CC - 10 YEARS AGO

We then had to negotiate with local printers and this then resulted in us increasing the advertising rates and we eventually secured an annual Grant from the council. In other news the rainfall for winter 10 years ago was well in excess of the average (just as it is this year). The Hall was busy with Yoga, Table Tennis, Quilting Club and Garden Club keeping the Hall in constant use each week. There was the Babysitting Club where locals helped locals so we all had a night off each month. There are a few names that are no longer living here including Kaye Baxter, the Tippet's, The Thomas's and more recently the Gaughwin's.



OVER THE STABLE DOOR - with Hamish

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!Plenty of rain has fallen since I last spoke to you. Paddocks all green and the grass starting to thicken up.

If there are some broadleaf such as capeweed and jane that you have missed, they can be hand pulled quite easily now. Other alternatives may be to slash or cross-graze with sheep and cows (neighbours may come in handy here). One pesky weed in the hills is dock, which will grow in poor soil, deficient in iron. It is devilish hard to pull out, except in the wettest areas. Each plant will produce literally thousands of seeds, so if you haven't got around to spraying it, you may be able to pull it, or otherwise at least cut off the main stalk which produces the seeds It can help to take an old chaff bag (or two!), or something similar with you into the paddock to collect this stuff. That's the thing, our paddocks don't just look after themselves, they do need to be maintained. The hard work actually does pay off, although it

is never a quick fix. Those who have made the effort will tell you that it is all worth it. It can even get to the stage of light maintenance, but one can never be complacent. It helps to have a five year plan, since these things tend to take some time.

Having a five year plan also gives you some flexibility with time, money and family commitments. Sitting down and drawing up goals, prioritising areas needing work, what sort of work and how much money needed to achieve those goals. For example, it may be that fencing needs replacing. This sort of goal needs money, but can be done in a relatively short time. If you are changing fencing, it may pay to take a good look at the terrain on your property.

There may be areas which are unsafe/ unproductive for livestock. These can be fenced off and revegetated with shade trees and valuable understory for birdlife. That one exercise could be your first year goal. While you are at it, keep a record of money spent and what on. If your property seems to have too many problems, there are plenty of courses to do which will be of enormous help. Things like weed and pasture management, property planning and so on. Contacting Natural Resources Adelaide and Mt. Lofty Ranges will be able to pass on most information to the confused landholder. They offer free workshops and free field days. There is a Natural Resource office at Lobethal.

Hopefully more about training next month, this weather has not exactly been conducive to riding!

Still keeping my trim and lovely self, despite a little less exercise. Must be the cold keeping the fat off.....happy munching and safe riding,

CHURCH NEWS

MAT A BOOK! How many books do you know which were written over a period of 1600 years by 40 different authors that tell one coherent and consistent story? The authors of the Bible came from 19 different backgrounds and occupations. Luke was a Physician, Matthew a tax collector, but the gospels they wrote tell of the same people and events. And Matthew and Luke both list the 62 generations from Adam to Jesus. And yet with the aid of the Internet (e.g. ancestry.com.au) most of us struggle to trace six or more of our own generations. What a remarkable book and one of its consistent themes is to describe so accurately the human condition. We humans are a riddle, capable of so much good and evil. (see today's news for examples). The Bible starts in Genesis describing paradise lost and ends in Revelation with paradise regained, a future event. In the middle is the cross of Christ providing a bridge for those who want to get across. The first three chapters of Genesis also mention the rivers Tigris and Euphrates which are still there in Iraq today. So is the river Jordan where Jesus was baptised. Abraham began his journey from Ur and the British archaeologist Sir Leonard Woolley has found the site and excavated some of what remains. And pilgrims daily visit Bethlehem where lesus was born. They go to Jericho where Joshua fought his famous battle. They cruise the Nile beside which Moses was found as a baby. And battles are being fought today in Damascus where Paul was heading when he was confronted by lesus and his life was changed forever. Real places and real people. Not a book of fiction. It is also not a book of science. The Old Testament includes history, poetry and prophecy. The historyis His nation's story. The poetry includes the psalms and proverbs. The prophecy is also His Story, the coming Messiah. The New Testament includes four gospels about Jesus' life. There are letters to the early churches. And Revelation describes the culmination of all things. The Bible may not be fashionable today

but it contains a message that is as relevant today as it was when it



was written, because while technology has changed, human nature remains the same.

