EDITORIAL

Lance Corporal Herbert Clarence Burford

y five year old started asking questions after ANZAC Day last year."Was your Great Grandpa a soldier"? I took the opportunity to explain who my Great Grandfather was. I was only very young when he passed away, a lot of my memories are tales told by his children and grandchildren, and I now pass these tales on to his Great Grandchildren. Prior to PaPa, as we called him enlisting, Herbert Clarence Burford was a runner with the Adelaide Harriers. For a little bloke he held his own on the track, being quite the sprinter. This was probably of great assistance when dodging enemy fire and shrapnel.

Today as I gathered, chopped and stacked wood for the oncoming Cherry Gardens winter. I was taken back to tasks my Great Grandfather had done as a supply officer at Gallipoli, one of his several tasks whilst on board the SS Derfflinger prior to landing at the cove, was to stack and bundle wood to keep the troops warm.

Enlisting on September 12th 1914 in Adelaide, he then transferred to his unit one month later. Departing for Melbourne on the 22nd of November he then embarked on the HMAT Berrima leaving Melbourne three days before Christmas 1914. Aged 22, Lance Corporal Herbert Clarence Burford of the 1st Depot unit of Supply, in the 11th Australian Army Supply Corp. was off to war!

I have the great privilege of looking after my Maternal Great Grandfathers



war diaries. Anzac Day has always stirred emotion within me particularly when I found a quiet place to read them. The handwritten cursive, in both fountain pen ink, and carefully etched lead pencil stencilled with great care and attention. Written whilst sitting in a muddy dug out; shrapnel and artillery fire surrounding him like a swarm

of angry bees conjures graphic images in my mind that terrify me; yet make me incredibly proud of my Great Grandfather, and all those whom have fought for our freedom.

Some of his diary writings: Saturday 24th April 1915

Left Lemnos Island. We went out of the harbour early passing a fleet of transports and warships, about 100 or more. Sailed around the coast and dropped anchor in a small bay with 2 other steamers. Strictest silence - no lights. Cruisers are flitting about without lights. Infantry have tried to sleep for 4 hours. They go into action in the morning. Everyone is looking forward to tomorrow.

EDITORIAL - contd from pl

Sunday 25th April 1915

Bombardment - Under Fire 1st Day
Woke to the sounds of the bombardment. Rigs firing all around. Infantry 3rd
Brigade went ashore. Heard they had a
bayonet charge as soon as they landed.
Saw 3 dead and about 12 wounded.
Warships are letting them have it to our
left and front. One shell landed pretty
close. Bombardment is awful. Later, shells
dropping around us from Turkish batteries. We moved off very slowly, to us, and
anchored in a bay. Head aching through
the noise. Had a concert in the evening to
try and liven us up — very tame.



Monday 26th April 1915 2nd Day

Woke to the Boom. Had a good sleep. We moved off and have anchored just where we were yesterday. The warships were giving the Hills a terrible bombardment. We may land today. Looks alright, I don't feel a bit queer although yesterday a shell went between 2 troopships about 200 yards away and it seemed goodbye. Steamed away to an island for the night.

Tuesday 27th April 1915

Bombardment Turkey, Dardanelles 3rd Day. We have landed under hot fire, things are lively. Working for the Base Depot under shrapnel fire — lively. A lot of wounded coming down. I Oth Battalion badly cut up also the 3rd Brigade. Have landed 2 barges of stores. Slept in the open about 5 yards from the sea under cover of a stack of ammunition. Risky but better than nothing.

Wednesday 19th May 1915

Heavy machine gun fire and rifle fire all night, about the heaviest I have heard. Heavy and fierce bombardment at sunrise this morning. Expect this is a last effort. A Red Cross unit has just left with about 40 wounded aboard. Shrapnel is falling around pretty thickly this morning. In fact we have had a couple very close as I write. Two heavy shells falling about 100 yards away. I feel pretty rotten, the screeching sound of the shells has got on my nerves. Bombardment lasted till

10.30am. Dressing station blown up. South Depot Blown up, bar a few stacks.

Thursday 20th May 1915



Bad shrapnel. South depot received a bad time. 8Th & 9th Lt Horse arrived tonight, 4,5,6,7 arrived today all look well. We were up at 2.30 am to unload a barge and they had to stand by in full fighting order from 6 till 10.30 pm making a very heavy day ordered to be ready at a moment's notice, expect prisoners tonight. Heard they had an armistice for 6 hours to bury their dead but they started to collect rifles instead.

