



EDITORIAL

After a long (and cold) winter we are finally seeing the days lengthen and the temperatures warm. During the Winter months the Cherry Gardens brigade focussed our training on structural fires and car accidents, and due to the cold and wet evenings our training was frequently held in the station rather than going out into the surrounding area. Now that we're in Spring our training shifts to bushfire preparation so we can be ready for the coming fire danger season. This tends to be more practically based rather than theoretical. Typically we will respond to a simulated scenario at a grid reference, for example the air field, where orange cones will have been placed to mark the location of the "fire". While we travel to the scene the Crew Leader will delegate responsibilities; the driver remains with the truck and mans the pump, two firefighters might be tasked to bring out the 25 mm fast attack line, two others might have the responsibility of dragging out the 38 mm line and setting it up. Everyone will be assigned VHF radios so we can maintain contact on the simulated fire-ground. Sometimes the exercise might simulate a running grassfire, in which case crewmembers will be assigned to stand on the crewdeck at the back of the truck and use the hoses on either side as the truck drives slowly along.

Another element of training that is always present this time of year is the burn-over drill. A burn-over is a situation where a fire has unexpectedly changed direction and a truck in its

path is unable to get out in time. The procedure in such an eventuality is for all crew



With the recent unseasonal bushfires in NSW many people are wondering what this year's fire season holds here in South Australia. GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS AUGUST 2018

Mulch, mulch, mulch, as there is talk it will be hotter and drier this summer. I usually suggest that this is the time to check your watering system is



operating correctly - have you already

done that?

Stagger plantings of sweet corn, give tomatoes a side dressing of potassium to help with fruit set, and avoid irregular watering as this will encourage blossom end rot.

If you enjoy large well-formed stone fruit or apples and pears they can be thinned about now - I know it is a difficult thing to do but it will reward you at harvest time.

Prune native plants after they have finished flowering to keep the plants in good shape and to promote new growth.

Roses are prone to aphids at this time of the year - try not to use insecticides which will kill the good predators, instead blast them off with a jet of water. Encourage good strong healthy growth with an organic based fertilizer which contains potash

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

The dreaded founder has struck again! My poor mate Ziggy, who is in his 29th year, has once again developed founder. The first signs were that he was not willing to step out in his walk and was looking lame in front. Founder (laminitis) is a funny thing, because not all horses will show all of the symptoms. With Ziggy, there is not a lot of heat in his front feet compared to normal, although he is lame, but not excessively so. Hopefully it has been caught early and he won't be in too much pain. My owners have given him some anti -inflammatory medication so that he is more comfortable, but he is a canny soul and doesn't like to eat his dinner if it has any medication in it! Unfortunately with founder his meals can't be sweetened with any molasses or carrots etc as sugar is a definite no-no. The usual treatment initially is to restrict access to green, lush grass and then substitute that with good quality dry hay. Also small amounts of lucerne hay are OK to give too. Ziggy is also getting oaten chaff soaked in water to remove any grains. This is mixed in with some Maxi-Soy (which of course he doesn't like!). If



his condition worsens, he will have to have soft padded booties to alleviate pressure on his feet, but so far that has not been necessary. Since it is not good for a horse to not eat for more than 2-3 hours, Ziggy is being fed small amounts of hay during the day to keep his gut ticking over. Fingers crossed, as he will be monitored closely for the immediate future.

Yours truly did founder once several years (6) ago due to a combination of too much access to too good a pasture and a lack of work due to a hoof abscess. That in turn was due to me being lame and having shoes on for the first time, so it was quite a combination of events. Since then I have been in excellent health, especially with my owners keeping such an eagle eye on my weight. At the time I foundered, I was over 500kg (I am I5hh). All this last 12 months I have been well below that and this winter have even got below 470kg which is a first. I have to say that I do feel sprightlier and move forward well without that extra weight! Since this has been a drier than normal winter, that seems to have kept the grass growth down too and all my other paddock mates are holding their weight well. The problem is that we have not evolved to eat all this lovely rich green stuff, it's like chocolate is to humans - and too much is deadly. Ideally we have evolved to eat dry pasture with little or no sugar content and to eat that over a period of up to 20 hours a day. Some call this trickle feeding, as in the wild we would walk, eat a little, walk some more etc This could cover anything up to 30 km per day, but in a leisurely way. We really are quite sedentary animals, saving our energy only to express a flight or fight response. I hope all the equines out there are keeping well and off that dangerous

green stuff!

Safe and enjoyable riding to your owners too.

FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK

There has been a fair bit happening in the nature conservation space recently. Back in March we had a state election and a new Liberal government was elected in. I suppose there is always a little trepidation when there is a change of government, as the saying goes, better the devil you know than the devil you don't, and funding continuity is always of concern.

The new Minister for Environment and Water, David Speirs MP, was strongly advocating for reform of natural resource management. It seems to have been some time since the environment has been a focus in an election, other than talk about water security in our driest state on the driest continent, climate change and carbon emissions, and green energy.

Time will, of course, tell, but the government has spoken of a key emphasis on soil quality, water management and pest plant and animal control. There will be landscape scale restoration programs, which are recognised as being important for sustaining high quality biodiversity.

The Natural Resources Management Act 2004 is to be replaced by a new Landscape South Australia Act, and the government is seeking input from the community regarding the reform process. We only have until 15th Oc-

tober to have our say, so I encourage you to do so.

You can go to the www.yoursay.sa.gov. au/landscape-reform website to read the discussion paper, executive summary and frequently asked questions, and can provide feedback in the online discussion forum, by emailing or posting your comments in, or by attending one of the community forums being held (details on the website above).



Free household chemical and paint drop-off

Remember to replace your smoke alarm batteries when you move your clocks forward on Sunday 7 October. Smoke detectors also need to be replaced after 10 years and can be placed in the Unplug N Drop cages around the council region with other e-waste.

Here in Cherry Gardens we are at the very fringe of the Onkaparinga Council and we are competing for services with the huge populations extending from Happy Valley through Reynella, Morphett Vale, Hackham, Noarlunga – you get the picture. It is in our best interests for all of us to have the best representation both in a local Council Member and the Mayor. Please take the time to check out who is standing for our Ward and as the Mayor and make sure they are will represent the Rural areas such as we live in.

The following article is from the Local Government Association.

Consider for a moment how everyday life is improved by the many <u>services that councils provide</u>. Imagine our community without rubbish collection, access to local libraries, playgrounds and support for our sports club facilities, the CFS, the Community hall; and the list goes on.

Unlike State and Federal elections, it is not compulsory to vote in South Australian council elections. However, council elections are the biggest single voluntary civic participation activity in the state with nearly 360,000 people voting in the 2014 council elections.

Another important difference from State and Federal elections is that all voting in council elections is done by post. Enrolled voters receive a voting package through the mail and return their votes in a reply paid envelope.

If you are on the state (House of Assembly) electoral roll or have completed a enrolment to join the supplementary roll, you will receive a voting pack in the mail in late October 2018.

The ballot paper in your voting pack will show the candidates standing for election in your council ward. To find out more about each of the candidates and what they stand for go to www.lga.sa.gov.au/councilelections, then complete your ballot paper and return it in the reply paid envelope.

Votes must be received before 5pm Friday 9 November 2018.

The region is rapidly growing with new wineries, breweries, accommodation and experiences being opened every month.




