GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS FOR AUGUST 2017

Plant bare-rooted trees and shrubs later this month but watch for frost-sensitive ones as they may need some protection, delay planting out Citrus and Passionfruit till next month.

Almonds will be flowering now and if you have only one tree and no trees nearby it would be wise to collect a bunch of almond blossom and place it in a bucket under your tree to aid in pollination, and hopefully a good crop! I find parrots and lorikeets love the

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Well not much has happened re my sore bottom and floating, due to the float getting repairs done to the brakes. Hopefully more news next month...

One of my paddock mates was diagnosed with Cushing's disease some while back and since then we have become aware that it is much more common than we thought. Will just give you a simple over view on what it is all about.

The disease itself is caused by an over secretion of a stress hormone called cortisol, which in turn comes about through the growth of tumours in the horses' pituitary glands. It mainly affects horses over 7 years of age and ponies more commonly than horses.

There are many symptoms, some of which may be related to something altogether different, so usually where Cushings is suspected, a blood test is done.

Some of the symptoms may include excessive thirst, excessive urination, weight loss, a shaggy coat which sheds readily, a change in body shape, mouth ulcers, laminitis and a higher susceptibility to infection. Tests may also show



a raised blood pressure. Fortunately the disease can be managed by medication of one or more drugs, which would be ongoing for the rest of the horse's life.

My owners did not know that my mate had Cushings, but probably the first indication was that he contracted founder (laminitis) a few years ago. This was put down to a good autumn growth in the pasture when we were all out in it for 24/7. That would certainly have been a factor. As time went on it was noticed that he was just not keeping his condition and was also retaining a lot of his winter coat. This was put down to his age (he is now 27). It was during one of our routine teeth treatments that our vet suggested that he may have Cushings and we could find out for sure with the blood test.

Of course the test came back positive, which explained all of the previous symptoms. He is now on a drug called Pergolide for the rest of his life, but he is looking better and our owners are very conscious of his feeding regime as in plenty of bulk, restricting open paddock grazing and keeping up a routine of regular moderate exercise. The other factor in all of this which is crucial to keeping him healthy was making sure we had a very good farrier. After 2 months of a disaster with one person, we were lucky to find very competent person, who has not only put my mate back on track, but has improved the rest of us as well. Sometimes with horses if you are lucky, you can go for years without any problems, but obviously as our equine friends age (like humans!), the machinery starts to break down here and there. So it pays to be aware of the little things, small changes in behaviour, eating habits, ridden behaviour and so on. Sometimes it is just your 'gut' feel, but it is usually worth it to get it checked out.

Hope my owners are keeping a good eye on me! Happy munching and safe riding,

CFS NEWS

ver the last few months Cherry Gardens CFS Brigade has responded to a number of diverse and challenging incidents. In April we tackled a burning car which had been stolen and set alight near the Blackwood Golf Course. Because of their high plastic content modern vehicles burn fiercely and emit harmful toxins, so the only firefighters able to approach had to don Breathing Apparatus in order to fight the fire. Also in April we were called to a structure fire in Clarendon along with several other appliances from different brigades. Unfortunately by the time we reached the scene the house was burning fiercely and was well beyond saving. As Cherry Gardens is predominantly a rural brigade many of us had not attended a large scale structure fire before and it was a learning experience to see how our training applies in a real life situation.

In April and May we also responded to a series of motor vehicle accidents in the area. Thankfully none resulted in serious injuries, despite the fact that several of the vehicles were written off. These incidents are a timely reminder of the challenges of navigating narrow winding roads, such as we have in our area, and the need to adjust speed accordingly. We also appreciate people's patience when encountering CFS traffic stops at such incidents. If possible, we make every effort to allow at least one lane of traffic through, but sometimes it's just not safe to keep the road open until the vehicle has been removed from the scene.

As frequently happens at this time of year, we have also attended a number of burn offs that have rekindled or gotten out of control. The most serious of these was a small pile of burning rubbish at the time it was called in. By the time the first appliance arrived it had spread to the point it threatened a nearby house and caravan. These kind of incidents are a good reminder to ensure burn offs are always supervised and properly extinguished. Even in winter a fire can quickly rekindle if it is given sufficient breeze.