Friday 21st May 1915

Shrapnel fire. White flag flying on point and a Turkish Major came in under flag of truce. Very nice uniform and good looking. Camp packed up and had to remove stores while in the water. Turk was taken back at nightfall. 8th &9th Light Horse came through today. Saw a lot I knew, Barker, Barrett, Robins, a lot more. Things are very quiet up in the firing line. Saw a submarine today.

Armistice Monday May 24th 1915
Trip to the island is off. Raining and very muddy this morning. Saw a party go out to bury the dead this morning. Armistice all day. 3000 Turks buried. Holloway came to dinner today. Very downhearted but looks well. Sent a mail away to home and Marge. 2 prisoners gave themselves up. Firing started straight away as soon as the armistice was over. Rather fierce rifle fire during the night.

Wednesday May 26th 1915

HMS Triumph was torpedoed about two miles away on our right this morning. We saw the boat keel over and gradually sink. All steam boats rushed to the rescue and a fleet of torpedo boats came in from Point Helles at full speed, making an imposing sight. A few shots were fired but I don't think they caught the sub. We have no warships here now except the torpedo boat. 4th reinforcements arrived this afternoon under shrapnel fire. A couple

killed and a few wounded. Saw an aeroplane drop bombs on the Turks today.

Saturday June 5th 1915 Cape Helles

Weather perfect, found out I was still alive on looking at my shirt heavy rifle fire last night. Corp Bond found on hill, very ill, brought him to my dug out and stayed there all day. Only one charge today and very quiet, although heavy fighting on the left flank and a trench was taken.

Monday August 16th 1915

Sent mail home. Put in charge of sand bags on the beach. Went for a swim and just had time to dive under the pier when a shrapnel burst; killing I and wounding 3 just 5 yards from me. Wescott was very white when I came back up, he thought I was gone. I received two splinters of steel, one in the toe and one in the hand and very small scratches. Had hardly a wink of sleep.

My Great grandfather departed Gallipoli December 13th 1915 to go on to Egypt, then Marseilles and Rouen in France. Papa returned to Australia 8th November 1918 home after the war with all limbs intact and with a lease on life that only surviving the atrocity of war could provide. He was lucky! Nothing I could tell my daughter could ever convey the reality, conditions, fear, and desperation, those brave soldiers and personnel endured through the years. I hope she will never have to find out.

I am so grateful to all these brave AN-ZACS and all those who have served, allowing me the opportunity to have my daughter ask me the question.

At our March meeting we enjoyed a very well researched presentation by Eileen Hardy "Friend" of Wittunga Botanic Gardens including photos from "Trove"- among other internet resources. We gained a most interesting insight into the Ashby family and their very hard and comprehensive work in establishing the 14.5 hectare beginnings of the lovely gardens now devoted to wildflowers of Australia and South Africa, which we enjoy today. From 1925 they planted an amazing variety of Apples, Pears, and many other pome and stone fruit, which flourished on virgin land around Shepherds Hill Road at Blackwood - thanks to their hard work and abundant borehole water delivery, until growing population of the area rendered the water insufficient to sustain orchards. Leaving the farm, orchard and garden work to his family, which often included his sisters visiting from England, Keith Ashby travelled by motor car in the 1920's, often alone, as far afield as Western Australia, collecting native plant specimens and publishing and illustrating many books on the subject. He also collected specimens in South Africa establishing that section of Wittunga gardens. We were left appreciating the generous and valuable gift Keith Ashby donated for the enjoyment of the people of South Australia.

Once again some rare and unusual plants and produce as well as great bargains were later auctioned amidst lively hilarity. This was followed by a delicious and sociable supper.

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS

Plant Broccoli, Cabbage, Lettuce and White Onion seedlings. Sow Peas and Broad Beans. plant out crowns of Rhubarb - you can divide your own if you have a crowded plant.

If you have mushrooms appearing in your garden or paddock - don't be tempted as they could give you a very upset stomach or worse. Just because someone else has tried them without any reaction does not mean they will be OK for you!

Divide and plant Agapanthus, Crinums, Day Lilies, and Liliums. Sow Marigolds under wet newspaper as they need complete darkness to germinate. Plant out Pansies, Poppies, and Polyanthus. Remove diseased (black spot) leaves from your Roses and bin them to discourage problems next year.

