My name is Kim Lock, and I am an author based in the Barossa Valley. I am writing a novel based on the life of my 3x great-grandmother, Sophia Lock (nee Boothey) who, as a child, emigrated from England and settled with her parents, Thomas and Sarah Boothey, in Cherry Gardens in the 1840s. Sophia Boothey married Jacob Lock on 28th September 1850 in the Wesleyan Chapel Cherry Gardens. Thomas and Sarah Boothey's eldest son was Joseph Boothey, who is listed on the Cherry Chatter website, as an early settler. I am seeking contact with any Boothey

I am seeking contact with any Boothey descendants who may today hold personal items or information from the early Boothey settlers or their children or grandchildren. In particular I am interested in letters, diaries, enduring anecdotes or recollections, and photographs.

Though I am writing a fictionalised account of my ancestor's life, I would love to gain as much factual informa-

tion as possible. In particular, I am seeking information regarding daily life in the early colonial Cherry Gardens area. Things such as: was there a local midwife available for birthing women at that time? What sorts of foods were commonly prepared and eaten daily? What sorts of rituals surrounded life events such as birth and death? What sorts of medicines or medical care, if any, did they employ when sick or injured?

Other names descended from Thomas and Sarah Boothey upon marriage of their daughters are Lock, Corbell and Pendlebury.

GEORGE'S GARDENING SUGGESTIONS AUGUST 2018

Spring is here with increasing soil temperatures and many plants respond with rapid growth - including weeds - hand pull or hoe them before they have a chance to set seed (I year of seeds = 7 years of weeds!)

Plant bedding begonias, carnations, chrysanthemums, cosmos, phlox and snapdragon.

In the vegie patch beans, beetroot and carrot can be planted. Cucumber, pumpkin and zucchini may need some warmth, so raise seedlings under glass, keep in a warm spot and protect from frosts. A cloche made from a 2 litre milk container works well.

Some jobs you may consider for this month are:-

- Shape overgrown hedges, hard prune if necessary.
- Trim camellias and azaleas after they have finished flowering.
- If you need to move an evergreen shrub, transplant it before it gets too hot.
- Mulch in preparation for next month's hot weather, after enriching the soil with compost and organic fertilizer

OVER THE STABLE DOOR

Greetings Fellow Equines and Horse Owners!

By now the paddocks are well and truly wet through, at least in the hills. Although everything looks lovely and green, it comes with its problems. When the weather is not so cold and there are many wet areas, our horses can be prone to many hoof conditions. Some of the conditions which can affect your horse include seedy toe, thrush and greasy heel (or mud fever). All of these can be slow to clear up, so preventative maintenance is the go. Seedy toe is when the hoof wall separates from the sole at the toe. When you pick up the hoof, there will be a black area where the separation is. This black area hides a cavity that runs up inside the hoof wall. If you tap the wall of the hoof it will sound hollow. In severe cases the horse will be lame. Causes range from hard work on hard ground, especially in a horse with weak hoof walls to begin with (as is common in many thoroughbreds), poor shoeing, or leaving the shoes too long between shoeing (this causes the toes to get too long and weakens the wall), small stones getting wedged in between the shoe and hoof, or sometimes with founder, (where the hoof wall is at risk to begin with). It needs to be cleaned out and disinfected on a daily basis and kept as dry as possible. Seek veterinary advice if in doubt.

Thrush is a bacterial infection in the



grooves on either side of the frog. The first thing you will probably notice if your horse has thrush is the smell it is quite strong and pongy! The area will have a black sticky discharge on each side of the frog and your horse may even be lame with this, if severe. Causes can be mainly from the horse standing for long periods of time in wet, boggy (or even urine soaked) areas and not getting a chance to dry out. Even lazy attention to detail when cleaning out feet can contribute to thrush. If you are not sure what to do, your vet can do this, but basically the area needs to be thoroughly cleaned out, including al the sticky smelly stuff. Again, it needs to be disinfected and kept dry. The frog is important for the health of the hoof, so it is important to get on to this straight away, as corrective shoeing may be needed if the frog is too unhealthy. Again seek veterinary advice if in doubt.

Greasy heel (mud fever) is a dermati-

tis condition affecting the skin usually at the back of the pasterns and down to the heels. It tends to be more common in horses which have pink skin (usually with white hair) in these areas. And it also seems to be more common on the hind legs, but can still affect all four. The affected area can be extremely painful, with broken skin, swelling, scabs and bleeding. The horse will be very uncomfortable when asked to flex those joints when you are cleaning out the feet. In extreme cases, the horse can also be lame. Again, wet or muddy conditions (even too much hosing in the summer), with the area not getting a chance to dry out, or not being dried off properly after hosing, will all contribute to this condition. Other less common causes include rope burns, or too much hard work in deep sand. The area needs to be cleaned and kept dry - on a daily basis preferably. This condition does not clear up overnight! There are a few creams on the market which can be applied regularly. One is Zinc cream, but there are others. Veterinary advice is advisable if not clearing up with treatment.