t the recent AGM our Chairman Alan Dube presented a comprehensive report of recent church activities. It was made so lengthy by the many people to whom we owe thanks. As an example the Garden Club have been very generous in donating the new rainwater tank, putting down the concrete foundations on which it stands and creating the garden that surrounds it. We had a Mum ringtail possum with two tiny, pink pouch young. She came in from Blackwood Vet with a split bottom lip and was taken back to her territory and released after a week of R & R here. She would have been be happy to scamper off into the bushes in her own territory again to raise her twins. Another adult ringtail possum was brought herein a very debilitated state, with pale gums and blood in his mouth. He absolutely blossomed whilst here, putting on weight, growing beautiful fur, eating well and being very active. He looked a picture of health in no time and was returned home during lovely mild weather to fulfil his role in our environmental

biodiversity. Good luck to him. A set of ringtail twins were also returned to their territory, as well as a juvenile brush tail possum this week, after they met with misadventure! I had a tawny frogmouth come in that I took to the vets for an X-ray because of a swelling in one wing. It wasn't hanging down but the bird didn't fly. The wing bone was broken but had calcified together again whilst I had it strapped. She has started flying up onto perches and across the aviary once the strapping was removed, so it looked like the bones had calcified and strengthened the break.Amazing!!! In another week she was strong enough to go home to her family! A tiny and frozen cold koala came in weighing 850 grams. She was found on the ground with no mum and very unhappy with her ears down low, which means she was miserable. What a night it was to be out in the cold alone! I'd never had such a starving baby koala before! Matilda bit, tore and ripped at the teat to get the formula as she was soooo hungry and took 20mls without stopping. I gave her another feed about 11pm. She slowly felt better after a feed, toileting and feeling warm and safe snuggling on her teddy. I reckoned it would take a while to get her confidence and calm her down to feel safe again. I hate to

On a sad note this month we have had to say farewell to Dr Roxanne Harvey! Unfortunately for all of us her partner had to move to Brisbane for work commitments. For some strange reason she didn't like the idea of just letting him go to live & work up there by himself! We certainly wish them both the very best! Hopefully soon we will be able to make an announcement as to Dr Roxanne's replacement. If there are any vets out there wanting to join a great practice please let us know! In the meantime we have Dr Donna Sayer & Dr Kellie McGuire helping us out a few days a week. Both vets are very experienced in the field of small animal medicine & surgery. We have already had some lovely feedback from clients! We are seeing a lot of colics lately! It is important to remember that horses still need to drink adequate levels of water during the cold weather to prevent dehydration & subsequently colic. Sometimes if there are dental issues this can make drinking cold water painful. It is a really good idea to get your horse's teeth checked to prevent this from happening! However if you are going to book Dr Greg to do this or for any other dental work please book ahead as he very busy at the moment! We believe pet insurance can be very worthwhile to have in certain circumstances. For clients who have more than one pet it just becomes uneconomical! We have also been told that one company has recently increased their premiums by over 40%!!!! For our clients only - if you would like to avoid a situation where an unforseen emergency results in financial pressure this might be of interest to you! We are getting more & more of our clients paying money into their accounts & building up a credit balance. This money is never lost & can be refunded unlike pet insurance premiums!

We are encouraging you to make an appointment with your senior pet for a check up. Did you know that as our pets age they are prone to diseases common to their senior human counterparts such as dementia, diabetes, heart disease, kidney and liver failure, endocrine disease, cancer and

arthritis? One of the most common conditions we see is a kind of dementia called cognitive dysfunction syndrome, or CDS. CDS is a syndrome associated with brain ageing. It leads to changes in a pet's responsiveness, learning, memory and can cause anxiety with age. Following are the most common signs of Dementia in dogs:

- Getting "lost" in corners or on the wrong side of a door
- Pacing or anxiousness
- Loss of Housetraining
- Doesn't greet family members as before
- Barking for no reason
- Loss of appetite
- Sleep irregularities
- Doesn't respond to voice commands as before

For dogs suspected of having sen-

OUR FAMILY AT WAR

New Zealand was about as far from the action in WW2 as you could get, and yet the war had a profound effect on our family. My mother's only brother |im Stainton was a marine engineer on merchant ships during the war, taking farm produce to Britain to help the war effort. His ships were torpedoed twice and each time he was picked up by other ships in the convoy. But the news of the sinking came through long before word from him. He came home, married his sweetheart, they raised four bonny children and he lived on until he was 86. Dad's two youngest brothers both served in the army, Ken in Egypt, Greece and Crete and Ced in North Africa. When German paratroopers were dropped on Crete in their thousands, Churchill ordered the Allies to leave. There was not enough room to take them all on the ships he sent. Four hundred of them were captured on the wharf and taken to prison camps just across the border between Poland and Germany. When the war ended the guards opened

