Money, or lack of it, seems to dominate every form of discussion these days especially in relation to our emergency services. Our local CFS are always beavering away at some project or another and a visit to our local Cherry CFS station recently revealed their "Santa list", that is, all the equipment and tools they need to do their work for us "their community" which is not supplied as standard items by the State Government via the ESL. Funny, their list had not changed a great deal although CFS members proudly pointed out that they, with our help, had placed heart defibrillators on both Cherry appliances and their first aid kits were the best in the hills by far! While we as a community can bellyache all we want about the Emergency Services Levy we do, I believe, have a responsibility to give that little bit extra we can afford to assist our volunteers whether they be CFS, SES or

Surf lifesaving. Our community, including the greater Blackwood district, recently raised over \$180,000 towards the new Sturt Group Tanker to be based at Cherry. The State Government, via CFS headquarters, provided an additional \$180,000 to ensure the CFS met the goal. Well done to all concerned!

Our local CFS are reluctant to keep asking but they have been asked to give us, "their community," a list of needs with pricing in future Cherry Chatter editions in the hope that locals may stump up some extra funds to help! For example they would like to be able to purchase a thermal imaging camera (TIC) to assist in identifying hot spots, in particular burning roots of trees that could flare up days after appearing to be extinguished. This was a problem experienced during the Sampson Flat fires from last season. The cost of a TIC is quite expensive but is something the local group believes would be of immense value to their efforts. It is out of reach at this time and is really only something they can hope to get through community support, not from the ESL. A big thank

you to the local gentleman who recently supplied a brand new fridge for the Cherry Base radio crew --- thank

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGES-TIONS FOR OCTOBER

Have you ever tried growing your own native trees from seed? It is really quite easy!

Let's say you would like to grow a particular Eucalypt, first collect some nuts from the tree, ones that are mature but not dead (which would have dispersed their seeds), put them in a paper bag in a warm position even on your dash in the car is a good spot. After a few days the seeds will emerge with a lot of frass and it is hard to tell them apart. Don't worry you can scatter the lot into a small pot of potting mix. Sift a little potting mix to cover

them ever so slightly and then apply a light cover of very coarse sand or fine gravel (washed). Place the pots or tubes up off the ground and in the sun and keep moist. Depending on the variety they may take 2-6 weeks to appear, they may need protection from the sun on really hot days, and should grow strongly through the summer. It is a good idea to prick them out to leave the strongest in each pot or tube and they will be ready to plant out when about 150mm tall.

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greeting Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

Usually I would complain about the rain, but it is much needed, as well as hopefully some follow up rains for the next couple of months if we are to get some decent hay.

Last month we discussed getting your trusty steed to park. Sometimes this seems like it is going along alright, until you go to mount up. If his 'park' or standing still has any weak spots in it, it could show up here. Some of the behaviour may show up as moving away, stepping forward or back. Every time he does this and you have to start over again (especially if you are using a mounting block), he is rewarding himself and will be more likely to repeat that behaviour. Before you know it, he will be avoiding the mounting procedure every time you try to mount. Some simple strategies can be used to improve this. Firstly ensure that he is used to the long whip for stepping back or forward. If he steps forward, you can pressure the reins to step back and if he steps back, as some will do when you take up the reins, you can tap him on the rump to signal forward (as you might when float loading). Making sure that he knows this will definitely help. If he has the habit of swinging his hindquarters away from you, you can train him to bring them towards you. In hand, no saddle, just a bridle, take up the rein contact lightly and with your right hand and long whip, reach over the other side of his rump and give 2 light taps for him to leg yield towards you (he does



need to know how to yield to do this). If he doesn't react immediately, increase the frequency of the taps and immediately cease when he obeys. Depending on the horse, this may take many repetitions, but he will eventually do this lightly and immediately. When you have achieved this you can then bring in a verbal que such as 'here'. Now you say 'here', then tap with the whip for him to move towards you. Your timing is important here as it always is with all signals we apply in training, but done well will give great results. If you find that it is still difficult, line your horse up parallel to a rail so he is less tempted to swing away. Make sure that you are safe when doing this. The point is that you bring in the new cue first - this is the word 'here', so that eventually he will come towards you without the whip. Until this is really consolidated, he may just associate this with the area where you have trained him. As he becomes more consistent ask for the same response in different areas. Say you start in an arena, then move to different parts of the arena. Finally the aim is to be able to train him to give you this response anywhere, anytime. Hope this is of help, yours slimly, Hamish



closed and you may become trapped! At the Cherry CFS shed we have a DVD on the recent Canberra fires. It's scary stuff and we hope to have a night shortly, where local residents can call in, view the DVD, and see the new tanker—yes, you are reading correctly!

