EDITORIAL

Rainwater Tanks

I am sure most of us have rainwater tanks that we use either for the garden or the house instead of what is now very expensive mains water. A recent study by the CSIRO, however, has shown that a large percentage of households may not be aware of some of the maintenance requirements that come with rainwater tank ownership.

Now while I am sure most of our tanks would now be full it is not too late to do some maintenance so that when the hot dry summer months arrive the quality of the rainwater you are storing is good and healthy.

The top 5 tips for maintaining your rainwater tank are:

- Keep the gutters clean every 3 months
 - Cleaning out the gutters is a simple way to improve the water quality and the efficiency of the tank. As well as leaf matter sometime faecal matter can be found in gutters from possums, rats, mice etc
 - Look into installing gutter meshing and there are a range of accessories that can be installed to filter out debris from the roof and gutters.
- 2. Mozzie mesh every 3 months
 - A rainwater tank is a great place for mosquitoes and pests to set up shop and thrive. Without good quality mesh, pests or vermin can get into the tank.
 - Poorly maintained mesh can pose a risk to your health, particularly if populations of disease carrying insects are free to multiply in the rainwater tank hotel in your backyard.
- Spend some quality time getting to know your water quality – every 6 months
 - Some households use rainwater for the toilet or the washing machine so cleanliness of the water is

less important. However, for those properties that use the water for showers, drinking or cooking, checking the water quality is crucial.

- In the study they found that 57 per cent of tanks had discoloured water and 19 per cent had odorous water, while 25 per cent of tanks had medium or high concentrations of sediment.
- Look after the pump every 6 months
 - The condition of the pumps and outlets will affect the quality of the water and the efficiency of how you can access and use the water. A well-maintained system can also protect against long-term damage.
 - The study found that in homes with pumps installed, 5 per cent were not functioning and 18 per cent of properties inspected were reported to have leaky pipes. Don't waste this valuable resource.
- 5. It's time to de-sludge
 - It is recommended that households organise the removal of sediment using a qualified contractor once every two to three years. This job requires specialized equipment so may not be something you want to do yourself.

The study also pointed out how important it is to make sure tank founda-

tions are level, and that the pump has a reliable water switch.

As I am sure you already know we are having an unusually wet winter. June was a particularly wet month and July is shaping up the same already. For those that have lived in Cherry Gardens for a while it feels a lot like it used to be 20 + years ago.

We have had a few emails from locals supporting our position in regards to the objection we made to the development application by The NBN Co. to place a 40 metre tower next to the kid's playground at the Rec Ground to provide a Fixed Wireless broadband service to Cherry

Gardens instead of a

Fibre system. So far we have not had any feedback from the council in regards to our objection other than to acknowledge that they received it. We will keep you updated when we hear more.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Well that wet weather certainly arrived (in bucket loads!). Great for the paddocks, but very messy for a couple of months. As I said last month, this may be the time where water-logging really shows up. This can really highlight areas that are not draining well, or where water is collecting, say around traffic areas like gates etc. It's a good idea to have a map of your paddocks and mark out these problem spots so that they can be addressed in the drier weather. If it is a pedestrian area like a small gate, then pavers can be a good solution to the problem. Putting them in now while the ground is soft gives the pavers a chance to 'bed in'. Bargain pavers are often to be had on Gumtree, so you can keep the costs down.

Many horses will have lost condition by now, but do be alert in the next few months for that 'spring flush' as hours of daylight increase and sugars are rising in the grasses. In the hills (lovely as they are), this is a real management problem and it pays to know your horse(s) very well. If they have foundered in the past, then the risks are greater. Any of the pony



breeds are also more at risk. Regular exercise is a major factor in helping to keep your horse safe, apart from the obvious food control, and this is where the danger arises. When the weather is inclement we tend not to be out and about riding and exercising our steeds, but it is just the time to be more careful about this. Daily checking is important, knowing your horse's habits, where they stand (lie) and for how long. Also how they are standing, as quite often a horse which is foundering will stand with the front feet out in front, taking the weight off his toes. When this is the case, immediate veterinary attention is needed as well as removing the horse from free access to paddock feed. Horses being social creatures will often do better

with a paddock companion. This will help keep the feed down as well as keep the two of them moving. This is also closer to their natural tendencies and can help reduce any stereotypies such as fence walking, crib biting etc. If your horse is an 'only' horse, he will rely on you for companionship as well as extra food, so it important to keep contact regularly and not leave him in solitary confinement (figuratively speaking).