It has certainly been a busy few months for the Brigade, and this has enabled many newer members to get a taste of the sort of thing we do, and



for many experienced members to consolidate their skills. This is particularly important given that we have our Annual General Meeting coming up in August. At this meeting the Brigade elects Lieutenants and Senior Firefighters to lead us over the next two years, making it one of the most important events in our calendar.

As always, we would like to extend our thanks to the Cherry Gardens community for your continuing support. It is much appreciated and makes our task easier and safer all round.



CHURCH NEWS



However all calmed down as I thought, no probs I will just order another of the newer style bowls and switch over to our mains supply. That was duly done and our local ag supplier promised delivery the following day. I then went to have a shower prior to taking the 'the beloved' out. As the shower came on the water flow was incredible, thanks to the water pressure the powers that be put down Cherry Gardens Rd. This much higher pressure than we are used to shower, should have been a wonderful experience but alas, following a rather loud report coming from the direction of the hot water service the high pressure flow dropped firstly to a dribble and then stopped altogether. With more 'anglo saxon' coming to mind I redressed and went out

to see what had happened. It seemed our hot water system objected to the increase in pressure and 'popped' its release valve. Once this was switched back all seemed well so back to the shower but alas the same thing happened again - further 'anglo saxon' could have been heard. By now I realised it was not my day and was time i called our local plumber. The plumber arrived at 8am the following morning and after a quick inspection declared we needed a new pressure restriction valve on the mains and a new pump on our rain water tanks. These were both fitted that day and with the new filter bowl arriving that afternoon We were back in full operation in a little under 24 hours.

I bet they couldn't beat that in the city! So may i suggest we support our local tradies and suppliers, we/I would be a lot worse off without them?

FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK

The third year of the Friends' ten year Almanda Project ended with a flurry of activity in June.

The Project commenced in July 2014 to restore native habitat along eight headwater creeks of the Scott Creek sub-catchment. This included managing threats to a number of national, state and regionally threatened native plants and animals.

During the year, contractors worked in six of the targeted headwater creek systems, together with three of the other creek systems in the park, which are now being worked on as part of the project. They mainly focussed on follow-up of work undertaken during the previous two years, together with extending into several new areas. The main weed dealt with was Blackberry, with large infestations of this vigorous weed beyond the capacity of the volunteers. Other weeds treated included Broom, Boneseed, Dog Rose, Tree Heath, Bluebell Creeper, Cape Tulip and Bridal Creeper.

Crucial to getting this work done by contractors were grants and funding provided by Natural Resources Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges, the Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources, local councils the City of Onkaparinga and Adelaide Hills Council and the Patagonia Environmental Grants Fund of Tides Foundation. Donations and other funds were also raised through events and activities held by the Friends during the year.

While this work was taking place, the small but dedicated group of volunteers in the Friends group was tackling all manner of weed across the whole park. Most of this work involved patrolling broad areas of the 840 hectare park, doing follow-up and looking for isolated weeds and smaller patches. This follow-up of previous weeding efforts is critical in ensuring those efforts are not wasted by allowing the weeds to reinvade the bushland again.

We encourage anyone who enjoys bushwalking, bird watching or other activities permitted in the park, or simply have a love of our local bushland or wildlife, to consider giving something back to the park and to join in our efforts. Our regular working bees only go for about three hours, and include

a break for a cuppa and a chat mid-morning, but any time that you can spare would be most welcome.

small under-developed almonds so a net may be necessary.

Spray fruit trees at bud-swell to deter fungal and mite problems.

Scarlet runner beans grow best when sown in cool conditions so now is a good time to try them, if you are lucky they will last for 7 years.

Watering roses can be problematical as they do not like humidity so avoid sprayers, using drippers instead, and keep the mulch away from their base.