The new Sturt CFS Group BW13 CAFS appliance will be arriving at Cherry, where it is to be based, around the third week of September. Our members are becoming excited as the new appliance is not just a water tanker carrying 13000 litres, but has a compressed air foam system controlled by an in cab operator via a joystick and remote front of cab delivery system, where we can pump 26000 litres of foam onto the fire front or a home we are defending. Very similar to the fire appliances at Adelaide airport!

Keep your eye on the A frame sign in front of the station. Plans are afoot to have the new BW13 in Blackwood on Saturday morning, on display for everyone to see.



Our People


A church is not a building it is the people not the structure. Our members are committed people committed to their faith and committed to maintaining a place of worship and learning their faith in Cherry Gardens. We

CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL WHO WERE BORN IN THE 1930's, 40's, 50's, 60's

First, we survived being born to mothers who smoked and/or drank while they carried us and lived in houses made of asbestos.

They took aspirin, Bex, ate blue cheese, raw egg products, loads of bacon and processed meat, tuna from a can, and didn't get tested for diabetes or any cancer.

Then after that trauma, our baby cots were covered with bright coloured lead-based paints. We had no childproof lids on medicine bottles, doors or cabinets and when we rode our bikes, we had no helmets or shoes, not to mention the risks we took hitchhiking. As children, we would ride in cars with no seat belts or air bags, or in the back of a Ute. We drank water from the garden hose, or a bubbler and NOT from a bottle. Take away food was limited to fish and chips, no pizza shops, McDonalds , KFC, or Subway . Even though all the shops closed at 6.00pm and didn't open on the weekends, somehow we didn't starve to death! We shared one soft drink with four friends, from one bottle and NO ONE actually died from this. We could collect old drink bottles and cash them in at the corner store and buy Toffees, Bubble Gum and some 'crackers' to blow up frogs with. We ate copious biscuits, white bread and real butter and drank soft drinks with heaps of sugar in it, but we weren't overweight because......

WE WERE ALWAYS OUTSIDE PLAYING!!

Out of school we would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as we were back when the street lights came on. No one was out looking for us all day. And we were O.K.We would spend hours building our go-carts out of old prams. Or fruit boxes and ball bearings and then ride down the hill, only to find out we forgot the brakes. Our bikes had back pedal brakes, but only for as long as the chain stayed on. We built tree houses and dens and played in creek beds with matchbox cars. We did not have Playstations, Nintendo Wii, X-boxes, no video games at all, no 999 channels on SKY, No video/DVD films, No mobile phones, no personal computers, no Internet or Internet chat rooms......WE HAD FRIENDS and we went outside and found them! We fell out of trees, got cut, broke bones and teeth and there were no Lawsuits from these accidents. Only girls had pierced ears! We ate worms and mud pies made from dirt, and the worms did not live in us forever. You could only buy Easter Eggs and Hot Cross Buns at Easter time... We were given air guns or cap guns, and catapults for our 10th birthdays, We rode bikes or walked to a friend's house and knocked on the back door or rang the bell, or just yelled for them! Mum didn't have to go to work to help dad make ends meet! RUGBY and CRICKET had try outs and not everyone made the team. Those who didn't had to learn to deal with disappointment. Imagine that!! Getting into the team was based on MERIT

Our teachers used to hit us hard with canes, straps and gym shoes. The idea of a parent bailing us out if we broke the law was unheard of. They actually sided with the law! Our parents didn't invent stupid names for their kids like 'Kiora' and 'Blade' and 'Ridge' and 'Vanilla' and 'Lotus' We had freedom, failure, success and responsibility, and we learned HOW TO

DEAL WITH IT ALL! And YOU are one of them! CONGRATULATIONS!