The bottom line is, 'No 'oof no 'orse', so regular and thorough hoof cleaning is a given, even if the horse is not being ridden.

So good luck with those feet everyone, and safe riding!

CFS NEWS

Winter has finally passed although the wet and windy weather will probably be upon us for a little while yet. The cooler weather has given the Cherry Gardens brigade the opportunity to concentrate on our non-bushfire related training. At this time of year the majority of our callouts are weather related, such as attending to tree branches that are blocking roads or (hopefully) minor car accidents caused by slippery roads or poor visibility. In the case of fallen trees our training concentrates on safe and effective chainsaw handling as well as traffic management. For vehicle accidents we also train in traffic management as well as First Aid and safe working around an accident scene. As with any time of year, the winter months also bring the occasional house or shed fire and for this we concentrate on our BA (Breathing Apparatus) training. Those who are qualified to wear BA conduct simulated building entries, sometimes with fake smoke thrown in for good measure, while the rest of the brigade concentrates on the vital task of coordinating hose lines and en-

suring a constant water supply.

As the evenings warm up our training will gradually shift towards preparing us for the coming fire season, which will be upon us before we know it. Usually we begin preparation for the fire season by inspecting the various fire tracks in our area and ensuring they are still accessible should they be needed. Every member of the brigade is also required to conduct burn-over drills before they are allowed onto the fire ground. A burn-over is where a fire has changed direction and threatens the safety of an appliance and its crew. The drill involves the crew quickly entering the vehicle, pulling down the heat reflective curtains, and activating the sprinklers which protect the vehicle and its occupants from radiant

Recently members of the Cherry Gardens brigade attended the booth for the local bi-election to collect donations. As always, the members of our community showed their generosity and the money raised will now be used to purchase equipment which will help in performing our tasks. On



behalf of all the brigade and Sturt Group we would like to extend our thanks to you all!

We have been pleased to see a steady stream of new members join our ranks over the last few months, both as fire-fighters and radio (comms) operators. We are still in need of new members though, so if you are interested or you would like to find out more head along to the station at 7.30pm on a Monday night. We'd love to see you.



CHURCH NEWS

Over the last few months stone mason, David Harbel, has been replacing decayed and rising damp damaged mortar on the Southern and Western walls of the chapel. We have been awarded a Heritage Grant from the City of Onkaparinga which will help us considerably, to repair the Northern wall, and repair and re-erect the bell tower and bell. Even with that generous grant, we are only able to do small amounts of other works at a time as the money comes in from our regular members. This is part of an ongoing program to maintain the church for ourselves and the community. Once the exterior work has been completed, we will work on funding to repair/replace the damaged plaster and minor cracking inside the church, and then repaint the inside.

In spring we will be re-erecting the bell tower and re-installing the bell on new supports. The old timber supports have cracked and worn, so need replacing. The bell was cast at the C & H Wyatt foundry in the Adelaide CBD in 1851, so is a significant part of our community and South Australia's history. The tower and bell were taken down a few years ago to allow



the church to build the meeting room where the Cherry Gardens Garden Club meets each month. We look forward to the bell tower going up, and being able to ring the bell for Sunday worship once again. Perhaps Margaret Jacobs will teach a few of us how to toll the bell?

To my "recycling nut" mind the most exciting trick was to use the disposable blue hospital type gowns we wear whilst being x-rayed, to line our hanging baskets, or to line our pots thus preventing the soil from escaping, whilst allowing excess liquid through the drainage hole. What a great idea! Weed tea was another idea! Why not drown your weeds, and after a week or so use the tea from your weeds to fertilise your other plants? Stinging nettle is the most nutritious, but even Sour sobs are great and of course there is always liquid fertiliser which can be made from your rabbit, pigeon, chicken or any animal poo except that of dogs and cats of course. Worm tea from your worm farm. Liquid manures are easily taken up by your plants even in the cold

weather. A word of warning however, the tea should be the colour of weak tea when you dilute it for watering. When germinating parsnip seeds, cover planted seeds with a board for a couple of weeks to assist germination, which can otherwise prove tricky. FRIENDS OF SCOTT CREEK CONSERVATION PARK

Spring is a great time to get out and enjoy some of the many treasures that the Park contains. September is National Biodiversity Month and Friday 7th September is National Threatened Species Day. Scott Creek Conservation Park has a number of nationally endangered plants and animals inhabiting it, including several populations of the Southern Brown Bandicoot and the Chestnut-rumped Heathwren. It is vital for the survival of these species that work undertaken by the Friends group, protecting and restoring their habitat, continues into the future.