Flowers to try this month could include Asters, Carnations, Dahlia (seed), African Marigold, Petunia and Phlox



MINTON FARM*

This time of year is traditionally a "quiet" time in relation to the volume of rescues we receive at the Rescue Centre. Interestingly we have been kept quite busy this year after a short lull in May, we were back into it again in June! We received a young sulphur crest cocky that was attacked by a wedge tail eagle, but was dropped when the eagle took to the sky. That bird took some time to recover from the muscle damage done by the talons of the eagle, but eventually flew strongly and was returned to Meadows as a more mature, capable flier with a much greater chance of survival.

A young koala was the victim of a vehicle impact on Ackland Hill Road. She suffered minor grazing above her eye and after a short recovery period was returned to a patch of scrub where she climbed straight to the top of a gum tree and commenced feeding as if nothing had happened! A young joey was removed from the pouch of a roo hit by a vehicle at Ceduna. Luckily the driver stopped and checked the pouch to save the youngster who is now flourishing. Koalas are presenting with a crusty scabbing on their feet similar to staph in possums (which is also prevalent at this time of year because of stress from the weather, lack of food, fighting etc) . Koalas get mange from walking on the ground where foxes have travelled by getting infested with fox mite. It is a very uncomfortable condition, which koalas do not cope well with, nor the treatment for it so it is kinder to have the animal put to sleep at any Vet than to leave it to suffer, just as it is with staph infected possums. There are far worse things than death and this is one of them!

A Tawny Frogmouth came in suffering from concussion, presumably from a vehicle impact. It has slowly improved after treatment to the stage of being housed in a shade cloth lined flight aviary to get it flying ready to release. It is eating very well and a beautiful specimen. We are fund raising to build a round flight cage to strengthen birds just like her, to give them a better chance of sur-

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I was riding my horse along Ackland Hill Road a few weeks ago between Edialta Road and the golf course maintenance area and noticed a man removing some of the dead sticks and rubbish from the side of the road. I asked him if he was collecting for his fire and he said he was just cleaning up the area to make it neater.

I noticed, a couple of weeks later, that a large branch that had been blocking part of the track had also been removed thereby making it easier to make my way along the track rather than having to go close to the road to pass it by.

I was very impressed with his community attitude.

I'd like to thank you very much – whoever you are – for making the track easier to access for horse riders/walkers/runners/bike riders. Your thoughtfulness is very much appreciated.

FROM THE OFFICE OF REBEKAH SHARKIE

t took a mammoth effort but Australia finally has education funding reform. I would like to reassure the people of Mayo that Gonksi 2.0 in its amended form represents a positive step for Australia's education system. It's not perfect but compared to what we had under Labor's Gonski this is definitely a purer version of a sector-blind, needs-based funding model for schools.

It even has the endorsement of the reform's namesake, David Gonski, and two other members of the Gonski Review Expert Panel – Ken Boston and Kathryn Greiner.

One of the problems with the old Gonski model was the former Labor Government promised "no school shall lose dollar". This meant, under Labor's Gonski, it would have taken 150 years for overfunded schools to reach parity with underfunded schools. In reality there are always losers when you try to level the playing field.

I commend the Federal Government for having the courage to bring in reform for the greater good.

Admittedly, as the representative for Mayo, it wasn't unpalatable to support this reform because South Australia, one of the worse-off states, was a major beneficiary.

Thanks to the advocacy of the Nick Xenophon Team, the Government agreed to put in an extra \$4.9 billion into the reforms, increasing the funding pool from \$18.6 billion to \$23.5 billion, including an extra \$424 million over 10 years for South Australia's 718 schools.

Each of the 66 schools in Mayo will receive extra funding.

My NXT colleagues and I are pragmatists. We were asked to judge the merits of the Bill that provided \$23.5 billion for education AND a funding model that would result in an increased share of the total Commonwealth funding being allocated to Government schools.

At the moment around 33 per cent of the total Commonwealth expenditure is allocated to public schools. By 2023 that will have increased to 41.6 per cent thanks to the transparency and benchmarking measures advocated for by NXT.

Under this reform the Commonwealth's allocation per school will be publicly available, which will empower school communities and make it more difficult for education authorities in any sector to not pass on the full allocation.