You might want to share this with others who have had the luck to grow up as kids, before the lawyers and the government regulated our lives for our own good. Can you remember these times too?

FRIENDS of SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK

ALMANDA PROJECT - PROGRESS REPORT - July 2015

This is the first report for this Project, which began with a concerted Crowd fund-raising effort last year. With this very important and ambitious project, we hope to achieve, not just the restoration of native habitat to these creek systems but create a model for other Friends Groups and private land managers, for the way it can be achieved.

By carrying out detailed surveys using a system called 'BushRAT', regular, future surveys will then be measured against the baseline surveys. This will allow us to see gains, losses or no change to native vegetation, weed cover/density and bird and mammal numbers. Every aspect of this project will be monitored regularly to ensure the best possible outcomes.

Since the fund-raising ended, the Friends of Scott Creek CP have organized biodiversity surveys of three of the eight targeted creek systems.

Once the surveys were completed, blackberry spraying and brush-cutting of tracks to assist access to difficult to reach infestations began.

Scott Creek Conservation Park (west)

This very important spring-fed system has had all the peripheral and upstream infestations of blackberry sprayed in both East and West tributaries. Tracks have been slashed into some of the dense upper areas to assist further work later this summer. During the survey Slender Twig-rush, Baumea gunnii, Rare for SA, was discovered which is the first time it has been recorded in the Park. The Ruddy Ground-fern (Hypolepis rugosula), Rare SA, was also found during spraying. This fern had not previously been recorded in this part of the park before and is known only from a few small populations in Scott Creek CP.

Downstream a track has been slashed close to the creekline on both sides to allow access to this permanent creekline which is predominantly a Silky Tea-tree/Manna Gum (Leptospermum lanigerum/Eucalyptus viminalis), vegetation association now endangered in the MLR. Many rare and uncommon water loving plant species grow here but were slowly being swamped by blackberry. Friends Group working bees are targeting this area removing blackberry, introduced mint, water cress, introduced grasses and medics. An extensive Erica infestation has been eradicated at the headwaters of Almanda Ck.

Viminaria Creek

At this stage, all of Viminaria Creek system, which was in good condition with scattered blackberry re-growth throughout, has had follow-up blackberry spraying. During the survey a new population of the State Vulnerable Water Blinks (Montia fontana), was discovered. There are only two other populations in the Park and this is the largest. Yorkshire fog grass is encroaching on this site and much of it has already been manually removed by the Friends. A nearby infestation of the sticky weed Stinkwort, (Ditrichia graveolans) has also been eradicated.

Bushrat Creek System

Initially, tracks were slashed up the middle of the targeted area of creekline as the blackberry infestation is very wide. Blackberry spraying has been carried out with the mid section of creekline being left until the end sections have recovered and begun to regenerate. Several side creeks were also treated. A significant section of this creekline is a Manna Gum Woodland over Silky Tea Tree, both of which are rated as Vulnerable in the MLR. Much of the tea-tree was swamped by blackberry with no likelihood of recruitment; many plants are senescing and would have disappeared in the next few years.

On the nearby North Bushrat Ck, Friends and a contractor have slashed tracks through blackberry and freed up populations of many small, uncommon & rare bog plants. Regrowth willows have also been treated. Contractors have made good headway on a very large infestation of Erica just above this creekline.

The Friends have found this project to be a very rewarding one from several aspects. We have had great support from DEWNR and NRM staff from the outset and they have found extra funding to assist us in achieving our initial goals and beyond.

It is great for morale when we are able to see our aspirations turned into onground actions. Without this concerted effort and increase in funding, many of these ecosystems would have gradually disappeared under blackberry or Erica. Intact systems are increasingly rare and local extinctions become a reality without active intervention.

The fact that the early vegetation surveys uncovered rare species not previously recorded for the park, augers well for future surveys. The willingness of many members of the public to support this project and trust us to carry out the work has been very heartening.

Give me a call if you want to help out on this and other long term habitat restoration in your park.


nd of the minor round has come and gone and unfortunately our senior teams missed out on the finals.