Many who read about the Park assume

that there are plenty of people already helping out, but our numbers are actually quite low. We have a pool of about a dozen volunteers who come out to one or more of our working bees each month. If you have a morning to spare and think you could help out at one of our scheduled activities listed in the programme below, please come along and join us. As the saying goes, many hands make light work and, as a reward, you will get to see parts of the Park that you probably would not otherwise see, including some of the wildlife and many beautiful wildflowers and orchids.

Hi readers. The busy (silly) season has begun abruptly with the arrival of 4 kangaroo joeys and several possum joeys in the same week. Nothing like easing gently back into the saddle??!! We are also receiving injured echidnas already as they are on the move looking for mates and getting into strife with dogs and cars in their way! We received a 5.44kg female echidna which had been hit by a car on Main Road, Coromandel Valley, just near the school. She was such a magnificent specimen with rolls of fat on her shoulders as she was doing very nicely. She had a few broken spines along her back, indicating that a car had run over her, but most alarmingly - her nose was puffy, twisted and blowing bubbles. She was X-Rayed confirming that the two tiny toothpick like bones along the sides of her nose were both broken through. Because of this she could not possibly feed, and would slowly starve to death if released. The Vet put her to sleep but was able to use her to illustrate echidna care in a new book that she was writing! A



Tawny Frogmouth also had a vehicle impact and died from internal injuries as a result.

If you find animals or birds on the side of the road in a dazed state or with obvious injuries, the most important thing to do is to warm them up gently and slowly in a darkened quiet room by placing them in a box with a hot water bottle under one end of the box. This

gives them the opportunity to move away from the heat, and to avoid dehydration, or back onto the heat if they are cold. This simple act saves lives day or night, then get it to a carer or Vet the next day, unless a cat is involved in which case, get it to a vet/carer immediately. Delaying antibiotic treatment is a death sentence. Please don't leave them out in the cold to be ravaged by predators whilst in a weakened state. Keep an eye out at the moment for the "echidna trains" as the boys are following the girls hopefully for days and hectares in hope of a change in their luck!!

MEADOWS VET NEWS

All dog owners please make sure your dogs' vaccinations are up to date. We recently have had two confirmed cases of Parvo Virus and this is very contagious. Please note that the virus can be carried on shoes in dirt so even if your dog never leaves your property it is still advisable to have them vaccinated for protection.

Also this month we are seeing a lot of dogs with ear infections. If your dog is showing signs of ear discomfort please do not wait before seeking treatment. All ear issues can be very painful but if left can also be much more difficult and more expensive to treat!

Four out of every five dogs and cats over the age of three years have some sort of dental disease which becomes more severe with age. This can be a real problem for pets and owners because it can lead to more serious problems such as illnesses related to the heart, liver and kidney. You should check your pet's teeth regularly as pets often won't show pain. Even pets with sore gums, an infected mouth or broken teeth will continue to eat so you may not notice they have problems. Dogs are pack animals and showing weakness is not part of their

nature. They need to eat to survive so won't go off their food until the pain is unbearable.

Signs of toothache or an infection in the mouth to look out for in cats and dogs include:

- a yellow-brown tartar crust at the gum line,
- red and swollen gums,
- pawing at the mouth and face,
- bleeding, sensitivity to touch,
- changes in eating and chewing habits (often a reluctance to eat)
- depression (recognisable as listlessness)
- may also start dropping food when they are eating.

It's important that pets have regular health checks at the vet. Dogs and cats age much more quickly than humans, and it's important to catch problems early if you want to ensure a long and happy life for your companion animal. Although bones are a popular treat that you may be using for dental care, they can cause problems such as broken teeth and gut obstructions. Some products that will keep your pets teeth healthy include: foods such as Hills t/d & Advance, toys such as Dental Kongs, treats such as dental chews

and raw bones as well as toothbrushes and toothpaste formulated for pets (please note human toothpaste can be toxic and should not be used!). Horses, ponies and donkeys should not be forgotten either! It is highly recommended that dental checks are done every six months. This is because it usually takes around six months for the sharp edges on the outside of the upper cheek teeth & inside of lower cheek teeth to reappear.

Under the new regulations please ensure your pets are microchipped & that your details are always kept up to date! It is incredibly frustrating when stray animals are bought in (as a number were during our recent bad weather) & we have to send them to the pound as we have no way of knowing who the owner is! The owner will then incur fines that are much more than the cost of a microchip!