Cherry Gardens was first settled in 1838, shortly after the colony of South Australia was founded. Cherry Gardens was a farming community until quite recently and has a rich history. At this Spotlight on the history of Cherry Gardens evening you will hear recollections from some residents recorded 20 years ago and information about the Alamanda Silver Mine and other interesting snippets about our districts history.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Hopefully Autumn chores are on the way - paddock conditions as in weed control and maybe slashing where there is any long rank grass. Horses tend not to graze on this material and so it grows even longer. After slashing, the debris will just add to mulch in the paddock and promote better new season's growth. Check for wear and tear on rugs, repair or replace. If your steed is lucky enough to have a shelter/stable, check for spider webs and 'critter' nooks and crannies and clear up. Stables can be quite dusty areas, with bits of sawdust and hay collecting in corners where there are cobwebs. Cobwebs can be quite flammable, so best to clear them away at this time of year.

Many of you will have purchased a horse at some time or another. How many times has it happened that after a week or even a month or so that odd bits of behaviour have begun to appear? The supposedly quiet horse that you viewed has become quite a different creature. When looking to purchase there are a few things which help to lessen the chance of finishing up with the wrong horse in your paddock. Firstly, you need to be very clear in your own mind what it is exactly that you want in a horse. Certain breeds are better suited to certain activities. If it is your first horse then things like cost of keeping, buying the right gear and fitting thereof, the impact on your family life, the amount of time available (especially in winter), where you are going to keep it, allowing for veterinary costs, shoeing or trimming,




worming, rugging and so on, to mention a few. Once these are reasonably sorted and you have found something to view and have spoken to the vendor, make sure you take someone with you who is more knowledgeable than yourself - two heads are definitely better than one here! This person can also video the prospective horse and you can review it later together. Ensure that there will be somewhere safe for the horse to be shown. 'Just down the road' is not good enough and not at all safe. It can help to arrive a little early, or at least ensure that you can see the horse caught, groomed, feet picked up and saddled. You will probably see at this time how well the horse ties up. Take a good look at the condition, especially the state of the feet. The state of the property can also be guide to the attitude of the owners too, as in fencing, rubbish lying around, condition of the other horses etc. Make sure that the owner rides the horse first for you in all paces. Is it ridden in a simple snaffle or wearing all sorts of hardwear? Does it stand still for mounting and can the owner ride the horse on the buckle

in all paces (no contact). Your knowledgeable friend may then ride and give you an assessment and then have a ride yourself if safe - if not, walk away! Other things you would expect in a reliable mount would be that it will load willingly on to a float (you can ask for a demo), can be lunged quietly (again you can ask for a demo of this too). It is not recommended that the horse would weave, crib bite, wind suck, buck, bolt or shy. Ask about these things, because the vendor will often only tell you what you ask or what he/she thinks you want to hear. Depending on your intended activity, check whether the horse is reliable in traffic, can be ridden alone and in company, behind and in front and any other personality quirks. Ask what the worst thing that the horse does. If possible ask for a trial, taking into account that there risks on both sides and some owners will not want to risk their horse leaving the property until sold. Or you could come back for a second or even third ride. Do not be pressured into buying just because there is 'someone' coming later that afternoon. You have no way of confirming this and it could be a ploy to force you into making a wrong decision. If the horse gets sold, so be it. There will always be another one out there! Finally, an added expense, but one which can save you many dollars and heartache later, consider a vet check. Preferably use a vet which does not normally treat that particular horse. These are just a few suggestions, the list is very long, but hopefully I have covered a few bases for you.....

CHURCH NEWS



It was a juvenile Swamp Harrier that had just left the nest. An x-Ray showed no breaks but a badly bruised shoulder. It had been placed into our 30' long raptor flight facility with its wing strapped for support and in two weeks that will be removed and we will see if he can fly again, then work out how to get him back to the Cooper Basin!!??




Numbers are high, with many new faces at the club, and we look forward to a great season.

This year, South Australia's oldest and best loved national park is celebrating its 125th anniversary, and everyone is invited.

When Belair was dedicated as a National Park on December 19, 1891 it became only the second such park in Australia and followed the establishment in 1879 of the Royal National Park near Sydney.

The cool glades and fresh water streams at Belair, so close to Adelaide, made it a popular picnic spot, and early photographs depict park visitors dressed in their Sunday best, sporting top hats and hoop dresses enjoying large-group picnics.

Belair still retains much of its early history, with Old Government House and the heritage gardens attracting many visitors to the Sunday and public holiday tours.

Celebrations will continue throughout 2016 and include Grey Box Day (May I – seedlings to take home, plus walks and rides with rangers), guided walks (April-October), SA History Festival (throughout May), Nature Play's Cubby Town (July 21 and 22), Open Day (September 11) and other events. 
