember to reward with praise and a scratch at the wither (this lowers his heart rate). Now you can go off and put up your jumps or whatever and he can watch! More next time....



hance crew safety by improving communications during an emergency (it is very much the case that to fight a fire, you have a hose in one hand and a radio in the other!) The brigade set about fundraising some time ago, but with the extra support from the Cherry Chatter it now means we have achieved our goal. There is now an extra hand held radio in each appliance – many thanks to the generosity of the Cherry Chatter committee and the community that supports this hard working group.

Work has begun on renovating the front of the station which will give it a more modern, smarter look. This project was given the green light some time ago, so it is good to see it now underway – it may even be completed by the time this is published!

We also held a recruiting/open day last month, so hopefully many of you were able to come and see what we do. Potentially we are still looking to add to our membership, so if you have ever thought you might be able to help, come and see us any Monday night. As well as firefighters, there are

also roles for radio operators in the communication facility at the station. Whatever the position, it is a lot of fun





CHURCH NEWS

John McCrae was a Canadian doctor and teacher who started writing poetry at an early age. "In Flanders Fields", his second last poem, was composed at the battlefront on May 3rd, 1915, during the second battle of Ypres, in a region called Flanders. There were actually poppies growing in the fields among the unmarked graves of the war dead. The poem was written following the death of a friend and former student of McCrae's, and is said to have vividly portrayed the scene before him as he wrote.

In Flanders fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard among the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high.



If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders fields.

Lest we forget.

Australia Day Event Success!

Sunday 4th March 2018 was Clean Up Australia Day, and the crew from Jacobs Rd did a fantastic job!

Jacobs Rd was registered formally as a Clean Up Australia Day site, and residents were seen collecting all sorts of rubbish from the intersection of Jacobs Rd and Cherry Gardens Rd, all the way down to the end of Jacobs Rd. Adults and children were involved, as well as local puppy and personality, "Honey the Kelpidor". Everyone was decked out in a mix of Hi-Vis jackets, and bright yellow or pink gloves, and were using special bags provided by the Clean Up Australia Day organisers.

In total, 277 pieces of rubbish were collected, with II pieces being recy-



clable. Some of the rubbish collected included: beer bottles and cans, plastic drink bottles, single-use plastic bags, chip and lolly wrappers, and pizza boxes.

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUG-GESTIONS FOR APRIL 2018

In the veggie garden it is time to plant all of the Brassica family as well as Broad Beans, Onions, and Turnips. Flowers to plant this month could include Pansies, Poppies, and Primulas. Continue to plant Spring flowering bulbs.

Feed your fruit trees with a mineral mix just outside of the drip-line of the tree, and water in well.

Now is a good time to propagate hardwood cuttings.

Make full use of Autumn leaves as they can be a valuable source of nutrient for the soil. Either mulch them or just pile them up, water them down and leave in a heap preferably with some sort of barrier to stop them blowing around. they will eventually rot down to produce leaf mould which can be dug in to improve your soil.

Once again as the breeding season draws to a close we have had an amazing success rate with frozen semen



inseminations. It was a difficult year to begin with thanks to very unseasonable weather but once we got the mares to the point of being able to inseminate the pregnancies happened. We are still finding for the fourth year in a row that we are doing more frozen inseminations than chilled & the success rate has again been higher with the frozen-even with a number of lose dose inseminations. We still have a few more mares to do so let's hope that we can add to the pregnancy tally!



Equine Dentistry - Is sedation really necessary?

We keep hearing that sedation used for Equine Dentistry is only for badly behaved horses or vets who can't handle horses. This is very untrue!

Sedation allows for a thorough examination involving touch and sight. This helps identify any problems early for easiest treatment and management. Sedation also allows for equipment such as light and mirrors to be used, and reduces stress on the horse as well as ensures safety for the handler. It keeps the horse's muscles relaxed & also acts as pain relief.

Another thing to consider is that the worse the pathology in the mouth the worse the unsedated horse plays up, and he is the one that needs a thorough job the most. Only vets can legally sedate a horse and have the insurance to do so. Please remember that good regular dental care can help prevent many cases or colic or choke as well as ensure the best welfare of your horse or pony!

We have seen quite a few cows lately with Cancer Eye (also known as Squamous Cell Carcinoma) - here is what you should know about this condition! Eye cancer occurs in mainly older cattle, particularly Herefords, Poll Herefords and Friesians with unpigmented eyelids and eyeballs. Cancer eye growths can occur on the eyeball, eyelid or third eyelid.



All eye cancers develop from precursor lesions, but less than half of these lesions develop into cancer. The precursor lesion can be:



- a plaque (a slightly elevated, flat, opaque area on the eyeball)
- a papilloma (a wart-like growth protruding from the eyeball)
- a keratoma (a horn-like projection attached to the eyelid)
- a small ulcer on the eyelid.

The cancerous tissue also grows inwards, invading the deeper tissues behind the eye. It can progress to the lymph nodes of the head and then to body organs such as the lungs and liver. Cancers that begin in the third eyelid or outer eyelids usually invade the deeper tissues more quickly than do those that start on the eyeball.

The main message is that early detection and treatment is extremely important!

Onkaparinga Libraries Service Review

The City of Onkaparinga recently completed a service review of its six libraries.

The objective was to ensure all six libraries continue to meet current community needs and are best placed to respond to broader trends that are changing the definition of what libraries offer in future.

"The review showed that library services are performing very well against other benchmarked services in SA and nationally, and we're very proud of our team for this achievement," said Community Relations Director Philomena Taylor.

The review identified ongoing efficiency savings of \$290,000 each year, to commence from the 2018–19 budget.

"This figure represents less than three per cent of our \$10.4 million annual libraries budget. These savings will have little or no impact on the level of service provided to the community."

The \$290,000 saving includes a \$50,000 reduction in the purchase of items for loan.

"We can achieve this and still meet the needs of our customers because the One Card system now enables people to borrow and return items from any library within the state.

"The remaining savings will be found by reviewing whether we need to replace vacancies when

they arise and by changing the way we manage our pool of casual employees.

"This is good practice and makes sure we are delivering library services efficiently."

Ms Taylor said the service review process required that Council consider all possibilities and which is why the full report document contained a financial analysis of possible library closures.

However, library closures did not form part of the final recommendations to Council

"Council did not resolve to close libraries, our elected members only approved \$290,000 in annual savings and the creation

of a strategic management plan (SMP).

"The SMP will guide our library services over the next three years and we're aiming to present this to Council in August 2018 for approval."

Have your say on the future of libraries

To develop the SMP, council will speak with staff, library users, the broader community and other stakeholders

This process has commenced through community focus groups and a survey will be available online before the end of March.


