## WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU GROW MORE PRODUCE THAN YOU CAN EAT?

## WELL, GIVE IT AWAY OF COURSE!

as anyone noticed the GROW FREE cart set up at 592 Cherry Gardens Road, near the sharp bend driving away from the Golf Club entrance towards Aberfoyle Park?

It is a project started by Andrew Barker, from Victoria, Australia! This project was started with Andrew's vision of a community where locally grown food is shared with one another... for free!

This project involves setting up carts around the city and offering any kind of food, but generally locally grown produce, to anyone who might need it, or just want it. Not everyone grows the same crops, so it's a good opportunity for neighbours to share the fruits of their labour with one another, and with those who don't have the means to have their own gardens.

As Andrew says: "The carts are a medium where people of the community can share with one another, they're for excess home-grown produce, seeds and seedlings, preserves, eggs, etc.

They're a great way for people to give back, to show that they care about others and this community. Being that we don't really get to see who picks up what we put down on them, there's also a spiritual element to them; a way to serve the community without need for reciprocation or acknowledgement."

Earlier in 2016 there were only four carts and now there are 13 carts all around the region. Andrew believes that before long there will be at least one cart in every town in Southern Australia and hopefully as this idea spreads, all around the world.

The Grow Free community group also gives out free heirloom seedlings for veggies, herbs, and flowers, which help others to set up and start their own gardens, hold free workshops, and even cook for those in need at the local Salvation Army.

Andrew's passion for organic, locally grown produce comes from when he worked on a farm, and what they ate was what they grew. He says: "A big light bulb moment for me was living

on this farm, which we didn't really leave for a long time, and when I went into a supermarket the food there appeared nutritionally deficient and sterile. There's a big difference in how it (organic food) tastes and how it makes you feel." This Is About More Than Just Free Food

Of course giving out free food and services to others is a tremendous act of kindness, generosity, and compassion, but as Andrew says, this project is about more than just free food. It's about living closer to the truth and the idea of oneness and treating others as ourselves.

This project has a spiritual element to it: it assists all those involved with finding divine union with spirit by relinquishing their own desires and needs, and putting "others" first.

This project is creating the type of culture that we want to live in, by-passing that which is going wrong and focusing on giving what we can. Evolving from the old ways of thinking, not needing to protest or oppose anything, just start creating the new, and making the change yourself. This project is about BEING the change you wish to see.

Consider Starting Grow Free Carts In Your Community!

Do you have a garden full of produce? If you do, chances are you aren't able to eat and even give away all of it to your friends and family, so why not make it available to anyone who needs it? You can contact your local health food stores and find out if you can put a cart there for free produce, seeds, and anything else you would like to contribute.

The amazing thing you'll see is that over time, other people will begin to anonymously donate food as well, and then more and more carts will

start to pop up. This is similar to the Little Free Library project, where anyone can set up a little shelf or box with free books. People passing by are free to take a book or leave a book if they wish. This is an ongoing book exchange and no one is expecting anything in return. It is just happening because people inherently want to give and share information with one another.

There are so many people doing great acts of kindness in the word that go unnoticed. Share this story to spread the positivity, show people that the world isn't all-bad and share the love! For more information consider joining the GROW FREE Facebook page.

## George's gardening suggestions for May 2017

If you have any mummified fruit remaining on your stone-fruit trees, remove and bin them as they can pass on brown-rot disease through winter. Don't forget Mum on Mother's Day a living gift will last, such as a Hydrangea, Rose or a potted Cyclamen.

Strawberries can be planted now so they have time to establish by Spring, If you already have a patch they may need some attention,- dig out old plants (more than 3yrs) get rid of weeds and only plant healthy runners into a new area.

Spray Peach and Nectarine trees with a copper based fungicide on a calm day when rain is not forecast, avoid spray on the ground as earthworms

don't like it. Try to spray at least twice before buds open.

Brassicas enjoy plentiful nutrients so dig in as much manure as you can or if they are in the ground already apply liquid feed once a fortnight.

Poppies make a wonderful show through Winter and Spring so why not try some this year?



