EDITORIAL

THE STORY OF GALLIPOLI

England, France and Russia were allies in WWI and they wanted a sea route from the Mediterranean to southern Russia. The route lay via the Dardanelles strait into the sea of Marmara top the Black sea and across it to the Crimea. They sent a small naval expeditionary force to the Dardanelles coast to secure a beach head. The plan was to push on from there to Constantinople (Istanbul), which was then part of the Ottoman Empire. The initial assault failed due to the terrain and fierce fighting by the Turks. By the time a larger force had arrived, the element of surprise was lost and the Allies faced a much larger force of Turks. The Allies were pinned to the coast while the Turks held the higher ground. The Allied troops dug in for the long haul.

After nine months of fighting, the Allies had lost 70,000 men and the Turks had lost 60.000. More than half the deaths in WWI were due to sickness and disease and Gallipoli was no exception. The winters there were very cold and wet and some died in the trenches from drowning. The summers were really hot and the smell at times

unbearable. Corpses lay everywhere and many soldiers suffered from dysentery as well. Of the 70,000 Allies that died, about 11,000 were from Australia and New Zealand. With no prospect of success the Allies withdrew after nine months of carnage.

The reasons for the failure of the campaign were many. The majority of Allied troops were needed to fight the Germans on the Western front, so initially the force

sent was far too small. They also underestimated the fighting abilities of the Turks and they were not equipped to handle either the weather conditions or the medical needs of the troops, both the wounded and the sick.

Faced with either a stalemate or defeat. morale fell. So why is this failed campaign so much the focus of our remembrance down under? We lost many more troops on the Western front and spear-headed great victories there like the liberation of Villers-Bretonneux. And our allies lost many more troops at Gallipoli than Australia and NZ combined. Another strange thing is this; the campaign has forged a brotherly bond between our peoples and the people of Turkey. Just a few of life's many mysteries.

Our guest speaker will be Sam Luke, a fruit tree specialist and manager of Balhannah Nurseries, supplier of Plant Net fruit and ornamental trees to SA garden centres

Our meeting on March 16 was well attended to hear the wisdom and experience of Merilyn Kuchel, a passionate gardener who is a member of the Mediterranean Plant Society.

Surprisingly we were told that only 2% of the World's land mass has a truly Mediterranean climate - generally on West facing shores of most continents. It is in these regions that we find plants that have adapted to hot

dry Summers and cool damp Winters, often with grey, hairy or furry, and sometimes narrow, leaves. There is of course the succulents which have developed moisture storage in their leaves and sometimes their roots.

To establish a Mediterranean garden we should look to these plants especially our native species which do need trimming to keep a more structured shape if that is what you want. Merilyn showed us many excellent photos illustrating examples of the above-mentioned plants from her World travels.

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUG-GESTIONS FOR MAY

This is your last chance to plant bulbs such as Ranuculas, Anemone, Daffodils and Jonquil, they really should be in the ground by the time you read this. Wallflowers make a wonderful show as well as Iceland Poppies and Snapdragons, so try a few punnets in a spot near the front of your garden that will receive some winter sun.

In the veggie patch Broccoli Cabbage and Cauliflower can still be planted into well prepared soil, and now is the time for those Rhubarb crowns to go in to the plot you prepared last month!

Three members from the Blackwood Action Group were guests at our April meeting where they showed examples of the wonderful work they have done in Blackwood, such as the flower boxes and gardens in front of the Post Office and around the main roads, Waite Road, railway stations; historical displays; and the red bows at Xmas-time. OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners! Firstly, we will have had welcome rain by now, tanks filling and paddocks greening up – with both pasture and weeds!

Early autumn is a great time for getting a soil test done and then if need be, following that up with the appropriate additions, fertilizer etc. Also getting stuck into broadleaf weeds while they are little flowerets will be most efficient too.