Every child in South Australia will benefit from Gonski 2.0.



Safeguarding the reputation of Australian beef

In today's global market a brand is more than a product name, and it certainly means more than an identifying mark on a steer's rump for the Australia cattle industry. Last year the red meat and livestock industry was worth \$22.9 billion in this country. We processed 7.8 million head of cattle and exported \$7.15 billion worth of beef.

In comparison about 1.1 million head of cattle were sent overseas as live export.

The meat processing industry alone directly employs some 35,000 people (FTE) and provides indirect employment for another 100,000 people through sectors such as transport and storage.

These are jobs we want to keep in Australia, which is why I introduced a Private Members Bill to the Federal Parliament in June to safeguard the reputation of Australian beef.

The Competition and Consumer Amendment (Safeguarding the Reputation of Australian Beef) Bill, if taken up by the Government and passed, would make it illegal for an Australian company or an individual in Australia to market beef as an 'Australian' product if the meat they were selling hadn't been processed under Australian standards and regulations. These standards and regulations cost money but they are there for a reason, to ensure quality and food safety.

That reputation for quality and safety is an integral part of brand 'Australia' and is worth a premium in export markets. That premium helps pay for animal welfare regulations, strict food hygiene processes and award wages and working conditions for taxpaying Australians.

The Nick Xenophon Team believes it is manifestly unfair that an Australian enterprise could seek to bypass all that regulation by processing Australian cattle overseas ... but still profit from brand 'Australia' beef by labelling it Australian beef. We also believe that it is unacceptable for an Australian enterprise to risk the reputation of an entire industry by selling meat that is substandard or processed in an environment where the health risk is much higher.

We understand from our discussion with industry bodies that beef products derived from live export cattle are not permitted to be marketed as "Australian beef". We also understand that can be hard to police, particularly in the local markets of less developed countries, and it can be difficult to seek enforcement of market breaches from another sovereign nation.

At the very least, we can make sure Australian companies are doing the right thing by the Australian brand.

In addition to the Private Member's Bill in the Lower House, NXT will be introducing similar legislation in the Senate to make sure the issue is thoroughly debated.

The discussion might even be extended to other industries.

Calling on you to recycle

obile phones are part of our everyday lives and are usually replaced every two to three years.

According to new research commissioned by MobileMuster, there are 23 million old mobiles lying around in Australian homes that could be recycled.

The research also showed that over three quarters (77 per cent) of Australians are aware of mobile phone recycling and just under a third (31 per cent) have ever recycled an old mobile phone.

MobileMuster's Recycling Manager, Spyro Kalos, said that while the phone may be worthless to you now, it's not to the environment.

"If your phone is still working, we encourage you to reuse it by either selling it or passing it on to friends or family, and by doing so you'll be extending the life of it – which is a good thing. But if it's at the end of its life, recycle it," says Kalos.

"Regardless of what mobile phone you use, they are all highly recyclable.

"By recycling your old mobile, you'll be sending much needed materials back into the supply chain to make new products.

"98 per cent of the materials found in mobile phones can be recovered. This includes precious metals, plastics and non-renewable resources."

There are several ways you can recycle unwanted mobile phones and accessories for free including:

- posting them in using a free recycling satchel from Australia Post
- downloading a free reply paid label from the MobileMuster website and posting them in
- dropping them off at a local phone retailer
- check if your local school/charity is collecting old phones as a fundraiser

dropping them off at:

- any of the City of Onkaparinga's Customer Service offices or libraries
- Aberfoyle Community Centre
- · Coromandel Community Centre
- Reynella Neighbourhood Centre
- · Wakefield House, Morphett Vale.

For the second year running, the City of Onkaparinga won the Top Collector Award for South Australia in MobileMuster's Local Government Awards.

This year via the community, council collected 190kg of mobiles for recycling, an increase of 87kg from the previous year.

"Instead of seeing technology as a problem beyond our control, we need to be part of the solution as responsible users," said Mr Kalos.

"Recycling mobile phones is a positive environmental step that we can all take."