## **OVER THE STABLE DOOR**

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

In recent months some of my equine friends have been fitted for new/different saddles. It appears that this area is quite a minefield, particularly when the horse doesn't quite fit the 'normal' mould. Gone are the days when a saddle with a narrow gullet would 'do' for a thoroughbred and a wider fitting would do just about anything from a pony to a quarter horse. There are many types on the market with adjustable gullets and these are extremely useful, particularly the synthetic styles. These are great for children as they are low maintenance and very manageable for a small person to lug around (also lighter for the horse!). When in a situation where the off the rack saddle doesn't fit, there are qualified saddle fitters who can also do the job. Best thing to do is to shop around, talk your other horsey friends before committing to a particular saddle. This can become a very expensive exercise! Every horse is an individual and fitting a saddle is like fitting a shoe to a human - if it isn't right, it is going to pinch and nip in all the wrong places. Some horses seem to adapt to discomfort, but others will have quite a strong reaction,



even to the extent of bucking the rider off. A badly fitting saddle can cause long term soreness, which is not good for your horse or yourself as it cuts into riding time. Some simple basics to consider when placing a saddle on your horse are do it without a saddle cloth, place centrally (from side to side), behind the shoulder (in line where the girth would go). Too far forward and this can cause restriction of movement at the shoulder. At the wither there should be 4 fingers clearance through the gullet. Looking from behind, the saddle should not be sitting on any part of the horse's spine. There should be sufficient support at the rear (under the cantle) so that the saddle doesn't 'rock' - this will cause pinching across the withers especially in rising trot. Looking side-on, the seat should be the deepest part of the saddle, with the pommel and cantle

roughly level. Generally, the cantle should never be higher than the pommel, but you can have it the other way around. Ideally you should be able to ride in the saddle to really give it a test drive. Independent advice should be the most helpful. Take your time and really look around, do your homework. Also consider what you want the saddle for. A dressage or straight type saddle will suit most flat riding and dressage work. More forward cut saddles are suitable for faster work and there are purpose designed ones for show jumping, racing etc. Then there are western saddles, of which there are any number of designs, depending on your type of activity. If you are new to a discipline, then be guided by someone knowledgeable in that field. This could save you much time and expense. As with any enterprise, do your homework, shop around, and get the best opinions you can. This should help to make the most informed decision. Good luck!

## from p 2 - GARDEN CLUB

e all enjoy the benefits our gardens bring us and love to learn more about plants, and soils which produce the best plants in our local climates. We also enjoy the spectacle when beautiful birds find our gardens, trees and plants enticing enough to come and feast in them. It would be great to know we had plants and trees which provide the sustenance to entice precious birds, to visit and spend longer periods in our gardens. Most of us would get a real kick if we could be involved in knowledgably and effectively providing food for beautiful birds who, are at risk of disappearing because their food sources have disappeared.

Last month Cherry Gardens Garden Club had a very interesting pair of speakers on different subjects to our usual topics. Two young researchers stepped in at the last moment to replace Associate Professor David Paton, when he was unable to be with us, sharing their Power Point presentations of the work they are doing to assist in remedying the decline in bird numbers, caused by diminishing food sources, due to habitat destruction.

Hayley Merigot's graphs depicted the amazing variances in the beginning, ending as well as the varying lengths of the actual flowering seasons of individual Eucalypts. Hayley hopes to prove the need, when collecting seed for regeneration projects, to do so from as many different individual trees as possible, so ensuring the longest possible availability of nectar and flowers for birds.

Grace Hodder related her findings of the demographics of Diamond Firetail Finches which have retreated to areas away from the Mt. Lofty Ranges where they were once plentiful. In some areas she is supplementing the diets of birds and monitoring the resulting changes of population numbers. Checks of the food in crops show what they are eating when their normal diet is no longer available, because their natural diet of native grasses, has been wiped out. Her findings aim to assist in highlighting the correlation between reducing bird numbers and habitat destruction as well as establishing the most effective ways to restore habitat, which as nearly as possible resemble the natural environment or if not possible, replaces it with suitable alternatives.

Grace is trialling supplementing their natural diet, or if necessary replacing it with other, more hardy seed bearing plants, such as the Sheoak tree thus ensuring their continued survival in South Australia.

When is a plant a weed? Part 2

Last month we looked at some information about weeds, why they might be a problem and where

they might be introduced to South Australia.

The SA Weed Risk Management Guide, February 2008, is used to determine the weed potential of plants in different land use settings (e.g. cropping, forestry, horticulture and native vegetation). The assessment looks at the invasiveness of the plant, the economic, environmental and social impacts the plant may have, and its potential distribution, that is, where suitable environmental conditions may enable it to spread into. The feasibility of containment is also looked at. This examines the cost of control measures, the current distribution of the plant and how widespread it is, and its persistence and how long control works would need to continue.