Back to work in hand. If you have done your homework well, your horse will lead alongside you lightly and at the same speed as yourself. This is called 'self-carriage' and eventually hopefully will mirror what happens under saddle. When under saddle this means that we are not 'holding' our horse in a frame, but that he will maintain his line, speed and rhythm when you release the reins for a step or two. This can be either rein (tests straightness), or both reins (tests speed and rhythm). When going in hand, he should also keep the same rhythm as yourself ie. Walk at your speed, not lag behind or faster than yourself (see last article). When he is doing that reliably,



you can test how good he is by walking a bit slower (check that he does too) and then walking a bit faster/longer. Of course this is what we are aiming for. Some horses will pick it up quickly; others will need a little more time. If he is barging into your space, use your right hand to turn him away from you and take another few steps. This may take several repetitions until he gets the idea.

Now I am assuming you will have been doing all this in a quiet and safe environment. This optimises your chances of keeping his attention. When you feel that he is responding quickly and lightly to your signals, try either moving to a different part of your arena or


work area, or even an adjacent paddock if safe, and repeating those exercises. Horses are extremely 'place specific', ie. They will quickly learn that canter is in a certain corner, or that you dismount in a certain spot etc. So it is good to slowly start to generalise their responses to different areas/ situations. Optimally, it is best to only introduce one variable at a time; otherwise the horse can be overwhelmed by too many changes. Sometimes, life being what it is, more than one variable becomes involved. And sometimes everything all falls apart, or you may find that the horses copes. If it all falls apart, you just need to go back to the original work area and recheck all his first responses and again slowly reintroduce variables.

Of course, when yours truly was being broken in, my owners thought I had already read the book I was so well behaved, but most times this is not the case. Best to not put a time limit on things as the horse will let you know how fast he wants to go. Be patient and you will reap the rewards.

CFS NEWS

We've had a touch of cool weather



With the approach of winter you would have already thought about preparing for the roaring fires that will be keeping you warm and the condition of your roof plumbing during the expected rain squalls.

Having your chimney or flue cleaned out will ensure that you are less likely to suffer a chimney or flue fire, which can be catastrophic for home-owners, as they tend to start in the roof space, where you may not see it until it is much too late. Chimney and flue fires are usually caused by the build-up of

residues on the inside of the chimney breast or flue pipe from the burning of not fully cured (green) timber and also from incomplete combustion when the flue damper on the fire is turned down very low. This build-up can then restrict the opening and with enough heat applied from a 'hotter' fire can ignite and burn unseen in the chimney or flue. When one gets going it sounds very much like a jet engine as it draws air in rapidly and flue pipes can begin to glow red hot. Chimneys will rattle and shake and flue pipes will bang and jitter, with black sooty material raining down, along with the jet engine roar sound effects. If you've turned down the fire for the night and gone to bed, you may not realise what's going on until too late. A simple clean will reduce your risk and give you a cleaner warmer fire through winter.

Same goes for your gutters and down pipes. Cleaning them now will save you the grief of dealing with overflowing gutters and water spewing from clogged down pipes, with the overflow rushing in under doors or flowing back under the eaves and down in over internal walls.

It's also a good time to book the car in for a regular pre-winter service and check; tyres, brakes, wind-screen wiper rubbers, lights and indicators, mirrors, heaters and vents.

All of our CFS training schedules are now moving over to prepare for the changing weather conditions.

Since the Sampson Flat fire we have been fortunate and had an influx of new members and have added another 6 people to the Cherry Gardens CFS. We are now an even stronger and better trained Brigade with a group of new and enthusiastic recruits bringing a further sense of commitment to the membership.

Stay warm and stay safe.

FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK

Reptiles have been on the receiving end of adverse publicity for time immemorial. This is the time of year when there is always an opportunity to continue this fine tradition.