Speaking for myself, my weight is well down on what it was a couple of months ago. I was up around 500kg, with bits of cellulite around my bum (not a good look!). Now I am down to around 470kg, much trimmer and feeling more energetic. My owners try hard to keep me at this level, but come the spring grasses we shall see. Generally I am ridden 3-4 times a week, so this helps too.

Well good luck everyone with diets and paddock management! Safe riding,

MINTON FARM

An injured Adelaide Rosella brought to the Centre recently was the 10,000th animal to be admitted to the Intensive Care Unit. The bird was found near the Tonsley Hotel on South Rd, dazed and with its tail severed. After stabilization, it was housed in an aviary with another rosella, to recuperate. Shortly afterwards, it was released successfully close to where it was found.

There have been double that number of animals and birds assisted over the past 24 years by Minton Farm via phone, email, web and Facebook advice.

The latest bird of prey to be admitted was a Brown Falcon from Angaston. It had been hung in a barb wire fence by its wing. Although the wing was weakened by the muscle damage it received, the bones were all intact. It progressed through the hospital and small flight cage well, eating everything it was offered and after a week or more, it was perching on the highest perch in the flight cage, proving it could not only manage flight, but also had the ability to gain altitude. I placed it into the 30 foot long, 12 foot high shade cloth lined flight to test his ability and build up his strength. To my delight he was able to fly the length of the flight several times without detriment after a few days. He was fed a good feed then released back into his territory again. This bird was on death row, as the rescuer had been advised to euthanize the bird without giving him time to recover and gain strength. As they say "time heals all"...well sometimes?

We are grateful to the Flagstaff Hill Dental Clinic for donating the resin and UV light to mend a fractured tortoise shell. This animal was returned safely to its home in Hahndorf weeks earlier than it would have been able to without the resin seal. Thank you!

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS FOR AUGUST

If you haven't pruned your roses- do it now. If you don't know what to do, just cut off any rootstock suckers and dead

or weak branches, then reduce the bush by at least a third! Take a few cuttings of your favourite rose - plant in a semi-shaded position, keep moist and soon you will have some extra plants for putting out next year!

It is a good time to fertilize garden plots now as slow acting organic fertilizers take at least a month to break down and become available.

Gladiolus planted now will flower in approx. 100 days.

Now is a good time to restore your lawn where it is low or the dog has been digging.

The soil is still too cool for planting out most veggies, but keen gardeners will have their tomato seedlings in pots in a warm sunny spot. Broad Beans love the cold and can still be planted.

Saving the Belair bandicoots

Work has begun on a bandicoot 'superhighway' to help save this endangered species from disappearing from Belair National Park.

Recent genetic studies show the Southern Brown Bandicoots in Belair have become cut off from the nearest bandicoot population, in Mark Oliphant Reserve, five kilometres away. Scientists believe the two populations can reconnect by a habitat corridor, the superhighway, to enable them to interbreed to maintain the genetic viability of the species.

To create the superhighway, 19 landholders who own properties between the two reserves are making their land bandicoot-friendly, thanks to support from Natural Resources Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges and Sturt Upper Reaches Landcare group. Extensive weeding and planting with native species will help create the habitat bandicoots like best. This complex vegetation community of up to 200 plant species, dominated

by low heaths, will create a dense understory where bandicoots can safely shelter from foxes and cats.

South Australia once had seven species of bandicoot, but this has dwindled to just one species remaining due to loss of habitat and feral predators.

It's hoped that engaging multiple landholders on connected properties will be a more effective way to protect a species than trying to protect it on individual properties or in national parks alone. The role of Sturt Upper Reaches Landcare group in connecting with and involving the local community has been vital to the success of this project.

To my surprise I found that Satellite NBN was now available at my address on Ackland Hill Road. This may be due to our distance from the proposed new tower (we are next to Woodcutters Rd), however it would allay your health concerns if it were deployed for whole of Cherry Gardens.

I have also checked addresses at both ends of Cherry Gardens Road, and Skymuster is available. Maximum download available is 25 megabits/sec (typically 22) and prices seem comparable to Telstra ADSL which only gives me 3 Mb/s. The only doubt is in regards to the contract with Telstra which may incur cancellation fees as they do not offer Skymuster.