The assessment guides the appropriate strategic weed management actions, from limited action where the weed risk and feasibility of containment are both low, to eradication where a plant presents a very high risk but there is also a very high feasibility of containment. Other actions, in descending order of intervention, include destroy infestations, contain spread, protect sites, manage sites and monitor. There will often be a different management action in different land use settings.

Pest plants that are assessed as a significant threat to agriculture, the natural environment and public health and safety may be declared under the Natural Resources Management (NRM) Act 2004. The Act sets out the legal framework for controlling these plants, including banning their sale, controlling their movement within the state, destroying or controlling infestations and notifying authorities when an infestation is found.

Landowners have a legal responsibility to manage declared plants. South Australia's eight regional Natural Resources Management Boards coordinate and enforce local and regional control programs for declared plants. Declarations of plants (including local requirements for control) vary between and within NRM regions. Priority species for regional control programs also vary depending on the threats a weed poses in particular localities, whether it is a new invader or widespread, how easy it is to control and the time of year.

Some declared plants are not already

established in SA, but pose a serious threat and are referred to as alert weeds. Early detection of these weeds is important so that they can be destroyed before they become a problem. Landowners must report alert weeds found on their property to their local Natural Resources Centre (see website below).

There are also some plants that have proven social, economic and environmental impacts that require national action to manage. These are Australia's most invasive plants and are known as Weeds of

National Significance (WoNS). There are national programs and strategies for each WoNS. Lists of declared plants, including alert weeds and WoNS, can be found on the PIRSA (Primary Industries and Regions SA website (http://www.pir.sa.gov.au/biosecurity/weeds\_and\_pest\_animals). This also provides other information about the declaration of plants, weed identification notes, and a downloadable Weed Control Handbook for

Declared Plants in SA. Further information is available on the NR AMLR (Natural Resources Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges) (www.naturalresources.sa.gov.au/adelaidemtloftyranges/) website.

Next month we will look at how to go about managing weed problems in native vegetation.

## Help save threatened plant species in SA

Community members are being asked to help Trees For Life care for and monitor five threatened plant species from Goolwa and Monarto. All but one of the species being targeted only occur in South Australia.

Under the new project - Community Action For Threatened Flora – volunteers will be trained in specific monitoring methods and data collection for the threatened populations.

"We are trialling a new on-line data collection method," explains Bush For Life Manager Amelia Hurren. "This will make our monitoring more efficient and gives us the chance to use new technologies in the field". Bushcare activities to remove competition from weeds will also be part of the project.

The five species being targeted are: Acacia pinguifolia (Fat-leaf Wattle) – Only two populations known in SA, one near Finniss and the other southern Eyre Peninsula. Classified as 'extremely restricted'.

Acacia menzelii (Menzel's Wattle) – Rated nationally vulnerable. Approximately 5600 individual plants known to remain in the SA Murray-Darling Basin region.

Prostanthera eurybioides (Monarto Mintbush) – Rated endangered under Commonwealth legislation. Only SA populations known are in the Monarto area near Murray Bridge and near Keith.

Olearia pannosa ssp. pannosa (Silver Daisy-Bush) – Listed as nationally vulnerable. Approximately only 1000

individual plants remaining in the SA Murray-Darling Basin region.

Acacia rhetinocarpa (Resin Wattle) – Listed as nationally vulnerable. Only around 2800 individual plants remaining in the SA Murray-Darling Basin region.

etween the months of September 2016 through to the end of March 2017 Dthe most common animals admitted to the Rescue Centre have been Ringtail possums, Pacific Black Ducks, magpies and Rainbow Lorikeets. Many were victims of predation primarily by cats and dogs. This week we had a Sulphur crested cockatoo admitted with puncture wounds to its chest and wing. It had been caught by a Wedge-tail eagle and dropped after it struggled free but was unable to take flight again. Being a young bird it was easy pickings for the large bird of prey! It is however doing very well and recovering gradually. We have released many kookaburras, tawny frogmouths and Nankeen Kestrels this year from our straight flights. We are excited about the new project and gradually working on funds toward the building of a round flight this year to facilitate wing strengthening of these birds before release. The old flight that the Lions Club built 30 years ago has rusted away and needs to be replaced in the same location. The MyGivingCircle competition was well supported and Minton Farm won second place in Australia's favourite animal charity, receiving \$1,000 toward the flight project plus another \$1,000 in donations. Thank you sincerely to all who voted, shared and donated toward this fund raiser.