Yet, for all the publicity, relatively little is known about many of Australia's snakes and lizards and some are still to be formally identified, despite having being discovered some time ago. Here in the Cherry Gardens region you will no doubt be pleased to know there is an interesting cross-section of reptiles from small skinks to quite large snakes. The Common Brown along with the Red-bellied Black Snake are the largest seen here and can grow to 2-2.5 metres. An interesting evolutionary divergence sees the Brown Snake laying eggs whilst the Black gives birth to live young from eggs hatched within the body. Blacks' are more commonly seen along watercourses or close to dams or swamps where they pre-date upon frogs, lizards, small mammals (children excepted) and other snakes. Browns' eat mainly small lizards and frogs and also help keep mice numbers down.

The water loving Golden Water Skink can be seen, if approached quietly and slowly, sunning itself along watercourses such as Scott Creek. This very handsome lizard can grow to 30cm in length and feeds on worms, tadpoles, frogs and insects. Both the Blue Tongue and Shingleback (Stumpy) are members of the Skink family although neither are abundant here with habitat fragmentation and so many roads to cross. Several other skink species are found around here, the most common being the garden skink that is abundant around gardens living in stone walls feeding on flies, moths and small insects. The small but beautiful Marbled Gecko is nocturnal often living close to a night light making for an easy life of take home moths. They tend to sleep away the winter and both they and the skinks lay eggs under rocks or in little crevices. Bearded Dragons are less common but are certainly around occasionally being seen on roads risking life for a sunning. Perhaps, like the

once fairly common Heath Goanna, it too has become a victim of shrinking habitat and the "island effect". This lizard is now rated as Endangered but was once locally common, They are very occasionally seen in Mt Bold but it's been about twenty years since one was seen in Scott Creek Con Park..

This is where you come in; The Dept. of Environment is trying to get a better idea of numbers left and locations so if you are lucky enough to see one please record where and when and if possible get a photo. You can report your finding to DEWNRThreatened Wildlife.sa.gov.au at this site there is also a downloadable fact sheet which is very informative. You can also phone the local Natural Resource Centre on 82739100.

Reptiles have adapted to a vast range of habitats and conditions and play an important role in the natural world by helping maintain the "fittest survive", balance in their environments.

The last thing a snake wants to do is spoil your day so if you do see one, just let it quietly disappear as it will be very unlikely you will see it again. If it is too close to your house for comfort then a snake catcher is the way to go.

Equine Dentistry

We would like to bust a common myth that a number of horse owners associate with Equine Dentistry! The myth is sedation is only for badly behaved horses or veterinary practitioners who can't handle horses. Sedation allows for a thorough examination involving touch and sight. This helps identify any prob-



lems early for easiest treatment and management. Sedation also allows for equipment such as a light, power float and mirrors to be used, and also reduces stress on the horse as well as its handlers! Another thing to consider is that the worse the pathology in the mouth the more an un-sedated horse plays up and reacts to the pain, and he/she is the one that needs a thorough job the most. Only vets can legally sedate a horse and have the insurance to do so. So please remember it is sedation that allows for a complete and thorough examination and a thorough job to be done!

Chocolate is toxic to pets

For sweet lovers, chocolate is an indulgence that can result in a few extra inches on the hips. However, even a small amount of chocolate to some cats and dogs can be devastating. As well as a high fat content, chocolate contains caffeine and theobromine. These two stimulates, affect the central nervous system and the heart muscle, as well as urination frequency.

How long will it take before my pet shows signs of chocolate poisoning? Between 30 minutes to 3 hours.

What signs do I look out for?

If your 20kg dog gets his/her paws on a single chocolate-chip cookie, it probably won't cause him/her serious problems. However, if he/she gobbles up enough of your favourite chocolate treats he/she may develop symptoms such as:-

- vomiting
- diarrhoea
- increased urination
- restlessness
- hyperactivity
- muscle twitching
- in severe cases or where left untreated seizures.

What should I do if I suspect poisoning?

The sooner you seek help the better off your pet will be. Seek veterinarian attention immediately