the prison gates and fled. They were terrified of the approaching Russian troops. Ken and his Kiwi mate spent three months walking across Germany and living off the land. They had no money. A Dutch fisherman took them across the channel to England where they spent time in hospital recovering from TB, malnutrition, and a variety of parasites. Back in NZ he married Aunt Mary and they bought a dairy farm. On ANZAC day they milked the cows. Ced came home with a severe bout of PTSD, but in those days it was called "shell shock". He was wounded and hospitalised twice, and invalided out eventually. He was naturally a shy, thoughtful, sensitive guy and the war was too much for him to handle. Back in NZ it was left to Grandma to nurse him back to health and strength. There was no counselling, medication or other specialised help other than the local GP. It took him two years to get back to work and in his forties he met a soul mate, Aunt Stella and they married. Some people can take a war in their stride. Our local truckie came back with a VC for leading many successful attacks on the enemy and personally stalking and shooting 33 snipers. He was shot through his shoulder but took the war in his stride. But not Ced. Dad's cousin Douglas didn't survive the war. It wasn't a bullet or bomb that got him but an injection that he gave himself. As an army doctor he was sent on a troop ship to India with instructions to vaccinate all on board. The practice then was to split each dose of vaccine between two people. The soldier he shared his with died within a week. Douglas lingered on with septicaemia but died back in England leaving his wife Nancy to raise four children aged 1-7. There were no antibiotics during that war and millions died of what are now curable diseases. And the atrocious conditions in the field and in the prison camps magnified the health problems. We were lucky I guess being half a world away. Food supplies were scarce. Meat and butter were rationed. Our car was up on blocks as tyres and fuel were only available for essential services. Building materials were often

unavailable. I started school in the last year of the war and we did air-raid drill once a week. When the bell rang we marched outside and lay down in trenches dug by the home guard. This included Dad and Grandpa who spent many week-ends preparing for the day when the Japs arrived. The atomic bombs that were dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki helped bring the war in the Pacific to an end, fortunately before the Japanese reached our shores. I remember the day the war ended. Mum was standing by the radio in the sitting room listening to the BBC radio broadcast with Churchill saying the war was over. There were tears streaming down her face and she was sobbing her poor heart out. I asked her what was wrong and she said "The war's over." "So..... why are you crying?" After I retired my wife and I visited Kanchanaburi and the river Kwai, Bayeux and the landing beaches at Normandy, Villers Brettonneux on the Somme, Churchill's war room in London and Douglas Richardson's grave in North Bovey, Devon, and other war sites to try to get a better understanding ofthe war from where the action took place. The one that affected me most was the underground hospital on Jersey built by the Germans and now a WW2 museum. The film footage of the war, the air raid sirens, the battle scenes and personal stories from people who suffered through it were emotionally overwhelming and I came out with tears running down my cheeks. It is staggering to think that with all our advances in technology we can't find a better way to solve our disputes than killingpeople who weren't involved in the dispute in the first place. Our family's involvement was because we lived in a British colony. If the Germans or lapanese had reached NZ before the Brits we would have been fighting on the other side. The war was a puzzle for me at age five. Seventy years on it still is. There has to be a better way to solve our differences. Jim Richardson.

THE THUNDERERS

ave you ever wondered where our local footy team got the name "Thunderers"? Well I was interested and decided to find out. I had heard rumours that the name came from some early preachers who did a circuit from Clarendon through Cherry to Ironbank in the 1800's whose sermons were given like "thunder". Another rumour was that someone's horse was named Thunder and it came from there. I asked a number of members at the club but all I could find out was that the Ironbank Cherry Gardens Cricket team was called The Thunderers long before the Footy club was formed in 1986 and the Netball team was called the Thunderets. So eventually I contacted Bill Watchman who was one of the founders of the Cricket Club (he thinks it was in the late 1960's) and his recollection was that in a discussion with Kevin Morgan on the coming together of the 2 cricket clubs being Cherry Gardens and Ironbank there was some rivalry on what the name of the club should be and whether it should be Cherry Gardens Ironbank or Ironbank Cherry Gardens. Bill (who was playing for the Cherry Gardens Cricket Club) suggested that that to avoid this the new club should be named something completely different and he suggested "The Thunderers Cricket Club". While the club in the end became the Ironbank Cherry Gardens Cricket Club the name Thunderers stuck and was carried over to the Football club when it was formed in 1986.

NBN Co launches new satellite broadband services

NBN Co has launched its new satellite support scheme, which will deliver broadband services to Australia's most remote premises.

NBN Co's Satellite Support Scheme (NSS) will allow up to 9,000 premises access to a subsidised satellite broadband service until the NBN's Long Term Satellite Service (LTSS) is made available.

The NSS is similar to the Australian Government's former Australian Broadband Guarantee (ABG) program and will subsidise approved wholesale satellite providers selling their services through retail service providers.

Eligible end users for the scheme include residents, small businesses, Indigenous community organisations and not-for-profit organisations. They also include education, health and local government facilities.

The NSS will be made available to end users who are unable to access a commercial broadband service, as defined by NBN Co's broadband service locator (BSL). This is to ensure that end users in remote locations, who are most in need of broadband access, are first to receive the service.

All eligible users will be required to register with NBN Co before ordering a service.

Premises that received an ISS or subsidised satellite service under the former ABG program will not be eligible for the NSS.


