GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS for AUGUST

- Rose and deciduous fruit tree pruning should be complete by now. Most roses will have new growth but if you have not pruned your fruit trees for shape, do it very soon!
- This is your last chance to plant bare-rooted roses and deciduous fruit trees.
- Prune hydrangeas before new growth appears.
- Tip prune passionfruit as new lateral growth is where the fruit forms.
- Plant a couple of Tommy Toe tomato plants now they are the largest and best tasting cherry tomatoes ever – and you will be picking them before Christmas! A cloche made from half a soft drink

- bottle will protect them from frost but remove it on sunny days
- Spray grapevines and deciduous fruit tress with wettable sulphur to manage fungal and mite issues.
- Scarlet runner beans planted now will get off to a good start as they grow best in cooler conditions – they are a perennial and survive on a persistent rootstock for up to seven years.
- Feed your whole garden with organic based fertilizers to give plants a head start in spring – it also encourages earth worms and soil microbes to improves soil structure.
- Last chance to plant summer- flowering bulbs (liliums, calla, Scarborough lily)
- Plant asparagus crowns, beetroot, carrot, cabbage, kale, and snow peas

GARDEN CLUB JUNE MEETING NOTES:

On 19th June our Garden Club secretary Jan Ball transported us away from the chilly, wet and wintery Adelaide Hills when she shared photos from the trip she, Ray and Lyn Wise, Melva and Edith took to Townsville last year. Their main reason for being in Townsville was to attend the 2022 Garden Clubs of Australia Convention. A big part of the attraction of being in a town, where the Garden Clubs Australia Convention is taking place, is the fact that the Garden Club members of all of that town's Garden Clubs open their gardens to attendees at the Convention. We saw photos of many plants of all sorts. We visited gardens with random design or with foci such as cacti, succulents, orchids or if water is kept up other subtropical plants such as ornamental ginger. This gave them the rare opportunity of viewing thousands of plants of one sort - all on one property. Most of the plants in the photos cannot be easily grown in Adelaide's Mediterranean climate and hence we would consider them rare. Most of us were surprised at how arid Townsville is. This is apparently due to its situation north of the Tropic of Capricorn, the southern border of the tropics. At this latitude the winters are warm and dry, rather than cool and wet. Townsville is overlooked by Mount Stuart, which has an elevation of 584 meters. The most common Native plants of Townsville are grasses, the Poplar Gum and Townsville Wattle.

After the pictorial presentation we had a people's choice vote for the winner of the Pumpkin competition.

Claude Bartel's massive, over 8 kg Queensland Blue was the winner by one point over Ray Wise's huge butternut, Marilyn Wise's L-o-o-o-o-ng Tromboncinni was voted third,

and Jan Ball's butternut entry was voted fourth.

At the end of the evening the pumpkins were auctioned. The Queensland Blue fetched \$10 and the purchase was shared by two bidders.

This month's article is not easy to write. Last month we had a severe storm. I lost my paddock mate of 12 years in that storm. I was injured too, in my face.

So many friends came to pay their respects for my (and my owners) loss. This kindness was hugely appreciated by my owners and has helped with the healing process. That's all for this month everyone, too upsetting to continue.

In a few months' time, Australians will be voting for or against the establishment in the Australian Constitution of an indigenous *Voice* to the Federal Parliament. In this article, I am not going to argue for or against the referendum question; here is not the forum for that.

But it reminds me how much, in the most general sense, human beings value having a 'voice'. It is one of the fundamental abilities of a human being, and one which we rarely take for granted.

Parents celebrate as an infant develops his or her voice: that first word, the growing vocabulary – but perhaps not so exciting for the parents in the middle of the night! As adults, we speak, and we expect people to listen to us. We hear other people speaking, and we choose whether or not to actually listen to them. If people do not listen to us, we feel let down, sometimes in a minor way, sometimes significantly. Within a family, or in a workplace, life is enriched when people's voices are heard, and something valuable is lost when people's voices are ignored or rejected.

God is not 'physical', in the way that we understand that concept, but Christians sometimes describe God using human-style language. For instance, Christians describe God as having a 'voice'. Christians believe that God 'speaks' to them – usually not 'physically', but nevertheless in a very real way. God may 'speak' to people when they read the Bible. (The Bible is commonly called 'the Word of God'.) God may 'speak' when people spend time in prayer. God may 'speak' through the advice of wise friends. God may 'speak' when people take time to enjoy nature, God's creation. And sometimes God may 'speak' to people when they are least expecting him to!

Who could possibly be more important to listen to than God?

But when God 'speaks', am I prepared to listen?


These red fungi are one of the many species of fungi to be found in the park during the wetter months.



FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK



BLUEBELL CREEPER ALERT!!

This article is to highlight a very significant pest plant that has become well established in our region.

The Blue-bell Creeper or Sollya (Billardiera heterophylla) is a climbing plant that is native to Western Australia, which has been widely planted into gardens in SA over the years. There are a couple of similar local species, with Sweet Apple-berry (Billardiera cymosa) being most like it. Photos have been included to show the most obvious differences, which are in the flowers and fruits. It takes some practice to tell the difference when plants aren't flowering or fruiting.

Unfortunately, the Blue-bell Creeper refuses to remain within the confines of the gardens it is planted into, and escapes over the fence. While mainly reproducing by seed, they can also produce shoots from broken roots, and climbing stems can root at the nodes when they come into contact with the soil. The fruits contain up to 80 seeds, which are mostly spread by birds and other animals that eat the fruit, but can also be spread in dumped garden waste.

Blue-bell Creeper is now declared under the Landscape South Australia Act 2019, which provides for the management of pest plant species in SA. In particular, this declaration states that Blue-bell Creeper may no longer be sold or traded in any way, including as a contaminant of anything. Also, land owners in the Green Adelaide and the Hills and Fleurieu regions, amongst others, are required to take reasonable steps to kill Bluebell Creeper plants one their land and prevent their spread, which is enforceable under the above Act.

To demonstrate the potential magnitude of this problem weed, one year after the Cherry Gardens fire we visited a part of the park, near gate 1 on Scott Creek Road, to check on a known population of Blue-bell Creeper that we had previously worked on. We had 88 waypoints collected during bushcare activities late in 2018, and we visited a handful of these spots to see what sort of numbers of seedlings may have emerged. While we only found low numbers near several of the waypoints, at one we found 878 seedlings within about 10 metres of the waypoint.

We have another serious infestation of Blue-bell Creeper in the unburnt western side of the park, which we have been working on for several years, and also know of large numbers within private properties along Ackland Hill Road. Several land owners there are banding together to tackle this issue across property boundaries, and I encourage everyone to check their properties and help manage Blue-bell Creeper more broadly across the landscape. Like most weeds, we all need to work together to manage the problem.

He is enrolled in a local school and is making a lot of friends his age, and learning what it is like to have a sister as he only has an older brother at home.

He is getting involved with the community trying out at our local sporting clubs and meeting a lot of new people and having some once-in-a-lifetime experiences.

I found out about this program on Facebook through Student Exchange Australia and New Zealand. They were looking for people to host students that were arriving from France. You got to read a little about each child which gives you an insight into who they are and what their interests might be. This helps you to choose someone who will fit into your family and lifestyle easier.

You do need to have a current police check done on anyone over 18 in your house and someone in the household will need to have done some RRHAN (Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect – Education and Care) training. Don't worry if you don't have a current police check as the organization will get one sorted for you, just try to get it done a few weeks prior the student's arrival date to make it a more pleasant and easy transition. We were still holding our breath up until the day before arrival for the okay.

We have had lots of contact with a lot of people from the organization to make it happen and they are great at trying to get them into a High School that suits you. Our issue here in Cherry Gardens is the public transport. We are lucky enough to be able to get him on a link bus that gets him to Blackwood and home again. It is a bit of an early start but it also gives them the independence and ability to get around and get their bearings.

You do get visits from International Education services to inspect your house, and take a look at what facilities you have to offer your student e.g. bedroom etc.

We are very lucky to offer ours a huge bedroom with ensuite, so he has his own privacy and space when he needs it to talk to friends and family back home, or just some time out to do his own thing. He does his own washing and they should help around the house with general day to day chores and what you come to an agreement with when they arrive.

We have had our student Anatole with us for 4 weeks now. He is from Dijon in France. We have had a lot of laughs at learning and understanding the language barrier using a form of charades and the mighty Google translator. So far we have taken him to the Adelaide Oval to watch a game of football, which was also a first for us. Then we showed him our city centre, including Rundle Mall and Hindley Street which was also the first time our 12 year old daughter had been there, and at this stage does not want to go back to Hindley Street hopefully for the next 20 years.

We have also been to Urrumbirra Wildlife Park to feed and pat our beautiful native animals and have photos with koalas and kangaroos, and how lucky are we to be able to see them in our local community, but maybe not as close as we got see them at Urrumbirra.

We still have so many more things to look at doing over the next 8 weeks. Places to go, things to do, food to try. Vegemite is on that list. We have been introducing him to our Australian bands such as INXS, Powder Finger, Hilltop Hoods and many more, while enjoying listening to his favorite French singers and bands. Anatole has even cooked for us and is teaching us some new ways to enjoy food without so many vegetables.

A week before we were to meet, we did a Zoom call to introduce ourselves to his family, and it was a nice to be able to include his mum and brother in Anatole's soon-to-be experience. We have all set up a group chat with both the families to keep them up to date with what we are doing and where we are going. I know that his Mum is appreciating this up to date adventure, and meeting us on Zoom has helped her feel at ease with this big journey that her son was about to undertake.

I know through this experience we will make some very good friends from places all over the world and who knows, one day go and visit them.

Santos Tour Down Under returns in 2024

The Santos Tour Down Under will return to the City of Onkaparinga in January 2024, with a new-look women's stage finish and men's stage—both concluding with thrilling Willunga Hill climbs.

"With the dates locked in, the only questions now are where you'll pull up a chair along the race routes to watch the world's best, and which cellar doors, cafes and beaches you'll attend while you're here."

Santos Tour Down Under Race Director, Stuart O'Grady OAM, said the City of Onkaparinga would play a major part in next year's event.

"Spectacular terrain and welcoming towns are found across the City of Onkaparinga, and it's all set to feature during the 2024 Santos Tour Down Under," he said.


